





Three local business men and major staples in our music community decided to bring this event to the Space Coast: John Sekul of Johnny's Custom Shop, Mike Beckert of Beast Guitars, and Bruce Marion of Marion Music. Combined, they have attended almost 100 guitar shows all over the country, and they know how it works. Bruce: "It provides guitar dealers a great opportunity to show their inventory. And players have the opportunity to see many guitars in one place, instead of hopping from store to store."

Planning and executing an expo is a big enterprise. Who came up with this idea, and when?

Mike Beckert: We've been talking about hosting a local guitar show for years, but we always wanted to add some entertainment and educational programming like at the NAMM shows. It's so much fun. It's like a mini vacation to find your dream guitar or bass, sell your old gear and meet cool people.

What can visitors expect besides a lot of guitars?

Mike: Besides guitars there will be a separate room for guitar and bass clinics and performances. There will also be information sessions on guitar repair, studio and audio engineering operations, music promotion and

Ken Holt Celebrates His Latest Success

'SHADES OF LIGHT' IS ON THE CHARTS

It's no secret that Brevard is constantly spilling over with talented musicians. Every year more and more cut their teeth and move on to find their fortunes out in the rest of the music world. One such local boy has been representing our home scene well for quite a while and deserves some love this month. He has a new album out and has been performing in all sorts of interesting places. Chances are you might have seen him and his partner playing around - either way, let's take a look at *Ken Holt and The Promise*.


Holt grew up a military brat and his family moved around quite a bit before high school. By then they had settled in Jacksonville, FL where he stayed through college. Music caught hold of Holt early in life and quickly soaked up the influences of the Allman Brothers, Beatles, Wille and Waylon and Ken also points out: his Uncle Henry's mandolin pickin'.

By the mid-70's Ken was bringing up the low end for a happening group in New England called *The Blend*. *The Blend* became fairly popular and enjoyed some success including two records with MCA and two supporting tours opening for The Who, ZZ-Top, Hall & Oats, 38 Special, Loggins and Messina, The Outlaws, Charlie Daniels, Foghat and others.

Holt has a philosophy about music he has carried and cherished for decades. He is all about lifting people up and making them smile. If your day became even just a little bit better because you hear one of his songs, then that's all he can ask for. It's a labor of love and Holt knows that's really what matters. Ken is backed by 20 year of experience as a youth minister in bringing his special brand pf positivity to each show and recording.

"...music is what I do, yesterday, today, and prayerfully, tomorrow...I am guided by one goal: to create, share and perform music that is welcoming to all listeners, respectful of differing experiences and points of view, and hopeful in its messaging. As is often said in the music business, that is my lane."

Doing something with substance is paramount to Holt. He feels very strongly about making sure there is a message to his art—he wants people to connect...connect with the music, connect with him and connect with each other.

"I'm 75 years old. If I didn't love what I was doing and felt like it mattered I wouldn't do it."

Last year Ken partnered up with bass player and vocalist Brad Schwatzseid to form The Promise—a two-piece band that sounds like something bigger. These boys may sing nice and pretty, but they still have the chops to fill in all the holes and make a bigger wall of sound. And the harmonies guys...the harmonies! Locked on and zeroed in - I love it. Ok, I need to leave some of that for Rob's CD review that's coming next month. (make sure to check it out!)

Ken Holt and the Promise played their first gig last year at the *Florida American Music Festival* to a receptive crowd. Since then, they have played *Florida Sands Music Ranch* and the inaugural show of *the Sunday Sampler* in

Melbourne Village with the *Will Mclean Foundation*. Something really cool and innovative they are doing right now is touring public libraries. They have played numerous spots on the Space Coast as well as a special show with Bear and Robert, out of Jacksonville, at the Winter Park Library.

When asked if the Promise would remain a duo - "As of now it's just the two of us and it works well. We really work well together, and workshopping new material has become a joy for both of us. Maybe down the line we will start looking for just the right people, but for now we are taking it slow."

Holt's new album *Shades of Light* has been charting and receiving some really great reviews. Songs "Shine" and "I Did Not Know" are currently on the Independent Music Network Charts, The European Indie Airplay Charts and Cashbox Magazine Charts and more. "I Did Not Know" actually hit #1 on the Independent Music Network Chart/ Country and the recently released 3rd single on the album - "You Don't have to Stand" - hit #14 on UK I-tunes. So far everything released has hit in the top 10 on one chart or another. Ken credits his management and promotions company *MTS Management and Promotion* out of Pittsburg, but I feel like it might have a little something to do with the music as well.

Shades of Light is a real go-getter of an album, and you can't listen without smiling. Ken didn't do it all alone though. He tapped some very talented players and singers in the area to contribute. For a comprehensive list make sure to check out his website where he has each one profiled. Pay special attention to the "studio manager."

Ken has been involved with the *Will Mclean Foundation*, so I wanted to make sure we talked about it a bit here too. Every year the Foundation holds a folk festival in Brooksville, FL and it's done in a very pure style - meaning little to no drums or electric instruments - to promote Florida folk music and keep it alive. The foundation is named after legendary Florida folky Will Mclean and carries on his tradition. Typically a self-proclaimed "band guy," Ken decided to accept an invitation to play and fell in love with the style.

"I never considered myself a folk musician, but more and more I find myself playing acoustic on my albums and then I get all these reviews talking about my folk influence. I guess it is what it is!"

I would say Ken Holt is a hidden secret, but he isn't. He is out there everywhere all the time just waiting to share some time with you and make you smile. To find events and shows head over to his website or Facebook: *kenholtmusic.com*, *facebook.com/kenholtmusic.com*. There are also a ton of little tidbits about his music and life to peruse as well as download links to his music - past and present! And of course, get out and see ken Holt and the Promise or Ken solo. You will not be disappointed!

Adventures on the Road

Croix in the U.S. Virgin Islands to play at the St. Croix Jazz Festival, after which we had a month-long gig at The Saloon, a bar/restaurant near the docks where the cruise ships come in. Well, unfortunately, the festival was cancelled because it was a week after hurricane Marylan had just ravaged the island a week before. There had been 80-90 percent destruction around the island, however, the Saloon was spared much of the destruction. It was the only place around with electricity and, more importantly, ice. As the song goes, you don't know what you've got 'til it's gone. Ice was at a premium, and the Saloon had it all. Needless to say, we had a packed house every night. I guess we'll never know if they were there for us or a cold margarita, but we weren't complaining.

Up the hill from the Saloon was the house where we were staying. I guess it would have been ok if the electricity was on. It was a bit ominous roaming around with flashlights in the darkness of the island. Especially when we were warned about the millipedes, which were lethal if you got bitten. Fortunately, that was back in my partying days, so weed and vodka helped me go to sleep every night. In the morning, Billy and I would walk down the hill to the Saloon for breakfast and coffee. Below the house on the hill was a farm, which we passed by every morning. The sheep were bleating, the pig were oinking, the roosters were cock-a-doodling, and the morning doves were singing their song. The cacophony was amazing. Once I attempted to write a song based on those sounds. I never did finish it. I did, however, notice that the morning doves here in Florida are in a different key than the ones down in St. Croix.

We were booked as "The Other Brothers", a name that we had been using for decades. Our big hit in St. Croix was a song we wrote called "Pensia". We would get requests for it every night, sometimes twice! (By the way, if you want to hear it, you can go to www.chuckvanriper.com, go to albums and look for "The Other Brothers" album.) It's kind of a Spanish type of song and people always ask what the title of the song means. Funny you should ask! Pensia was a Norwegian bartender at the Saloon and one night


yelled at us: "Write me a song!", so we did. Luckily, the next night, we remembered what we had played the night before. Pensia loved it and it became a regular part of our repertoire.

One of the funniest things that happened that month was when the Dutch Navy came in. We were told they come by every 3-4 months. Let me start by saying that these were the largest humans I've ever seen. I don't think any of them were shorter than 6"5". They seemed to be very happy people and loved to drink beer. When they found out our last name was "Van Riper", they were amazed. Apparently, that's a fairly prominent name in Holland. I googled it, but didn't find anything. Anyway, Billy and I would be playing and doing our thing and all of a sudden The Dutch Navy would just break out in what sounded like a Dutch drinking song. Did I mention they were very loud, too! Our only choice was to just stop and let them finish their song.

Now, the bar had two rooms, the main u-shaped bar with a few tables and a room behind it that had pool tables. A brass railing surrounded each room as well as the bar. One night, I guess the Navy was feeling particularly frisky as they had removed all the brass railings from the back room. How they got it out, we'll never know. The bar owner was pissed to say the least. A few months later, we went back to the Saloon for a month's long gig. This time the electricity was on all over the island. Much better! The second week of the gig, guess who showed up? Yes! The Dutch Navy! They told the bar owner how embarrassed and sorry they were for taking the brass railings. Not only did they bring them back, and put them back on, they polished every single piece of brass in the whole bar. Then they start drinking, then we start playing, then they start singing.... And so it goes.


Melbourne Community Orchestra's New Season: Come Fly Away

My Flori-duh

In The Movies

In the fifties and sixties my father and brother were active in a lot of movie and television productions in and around Miami, Sweetwater, and other parts of Florida. As a professional rescue scuba diver and instructor emeritus, dad was often hired to assist both above and underwater on films, shows, and documentaries. He was one of very few people in the country that was qualified to do so.

In the mid-nineteen fifties he developed an interest in scuba after reading about Jacques Cousteau in a magazine. When he found that the famous undersea explorer spent a lot of time in the Caribbean and Atlantic around Florida he sought him out, took lessons, and purchased tanks, regulators, masks, wet suits and well, let's just say that, as a kid, there was an entire room in our home that housed his diving gear. Back then the wet suits weren't available in the variety of colors and styles like today's. They were all black and thick and, if memory serves me right, always smelled of salt and rubber. There were several sets of them. The flippers were long and black, and I loved to try and walk in them. There were black hoods that he put on before donning a mask, of which he had many. Unlike the modern ones you can see wherever divers congregate, these

were pretty intense. Some had what looked like hose spigot handles resembling the ones on the outside walls of our home extruding from them. As far as their use, I am clueless. I can only assume they were for increasing or decreasing pressure as he often swam to what was extreme depths for the time. One of his masks was triangular, some oval, and some round and most had similar protrusions.

The air tanks were large and unwieldy. Not like the multi colored and light weight ones you can purchase these days. There was a single tank for short dives and double and triple tank rigs for greater length dives. And heavy? Those things weighed a ton, at least they did to this smallish lad. The darned things were everywhere as well as Hawaiian slings, and spear guns, knives and other items.

Dad had everything needed to perform as required.

Before I was born he, my brother Jack Jr., and oldest sister Joyce lived on his boat in the Islamorada in the Florida Keys. From what I understand, the boat was forty-five feet in length and outfitted for full time residence. I've always been a bit envious as I often fantasized about living on one. I still do from time to time.

There were television shows such as *Flipper, Gentle Ben, Sea Hunt* and more. For a brief while South Florida was a hotbed of television and film productions. A little further north, there were shows like *Tarzan* and films like *The Creature from the Black Lagoon* being filmed in some of our gorgeous freshwater springs. All of the activity kept dad and his colleagues busy when not working at their day jobs.

Dad always read novels and magazines about adventures and adventurers, and they were scattered throughout our home at any given time. He was a founding member of the *Tamiami Volunteer Rescue Team*. It was the first of its kind in North America and the team assisted in the rescue and recovery of various types all over the state and

sometimes beyond from what I'm told. I have possession of some of the published materials alluding to his adventures and experiences. There is even a small pamphlet that was issued in the early sixties called the TVRT Safety manual that was generously given to me a few years back by a dear friend Kathy Hayashi. Her father Dave was also a co-founder of the organization.

In addition to the adventure publications strewn about, I was witness to dozens and dozens of newspaper and magazine articles about dad and his exploits as a law enforcement officer and various other undertakings be them benign or dangerously risky. In those days magazines and newspapers were still the most popular means of mass communication as television was still in its early stages and always in black and white. Upon his retirement the townspeople assembled three thick scrapbooks containing news and magazine clippings of his exploits and adventures throughout those years. Alas, someone that does not own them retains possession of them and many other items of his (you know who you are!), and if they're reading this, I would love to document them in a more modern format. This is just a small recollection of my father Chief Jack Knight.

There's more, much more.

That's only a miniature window into his life. All of my life I have heard people say what a great figure of a man he was. To me that's a bit redundant as I loved and admired the man. Still do actually.

That's my Flori-Duh.





Tide & Tonic is the "new kid on the block" among many venues along our beaches. The building has been there for decades housing several nice restaurants, but it wasn't until Kristen Kohl bought the building about a year ago and invested over half a million dollars to remodel, update and refresh it, that it became a charming new hot spot. The venue seems to reflect the owner's personality (doesn't it always?), and Tide & Tonic presents itself with "eclectic elegance" along with a "down-to-earth attitude." It's the best of both worlds.

The rebranding and remodeling took a few months, then Tide & Tonic opened its doors in April 2024 featuring beautiful murals on the outside and an elegant dining room inside. The menu includes several eclectic seafood entrees along with steaks, shrimp and scallops, all reasonably priced. If you are more in the mood for a modest burger or chicken sandwich, or just an appetizer, you can order that - however, nothing actually tastes "modest." The special sauces, dressing, presentation turn even a smash burger into a delicacy. They have \$10 lunch specials Monday thru Friday, delicate appetizers, homemade desserts, and an extensive Brunch menu on Saturday and Sunday from 11 am to 2 pm with Bloody Mary and Mimosa specials. Check out their menu on Facebook or website. This is not your average restaurant, it's definitely a step above.

The visionary behind Tide & Tonic is Kristen, and - no surprise here! -

she's a great cook herself. No, she does not work in T&T's kitchen, but "we all discuss the menu, and we've been through some changes," says Kristen. "I love making my customers happy, so we listen to them."

Kristen knows how to run a business - or SEVEN! She has been a successful entrepreneur for 30 years. Kristen opened her Imperial Salon & Spa in 1997 in Melbourne, the second location followed 2010 in Indian Harbour Beach. In 2011 she opened The Salon Professional Academy, in 2019 the Elevate Salon Institute in Miami Beach. In 2020 she acquired the Banana River Resort in Cocoa Beach. A year later, she opened the famous 7 Mile Grill in Marathon Key. "I had no experience, was scared and overwhelmed but with the help of a rockstar team we survived, and now we are celebrating 4 wonderful years of wins, struggles, tears, 5 star reviews, inspections, and tons of memories." (Btw, our friend Keith Johnson, longtime manager at Off The Traxx, is now the manager at 7 Mile Grill.)

How can one person run 7 businesses? Kristen laughs, "With a great staff!" she says. Indeed, she has over 200 employees between all enterprises. Matt McNaulty and Stefanie are the management team at Tide & Tonic, however, Kristen is not an absentee owner, "I am involved every day."

The outside patio with daily live entertainment is a big part of Tide & Tonic. "This is not a tourist place," Kristen points out. "We welcome the local community." The covered patio with a decent sized stage features popular local musicians. There are community events, including a monthly Classic Car Show with the Pixie Pinups. Last month they had a Back-To-School Party with four kid-led bands, kids' crafts and games, fairy hair and more. That's the "down-to-earth" side of the venue. It's family friendly, and pets are allowed. Things are looking up at Tide & Tonic. Is there anything that Kristen could wish for? "I wish we had more luncheons for groups and businesses. We have the perfect place for it," says Kristen.

Backstage with Firefall

Elko Concerts has done it again by bringing quality entertainment to our fair city. This time The Yacht Rock Tour brought us Pure Prairie League, Pablo Cruise, and our (new!) friends in Firefall to the Maxwell C. King Center. And what a show it was! The musicianship and vocal harmonies are things of legend. Before the show we had a chance to visit and interview Firefall! Upon entering the green room we were warmly greeted with hugs by our friend, bassist John Bisaha (Lissa and I have shared the big stage singing alongside John on a couple of occasions in the past) along with the legendary Jock Bartley, Steven Weinmeister, Jim Waddell, and Sandy Ficca. As it was pre show I had only a few questions prepared for them and was pleasantly surprised when Jock invited us to hang around a bit longer and chat.

How is the tour going so far?

Jock: We're having a great time and the fans have been terrific; touring with Pablo Cruise and Pure Prairie League is a blessing. The guys are all a great bunch and it's almost a family of sorts.

You're on the third night of a four night run, does this happen a lot and how do you keep your voices fresh?

John: It's great because all of the songs are well written and recorded, the original vocals are beautiful and a joy to sing.

Jock: Oh, it's easier when you are on the road with two other acts. Each group does an abbreviated set of mainly hits and their most popular songs, so the average set is forty five minutes and it's easy on the voice. Also I've got John and Steven who both have incredible vocal abilities. I don't even have to sing if I don't feel like it, these guys are the best I've had in many many years.

John: It's fun when you're on these package shows because you just do the hits and get out.

Do the three groups switch off as headliners? I ask this because each of these acts have incredible resumes. Steven: We pretty much stay in the middle, and it's nice because we can get in and get out early!

Jock: Well, we sometimes do but we like playing early. Every band here is really a headliner but I'm not as young as I used to be, so getting back to the room or bus or whatever is preferable. Jock: You know we played a couple

of weeks ago with Ambrosia and we were the first act so we got out early and that was nice because we got to see a little of the town.

Okay, are there times when another group joins the tour?

John: Ambrosia aren't the only guys that pop up on the tour. You know, we also play with The Atlanta Rhythm Section and Orleans, you know, all of us go out in groups of three or four from time to time and it's always great playing alongside all of the bands from the era.

Being in a band is a lot like being married, what's the secret to getting along after all these years?

Steven,: Time apart! (lots of laughter) Jock: Yeah, it's important to have time apart, and then when the band gets back together, either to record or do a show or tour, it's sort of like a family reunion.

Steven: Yeah, everyone's sort of refreshed and ready to go at it again.

Any new recording on the horizon?

Jock: Yes, we have been writing and we're going to put out a new album of original music. The last two releases have been the *Friends and Family* projects where we went into the studio and covered songs by people and bands that we've either worked with our toured with over the years, but our manager said it's time to do another Firefall record, so that's where we're at

What or where is your favorite studio?

Jock: Well, John lives in Los Angeles but the rest of us are in Boulder, Colorado where we have our preferred studio. We fly John in to do his part. You know he stays pretty busy with his other projects there, so he spends a lot of time on planes. (more laughter)

Then it was time for Firefall to get ready to hit the stage so we joined the audience in the auditorium and enjoyed a wonderful evening of great music by all three groups.

Our Destination

St. John's is the capital and largest city of the Canadian province of Newfoundland & Labrador. It is located on the eastern tip of the Avalon Peninsula on the island of Newfoundland. It is the easternmost city in North America (excluding Greenland). It is one of the oldest cities in North America with a population of approximately 239,316. The city has a rich history, having played a role in the Seven Years (French and Indian) War, the American Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, WWI and WWII. (After WWII the anti-U-boat net protecting The Narrows (entrance to the harbor) was pulled up and there was a torpedo stuck in it!) Italian inventor Guglielmo Marconi received the first transatlantic wireless signal in St. John's on 12 December 1901. Its history and culture have made it into an important tourist destination.

A ST. JOHN'S SOJOURN

It almost didn't happen, for me anyway. Early morning, Monday, July 7, 2025, we arrived at Orlando International Airport (MCO) for our non-stop flight to St. John's, Newfoundland, Canada. I decided to make a last-minute bathroom break before boarding but miscalculated the boarding time. I ran down the hallway to be the last in line just outside the airplane hatch and realized that I had left my cellphone in the bathroom! Another (two-way this time) fifty-yard dash and I arrived just as they were about to close the door! WHEW!

My traveling companions were RP Higgins and Steve (Steve-O) Prause, both of the local band St. John's Wood. Our other companions were Jake and Austin Caracciolo, two of RP's employees. (RP owns *Electric Picture*, a simulator technology company.)

We had an uneventful flight to St. John's on WestJet that lasted a little over four hours. Arriving shortly after 2:00 PM, RP lead us to our rental car and we headed to our hotel, the Hilton Garden Inn on NE Gower Street in St. John's, situated conveniently near the south end of the harbor. It was overcast and in the 60's. The hotel had a full restaurant and bar, and it was a ten-minute walk from downtown (George Street) where most of the famous bars are. And we wasted no time enjoying our first meal there, fish & chips, at the Duke of Duckworth. Most of the fish (cod) are deep fried but they offered it pan fried without breading as well. (The history of the cod fishing industry there is a big one but mostly in decline. Tourism is tops now.)

Tuesday morning arose bright and early. And I do mean early at 5:30 AM! This far north twilight lasts almost two hours. After breakfast Steve & I dropped off the others at the Memorial University of Newfoundland where they

spent the day upgrading a simulator. Steve & I then headed south to Bay Bulls, arriving in time to join a group boarding a large boat to see some whales and puffins. We weren't disappointed, seeing at least four whales including a mother and calf and tens of thousands of puffins and other birds. Puffins are cute, parrot like aquatic birds. They mate for life and are only six inches tall. Sometimes they over-eat and can't get airborne so must lallygag in the water awhile.

Our next stop was across the peninsula to the picturesque little seaside town of Dildo, on Trinity Bay. Yes, Dildo, and it's wonderful brewery with some of the best beer ever. (I bought a Dildo Brewery T-shirt.)

Later that evening after picking up RP, Jake and Austin, we headed uptown again, dining at the Yellow Belly Brewery, then bar hopping, stopping at O'Reilly's where Steve and RP were invited on stage to play a few songs. What a treat!

Wednesday we were all together and drove up Signal Hill, first to the Visitor Center, where young local reenactors, wearing WWI uniforms and sporting their Lee-Enfield rifles, were practicing drill on the lawn. Next came the museum and a short movie about the history of the Hill, followed by actually visiting the Hill and climbing Cabot Tower. The best view of St. John's is right here.

Next stop was the Johnson Geo Vista Museum LINK, a high-tech facility explaining the amazing and complex history of Newfoundland's geologic past. some of the oldest rocks on earth are part of Newfoundland's foundation.

Our lunch stop was a short drive to Quidy (pronounced kiddy) Vidi, and its fantastic brewery. One of the beer selections (and its vodka) are made from water reclaimed from actual 20,000 year-old icebergs! You can buy Iceberg vodka in your local liquor stores here in Brevard.

After a half-hour drive due east from town, we arrived at the Cape Spear Lighthouse, the easternmost point on the North American Coast. Arriving late in the afternoon there were only a few other visitors there. The stark, rugged coastal geography was both haunting and beautiful.

Back to town we ditched the car and walked back to George Street AGAIN. Dinner & more bar hopping followed.

Thursday, with a late flight out, we had time for more sightseeing that included the Titanic Museum, and, after lunch, a harbor tour including more whales and puffins, then on to the airport for our flights home.

My traveling companions were fabulous. Smart, funny, and always helpful in a pinch, the trip could not have gone better. We're already contemplating returning next year for Canada Day, July 1st. It will be on a Wednesday, so a Monday through Friday trip makes sense. Stay tuned for details on that as I'd love to bring a group.
