

ith countless tunes you know **V** from the first note, rip-roaring gigs you can count on, and a whole lot of energy you'll take home with you, BoDeans continue to contribute to the American songbook as a tried-andtrue institution. Founded and led by original frontman, songwriter, multiinstrumentalist, and producer Kurt Neumann, the band's catalog consists of generational anthems such as "Good Things," You Don't Get Much," "Idaho," and "Closer To Free," just to name a few. However, they still reflect the soul and spirit of the modern American experience on their fourteenth fulllength offering, 4 The Last Time.

"The music of BoDeans has defined much of my life," muses Kurt. "I consider myself fortunate to be able to do what I enjoy. I wanted to do something positive for the world instead of just taking from it. So, this is what I've chosen to do with my life. The music was always about the blue-collar dream of a better life, and it still is."

BoDeans emerged out of Waukesha, WI in 1986 with the seminal debut, Love & Hope & Sex & Dreams, produced by T Bone Burnett. Following Outside Looking In (1987), Home (1989), and Black and Whte (1991), Go Slow Down (1993) yielded "Closer To Free," which famously served as the theme song for the smash hit television series Party of Five. According to Moss, "We are a rare breed as far as how authentic we like to keep the music." That's not a surprise to longtime fans, as Moss proudly represents the city of Chicago as one of the few bluesmen working today to have learned his craft firsthand directly from many of the genre's original creators.

The Nick Moss Band featuring Dennis Gruenling recently received a total of seven 2024 Blues Music Award nominations. Nominations include the coveted awards for Band Of The Year, Album Of The Year (for *Get Your Back Into It!*) and Song Of The Year (for *The Bait In The Snare*). Harmonica player Dennis Gruenling and band bassist Rodrigo Mantovani each received an individual nomination as well. The awards ceremony will be held in Memphis, Tennessee on Thursday, May 9.





MMB Concert Honors Military bandleader

COL Hal Gibson's 100th Birthday

Five past conductors of the US Army Field Band will take the stage on April 17th and 18th to celebrate one of their own as the Melbourne Municipal Band (MMB) honors local music legend COL Hal Gibson (USA Ret.) on his 100th birthday. The concerts are free and begin at 7 pm at the Melbourne Auditorium, 625 E. Hibiscus Blvd. Doors open at 6 pm, with pre-show entertainment provided by the VIP Jazz Orchestra.

COL Gibson himself also will wield the baton for a new arrangement of service songs that includes the new Space Force Song. Dr. David Gregory, founder and Conductor Emeritus of the Georgia Wind Symphony, also will conduct, as will MMB Conductor Staci Rosbury.

"This is truly a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see all the past living 'Pershing's Own' conductors in one concert," said Rosbury. "We will feature stirring renditions of American Overture for Band, the George Washington Bicentennial March, Superman March, America the Beautiful, and Hymn for the Innocent, to name a few. MMB is thrilled to honor the many contributions COL Gibson has made to the music world and to our band."

Also in the program is Concertino, by Cécile Chaminade, which will feature local flutist Nicole Scott as soloist. Scott is a member of the Brevard Symphony Orchestra. *America, The Beautiful* will be sung by Rachel Carter Murphy, soprano. Another selection, Centennial Celebration Overture, was written for this concert by composer Dwayne Milburn to honor COL Gibson.

COL Gibson is an internationally acclaimed musician and conductor with a professional background that spans more than a half a century. For over 30 years, he was a military bandleader, holding positions at the highest levels of the Army's band program, including bandleader at the U.S.

This year's festival will be held from 9 am to 5 pm on April 27 & 28, 2024.

This year's event will host over 200 fine art and jewelry booths, sponsor displays, and diverse food and beverage options including mixed drinks. The festival features free parking, free admission, free kid friendly art activities, and free live music from 10:30 am to 5 pm both days.

The Melbourne Art Festival is a juried Fine Arts Show, drawing artists from throughout Florida and the United States. Last year's festival was selected as one of the Top 100 fine art shows in the US by 'Sunshine Artist Magazine'. Cart rides will be offered by "The Cart Guys" to help those with large art purchases get back to their vehicle.

Originally held in Indialantic and Downtown Melbourne for its first 32 years, the festival moved to Wickham Park in 2017. Proceeds raised during the weekend, along with those raised at benefit art auctions, are used to support the arts; offer Student Scholarships to students for art classes and camps; and funding other educational art efforts and art organizations. The Melbourne Arts Festival has donated over \$100,000 to the community. Interviewed By Matt Bretz

ate last year I was offered the amazing opportunity of interviewing one of the best guitarists on the planet. I am speaking of metaphorical first contact himself - Joe Satriani. At the time I asked Joe about any upcoming G3 related tours and he mysteriously mentioned that some time soon, there would be a big announcement to watchout for. Well, it turns out the big announcement was for a couple exciting things about to happen. One of them being a duo tour Joe Satriani is on with his best friend Steve Vai (the other greatest guitarist on the planet.) The other - well, I got Steve Vai to tell me a little about it when we talked last month. Here's what happened!

So, you and Satriani are embarking on this monster tour together. It's hard to believe, but this is actually the first duo tour you have ever done outside of something like G3. How did it all come about and why now?

SV: Joe and I have always been attached at the hip and I'm not even sure why we have never done anything like this before, but it just seemed like a good time to do it. It's been advertised that this is like a celebration of friendship tour, which is kind of true, we have been friends a very long time. Joe and I have so much history coming up through the ranks together.

I understand you have been friends for around 50 years or something like that. Is it true that you took guitar lessons from Satriani at 13? SV: Honestly, I think we have probably been friends even longer than that. Yeah, I actually took lessons from him when I was 12. He was a few years older than me and one of the older, cooler kids in the area. We all thought he was like guitar king, and so anyone that wanted to play guitar in my neighborhood wanted to be like him and tried to get him to teach them. That was me too.

It's wild that you two were so young when you met and somehow become equals at the top of the progressive rock world. Did you ever imagine your lives would/could turn out that way?

SV: No, there's no way to know that kind of thing. How you we ever know or even imagine that. First and foremost I wanted to be good at guitar; 2nd I wanted to have fun and look cool. Those were my goals, and in the beginning I didn't really think I was going to make a living at it.

Early on you developed a very famous practice regimen requiring at least 7 hours a day. Can you talk about what inspired that kind of commitment?

SV: Practice to me has never been work. I enjoy every second of it, so long hours learning and refining technique and application has never been a hard thing to make myself do. On the contrary, I can't wait to get to work. Just like anything else; playing guitar is like weight lifting. You work at it for awhile, and then one day you go up in weight and your're like ok, I like that. Let's do more! Learning guitar has always been like that, too. When I was a kid I was going lick to lick just learning everything I could out of whatever song I was working on. When I was done, it was on to the next.

I've seen you a few times on the G3 tours and I caught you at a show called Zappa Plays Zappa at the Hardrock Live in Orlando. It was advertised as Dweezil Zappa playing his father's music, but then out of nowhere you and Terry Bozzio suddenly appeared on stage. It was a thrill for us out in the audience. What was that experience like for you, playing that music again with your old bandmates?

SV: Wow, that was some years back, but of course I remember it. It wasn't something that was planned way in advance. I got a call one day from Dweezil telling me he was going on a tour playing Frank's stuff. You have to remember-- I played this music when I was 18 in 1978 when Frank hired me. Anyway, he asked if I could guest shot at a few of the shows. He said he was also asking Terry and Napolean Murphy. It was a lot of fun playing with those guys again.

It was a big deal for the fans that live here. Jaco came from our area and his family is still here.

SV: That's really cool. I didn't know that, thank you for telling me.

At the top of your game you must have a bird's eye view of anyone coming up int he industry. Is there anyone out there we should be watching. Who do you respect right now?

SV: That's a tough one. I can tell you right off the bat that Jacob Collier is blowing it out of the water right now. That guy has everything needed to be a legend...and that's where it is for me. Let's talk about this for a minute. I'm primarily a guitarist and I look at things in terms of musicality and technique. There are a ton of players out there that are technichally great, but they can't phrase well or find just the right melodic notes to actually say something with their music. You can get flashy and that definitely sells tickets, but in the end I'm more interested in the meoldy and feel of the music. In order to be a legend you have to be technically great, write songs with real musicality and know how to sell an image. I know that last part sounds shallow, but



this is a business and people want your clothes and style to reflect almost a fantasy they would like to emulate. That being said, I'm not sure if there is anyone headed for "legendary" status right now...except Collier of course.

I get it. Its kind of like the difference between playing as many notes as fast as possible or playing Whispering a Prayer.

SV: Yes, kind of like that.

Speaking of Whispering a Prayer-- it's easily one of my favorite song of yours along with For the Love of God. Do you have any favorites you like to play more then others?

SV: Well, that changes from time to time of course. I do have a story that goes along with that though. I have a guitar called the Hydra which is this big three necked monster. One neck is a 6-string, one is a 12-string, and the third is a bass.

That's ambitious!

SV: Super ambitious right? So, I play a song on this thing called Teeth of the Hydra and it is an intensely hard song to play. The first tour I brought it out on I had just had shoulder surgery and didn't get as much practice on it as I would've liked. I guess I could have just left it out of the show for awhile, but I was anxious to show people what I was doing. Anyway, the first week or so I was nervous every time I went to pick it up, but after that I was locked in and my nervousness turned into excitedment. I couldn't wait until that part of the show came up.

I've always wondered how do you guys pick who is going to be the 3rd guitarist on the G3 tours?

SV: (*laughs*) People don't seem to ever remember this, but I've actually only played on a little over half of the G3's. I know people think the concert is Joe and myself...and then a great guitarist, but I'm a guest, too. It's always been

Joe's thing. He calls all the shots and makes all the decisions.


Speaking of G3, are there any talks of a new one soon?

SV: Funny you should ask that. There's actually something coming soon. Joe's son has become a pretty good filmaker and asked if he could film the last tour. He did and decided to make a movie/doc about the G3. That's coming out fairly soon. Joe and I are actually finishing up a duo album to go along with this tour. So, that's all pretty exciting!

I talked to Joe afew months ago and asked him about the next G3. He was very mysterious, but said something was coming soon. This must have been what he was talking about! SV: Yeah, I'm sure of it. Oh man, I hope it was ok that I told you! (laughs)

We'll just keep that between usand everyone reading this right now. SV: Ok, deal!

High Tech Talk

In the world of iPhones and Samsung S24's, sometimes we forget how this all started, and it wasn't very long ago, either. What seems ubiquitous in cellphone land these days wasn't around a mere 15 years ago. We use lingo now that was never heard of a few short years past. Now we make "tweets", send DM's, take "selfies", get instant messages, and so much more. The lexicon of telephony has created a whole new strategy for Scrabble. In 2006, "Google" was added to the Oxford English dictionary as a verb, as in "go google it". Hard to believe that was 18 years ago. For those of you who remember the evolution of the cell phone, before the times where everybody had one, here's a short history.

The first phone that was able to send text messages, thanks to GSM technology, was the Nokia 2110 in 1994. This was my first cellphone. It had a tiny little screen that was green with black, pixelated text. You could make calls. That's what it was for. You could send a text, but it was a laborious endeavor. You couldn't surf the web, see pictures, or anything that is considered essential today. It was a phone. That's it. A big, heavy, clunky phone that would not fit in your pocket. Remember those belt holsters they made for these things?

The Benfon ESC came along in 1999, a short 25 years ago, was the first phone to implement GPS. A year later in 2000, the Erikson T36 saw the first implementation of Bluetooth technology. Also in 2000, the Nokia 3310 hit 125 million units sold. It was still a big clunky phone with a green screen and black, pixelated letters, but the big selling point was, it came with interchangeable covers. Ok, so we're making progress. Now you can "Text me" with a bright yellow case or determine your GPS coordinates with the push of a button.

2001 saw the first phone with 3G technology. Seems like just yesterday, doesn't it? The Matsushita 2101 was the first to implement 3G AND video, albeit, very low resolution, grainy video. This did, however, raise the bar in cell phone world. In 2003, another milestone was hit when Blackberry put out the first "smart phone". This really amped up the competition. 2004 saw the Nokia 9500. The first phone to include a connection to the internet, a

full color screen, a .03 megapixel camera, Bluetooth, an mp3 player, and a Fax! By now, Bluetooth and mp3 had become common terminologies.

The next big event in cellphone world was the introduction of the iPhone in 2007. This made interacting with the phone and internet so much easier and raised the bar again. Also, now we could take "selfies"! In 2008, the HTC Dream came out with the first Android operating system, which prompted the continuous question: "Android or Apple?". However, in 2010, the Google Nexus One appeared, promising to be an iPhone killer, with a high def screen, 5 mp camera, once again, raising the bar. So, now you can take a selfie, and text it to your friend, or e-mail it. You can take movies, watch videos, read the news, anything you want in this always connected world. I was talking to one of my students about not seeing many of my friends on FB anymore. He replied, "Dude, you have to change your algorithm". What? Sounds painful. Hope it doesn't require me to get a haircut! I feel soooo old now!





The GMF has become one of my favorite festivals of the year. Unlike camping festivals that go all night and wear you down to the bone, the GMF is right in the middle of the greater metro area. It starts in the afternoon and usually ends each night around 11 pm. I love my camping festivals, but I also love sleep and hot showers, so this fetival is a relaxing treat compared to some the trials of endurance I put myself through in the summertime.

As a matter of fact, the schedule hosted some of my persoanl favorites.

Friday night kicked the festival off boasting mild weather and a dry sky. The stages were lit and busy, the vendors were selling everything from amazing food to hand made jewelry. Silent discos have become a staple for festivals and one of the most popular experiences a the GMF. If you haven't seen one before - silent discos are where everyone has headphones and the djs are transmitting wirelessly to the headphones - but not out to speakers. So, unless you have headphones on you can't hear the music. You can, however, see everyone dancing to silence and the spectacle is a huge part of the appeal and fun. This particular festival lets you check out headphones and keep them with anywhere inside the festival grounds, so if you're not into what's on stage at the moment, you can have your own party where you're standing.

The bigger acts on Friday night were mostly of the electronic music realm. Big Gigantic was send to close and





killed it EDM style until it was time for headliner duo Louis the Child. This is the first time I've seen Gasparilla go so heavy electronic and dj complete with lasers, screens and big time light shows. The crowd loved it and for a little while there was a rave in the middle of downtown Tampa to compete with late night Bonnaroo. Speaking of Bonnaroo - two years back I interviewed an up and coming band there by the name of ParrotFish. It was a nice suprise to see them on the bill in the afternoon.

Saturday we all woke up to pooring rain and cold cold weather. Again, I was happy we weren't camping but I was concerned about how the day would go. Midway through daylight time the rain was a steady drizzle and not too bad, but soon enough it started coming down and we ducked into the beer tent to wait for whatever came next. Saturday was a big day for me; three of my favorite groups were scheduled. Luckily, although we were about to put on scuba gear, lightening never appeared and so the show went on. Coin, a new discovery of mine, took the stage in the late afternoon and blew it out of the..well, water. If you haven't heard of these guys check them out. They've been around a minute and carry the same torch as Foster the People and Passion Pit, that whole indie dance sound. I love it!

Early evening was the classically cool Digable Planets. I know you know them, and if you don't know, it's time to learn. Jazz and hip-hop from the 90's and it's cool as hell.

Shortly after the amazing-- love them so much-- Young the Giant took us to church to close the night. Suddenly it wasn't cold anymore and the rain felt like a massage. Young the Giant has a way of inspiring everyone that hears them to be both expressive, introspective and introverted, all at the same time. I've been trying to see them live for years so to hear Crystalized performed right in front of me was insane and ethereal.

Sunday started out the same as Saturday had, rain, rain, rain. I sent a text to the promoter to make sure everything was still going. Confirmation came and we were out the door and on our way to the festival grounds. One thing I love about this festival is how they organize the concerts loosely matching the same generes on each day. This year Friday was very electronic, Saturday was pop, hip hop and modern indie bands, and Sunday is traditionally jam bands, country, folks, blues, organic artists. Highlights for me on Sunday were Steeln Peaches first off. I love these guys. They wrap all the generes I just listed into one uniquely familiar sound-- even though I had never heard them before. Vison Crystal created the most beautiful surrounding

environment with their string laden sound. Yonder Mountain String Band - are you kidding me? Everytime I see this group I get so happy. They are happy, I'm happy, everyone is so friggin' happy!

The headliner for the entire fest was scheduled to be Lake Street Dive. A phenomenal band with huge hits. Everyone was excited. Kailyn Meek of Brevard Comedy

Nock, knock...who's there? If you've paid attention to the Brevard comedy scene over the last 12 months or so, the answer is "A Lot Of Comedy." There has been a resurgence of interest, and more and more shows popping up all over the county. Local, regional and national comics have performed in bars, restaurants, vape shops, record stores. One promoter, Kailyn Meek, of the aptly titled Brevard Comedy promotion, is leading the charge and carrying on a tradition that runs in her family.

"My father (comedian) Shannon Hall and I launched Brevard Comedy about 10 years ago," explains Meek. "We wanted to create something that worked for both, the comic and the crowd. We wanted to bring professional touring comics to the area because the population boomed and at the time the comedy scene hadn't boomed with it, so there was a major need for it."

Brevard Comedy and their website and social media presence have staked their claim as one of the best in the area. One selling point is the many different rooms and locations throughout the county they perform at. "The bookers can be a little competitive," she continues. "Some have even used terms like "territory", but our priorities have never been money and territory. We aren't interested in monopolizing the local comedy scene. We want to provide quality comedy at a variety of venues."

Another successful aspect is their combination of local and non-local comics on any given Brevard Comedy show. "The comics all know each other really well, having toured and worked together for decades in some cases, says Meek. "Really comparable comics often take turns featuring and headlining for each other. Some even work together as a set and travel together. The open mic scene has really boomed which is helpful because it keeps our pool of emcees and guest spots fresh. Open mics are very different from professional comedy shows. The comics are working on new material, polishing it, so it may or may not be funny. The audience gets to enjoy a free show, and definitely some chuckles. As time goes on, the open mic comics do polish their material and begin touring and performing paid gigs, with us and other booking agencies or clubs. Then a new crop of open mic comics comes up and the circle of life continues."

Audiences have started to increase after some very trying times. "We took a brief hiatus right around pandemic, which also conveniently coincided with my wedding and back-to-back pregnancies," says Meek. "Once my second child was sleeping properly and allowing me to sleep properly, it seemed like the perfect time to pick things back up. The hiatus gave us time to discuss what we wanted for the future of Brevard Comedy. That's when we decided to transfer everything into my name and let my father step back. Telling jokes has always been his passion, and I had the event planning background from my Melbourne Zombie Walk days."

Some comics are almost like family. Local comedian Frankie Paul has been a fixture in the scene for decades. "Shannon and I started together back around 1988 doing comedy," he says. "When he decided to start booking comedy 20 years ago, he would always bring me in first. He wasn't much on being a road comic but wanted to be involved with comedy because he loves it so much. That's when he decided to just bring good comedy to Brevard. Since he became a booker, he has tried to bring the best comics he could find."

Meek remembers those early days as someone who grew up in the business. "Being in the back room of comedy clubs was fun. I'd sip my Shirley Temple and laugh at the jokes I understood. Frankie is one of my favorite comics. As I got older, I personally tried to emcee and the tummy butterflies were too much for me. I guess I didn't get the gene, but I needed to know for sure and the only way to know was to try."

These days comics can perform not only in a live setting, but also online such as YouTube and TikTok. "Social media has been incredibly helpful, but there was a learning curve," says Meek. "Facebook has spam preventative features many group admins utilize, which is great, but a flyer for a comedy show that gets shared a little too fast and frequently without enough information gets an automatic denial. Scam bots have given us bad reviews only stating our page violates terms and we need to click their link to remedy the issue. It's obviously a fake review. We are proud of the fact that we have over 30 legitimate 5-star reviews making us exclusively 5-star rated."

A show set for April 27th at Monkey Bar, headlined by Frankie Paul, is selling well. "I'd like to remind everyone how important laughter is," Meek says in closing. "How healing laughing can be, and how fun a night out laughing with friends is. I just want to see people laugh more."

DELUXE MOJO BAND

uddy Waters has influenced V millions with his brand of blues and in some respects can be credited with as the father of modern Blues Rock and the explosion of rock'n'roll that we now call Classic Rock. The Stones used one of his songs to name their band... naming themselves the Rolling Stones after Muddy's song Rollin' Stone. Although not really named in the same fashion, Deluxe Mojo does bring that spirit of Muddy's Got My Mojo Working, rocking hard and making you groove.

The group has been around over 15 years and plays one great classic rock song after another at their shows. You'll hear songs by the Who, Cream, the Stones, Beatles, Hendrix, Bad Co, Bowie and more. Performing mostly electric, they do many songs acoustically also. The band members are all

friends and have similar tastes and musical interests. You can tell they love what they do and have a great time playing for their audiences (hoping to make each person a fan!). They told me, "Of special joy is watching people smiling and singing along us." The band has always been a 3-piece with Steve Cohen and Tom McPartland having formed the band. They have had several bass players over the years before getting Dan Dennis to join the group almost 4 years ago. Let's get to know all three better.

Steve Cohen is the guitarist and vocalist. He started playing guitar at the age of 12. Originally from Massachusetts, he moved to Brevard County in the late 1970's. He's been in numerous other Florida bands prior to Deluxe Mojo including Tracer, Dully Hayes, Main Squeeze and the Matrix. As goes for a lot of musicians, once he saw the Beatles on Ed Sullivan (at the young age of 6), he was hooked. He knew he had to play music. Originally he wanted to play a violin bass like Paul, but 6 string guitars were less expensive so his mom bought his first electric at JM Fields for \$16. (a single pickup Teisco Del Rey; musicians never forget their first real instrument). His musical influences are many including Clapton, Hendrix, Blackmore, Betts, Allman, Beck, Gilmore, Knopfler, Guy, Moore, and many others. Fun Fact: his first club that he played in was Frenchman's Tavern in Cocoa. Steve shared some insight regarding his first guitar, "I had no amp, so I figured out a way to hook the guitar up to our old console stereo (when my parents weren't home, of course). Since then, I've been undeniably dedicated to the ongoing pursuit of the perfect guitar tone."

Steve's been married to an amazing wife Michelle for 26 years and has two wonderful kids, an adult son and daughter who both are in college. His son plays drums in a local band, The Mean Violets. Though retired as a supervisor of the VA Physical Therapy Department, he still provides outpatient physical therapy services on a part time basis. Outside of performing he enjoys riding his Triumph Bonneville motorcycle and likes working on guitars and musical equipment.

Tom McPartland is the drummer and also is a vocalist. Like Steve, that first Beatles performance was life changing. He was only 4 years old but thus it began his fascination with the drums. He told me, "I loved watching drummers thrash around on those drums and cymbals." He bought his first kit in 1973 (although my mother kept trying to get me to play the harmonica instead!) and taught himself to play by wearing headphones and listening to 8-track tapes. He was in several bands in high school and his first gig was at his sister's wedding in 1975. His major influences are Ringo Starr, Neil Peart, Mitch Mitchell, Ginger Baker, Charlie Watts, John Bonham, Ian Paice, Keith Moon and others. He met Steve in 1978 and jammed with him off and on, watched his band and built a friendship. He met Dan as he was his son's



Little League coach. Little did he know Dan played bass. Along with Dan they form the powerhouse rhythm section that lets Steve do whatever he feels on guitar. Retired from the US Postal Service as a letter carrier for 35 years, Tom grew up in Brooklyn and moved to Merritt Island in Junior High and graduated from Merritt Island High in '77. He's been married for 40 years to Sandy and has 3 great kids and an amazing grandson. His hobbies include playing drums, hanging out with friends and family and traveling. He shared some great rock'n'roll stories, "I loved dressing up with my buddies as KISS in high school! Not only that, but I'd have huge parties at my house when my mother was out of town. Three to four hundred people would show up. There were so many streets full of cars that the cops couldn't tell where the party was. Then the clean-up crew the next day LOL – including painting the interior. My mother never found out until we told her years later."

Dan Dennis is the bassist and handles vocals also. He started playing bass in high school in Rockledge around 1975. He told me: "I was watching Dave Fiester and the Tight Shoes band back then and I knew that is what I wanted to do." He moved to Columbus Georgia in 1979 where he continued playing bass in bands in the area. It was there he met his wife Charlotte at a show that they were playing at Fort Benning. They married in 1983. They moved to Atlanta, Georgia, and he kept playing in bands there until they had their first child in 1987. They have three boys, all born in Georgia. Having moved back to Rockledge in '99, he got involved in baseball and starting coaching the boys which he did until high school. They won the first ever state championship for the Rockledge Little League. Dan started playing bass again around 2010 and joined the Lionheart band in New Smyrna Beach. He continues to routinely play with Marko Pocta, Alex Adams and Jim Flautt when available. Influences include Lynryd Skynyrd, Led Zeppelin, Allman Brothers, Govt Mule... so many more.

The band enjoys playing all types of gigs, from significant events to clubs to private parties. They support when they are available fundraising causes and have played in the past several *Relay for Life* events and poker runs, Brevard Hurricane Relief, Bikers in Need (BIN), Space Coast Music Fest, and Dragonstock (an event effort to raise money to rebuild the south Merritt Island Dragon). My Flori-duh

Over the last few decades I have been approached by some pretty interesting people that wanted to know more about the Everglades, the Big Cypress swamp, Gator Hook Lodge, my family, and folks that inhabited and visited our home in the swamps. I know also that there are some shady characters that just want to profit from things that really have no meaning or personal value. They are not good humans.

When I first started the Facebook page about my home and its history, it was merely to preserve some memories that would otherwise go the way of so many forgotten and lost places that have stories worth learning about.

The first Gator Hook page (there are two and both were hacked and stolen) had a few photographs and some written history of the beginnings of Gator Hook and some of the folks that drank and partied there on weekends. There was also mention of Ervin Rouse. Ervin wrote the song *The Orange Blossom Special* which was re recorded and made quite famous by Johnny Cash, and Charlie Daniels to name a

couple, many more have recorded his songs over the years as well. Ervin was a well-known fiddle player and song writer that is still known today in several important circles as the Godfather of Bluegrass music. My first gig ever as a musician was as his drummer. I was quite young and a not very good drummer, but that was okay as he was drunk almost all of the time. Ervin is the subject of many books and articles and is still asked about often.

Admittedly I was a bit suspicious as to the motive of a few inquiries as the location of Gator Hook is a secret that I want to keep. There have been relic and souvenir hunters that have taken remnants of my home and sold them, or just kept them. There is a photo of a couple of men holding a Gator Hook sign that they found at the site. I'd give almost anything to have the sign as it is one of the rarities that cannot be replicated. They won't return it to its rightful owners. But I digress.

I have been contacted by some pretty famous journalists, authors, and novelists about our history. Some have visited Lissa and myself at our home in Melbourne. Jeff Klinkenberg was a writer for the *Tampa Tribune* and the *Saint Petersburg Times* that came by and chatted for a bit. There are also several books he wrote about Florida and the many interesting well known and not so well known inhabitants of the state. Myself and Lissa are the subjects of a chapter in one of his books on Florida called *Alligators in B flat*.

Tim Dorsey recently passed away and I was not aware of his death until someone mentioned it to me a few weeks ago. A prolific story teller, Tim was also a writer for the Tampa paper with a couple dozen New York Times best selling novels under his belt. I still possess a couple of snail mail letters he wrote to me inquiring about the Glades, home, and whether or not he could use my name and Gator Hook in an upcoming novel. Of course, I agreed. The book is called *Electric Barracuda* and

can be found in pretty much any book store or *Amazon*. Over the years we became friends, and I introduced him to my wife and a few select friends. As an amateur writer myself I have come to admire his work immensely.

Randy Wayne Write is another Florida writer with several books containing references of the Loop road , Gator Hook, Ervin and my family. There are literally dozens more books and novels referring to and featuring Gator Hook, The Loop Road and its cast of many. I recommend Peter Mathiesson's Florida books as well as CarI Hiaasen's, James Hammond, James Hall and even Dave Barry, I heartily recommend reading all of the aformentioned authors and any or all of their books, they all pretty much contain a lot of forgotten and memorable history of our state, its residents and their stories. Some are quite humorous as well as informative.

We all have heroes. I have some, my parents and siblings along with my wife and kids. And any author that writes about Florida, its history (because it's worth retaining), and a colorful cast of suntanned and weathered folks that made it what it is today. Rest in Peace Tim. May your wonderful books and their cast of interesting charactors live on for those of us that still enjoy a good read.


