



A Tribute To Dokken

Founded in 2023, Mikk Peace and Eddie Cruise of the "Julliett band" began building the ultimate tribute to the music of Dokken. After an extensive search to find the right fit for lead vocalist, they recruited Phil Morse from (The Perfect Tool/ Tool Tribute). After several auditions on bass the last piece of the puzzle came to fruition, Eric Frate, the bassist from "Rising up Angry" completed the line up. Frate was just recently replaced by Robbie Sinn (bass/ not in the photo).

This collection of talent with extensive road and stage experience has solidified "Into The Fire". The debut of the band in November of 2024 was a huge success and interest in the band has taken off! They have been hitting the tribute band circuit pretty hard, performing big shows on big stages with other tribute bands and at rock festivals. This is their first show in Brevard County.

Dokken is a glam metal band formed in Los Angeles in 1978. They split up in 1989 and reformed four years later. The band has had several hit singles and has sold more than 10 million albums worldwide. The live album *Beast from the East* was nominated for the inaugural *Grammy Award* for *Best Metal Performance* in 1989.

BRIAN KELLEY

Sunshine State of Mind Tour

When superstar singer-songwriter Brian Kelley named his 2021 solo release Sunshine State of Mind Season One, it was never just a title. It was a homecoming and personal mantra, capable of making gravel roads and gray skies feel like the sugar sand of his Florida home. And with Sunshine State of Mind Season Two, Chapter One, he's still capturing the headspace Kelley calls a way of life. "Life is always going to throw you curveballs, so don't sweat the small stuff – and that Sunshine State of Mind is just how I was brought up," he explains. "It's about more than the music, and what it comes down to is being in a good place to say, 'I can face whatever's coming my way.' And now we have a couple soundtracks to back that up. This was a long time coming."

In all of Country music, it's the truth that matters, not the style. And when you're best known as the Florida half of a duo called *Florida Georgia Line*, that means white sandvibes and a breezy self-confidence. Beach bonfires with your favorite people. And a contented feeling of can'thelp-it creativity. Without a doubt, that's all true to Brian Kelley. But as he begins his long-awaited solo career, he's looking beyond the surface waters. To him, authenticity is a certain state of mind.

"They say write what you know, so that's what I'm doing," says the record-breaking, stadium-packing, multi-Platinum superstar. "But it's not just a beachy, island record. There's more to it than that." Making his solo debut on *Warner Music Nashville / Nashville South Records, Inc.*, Kelley has emerged as a chill-Country champion – and he's done it with a clear vision of his truth. His first EP takes listeners into the deep end of an artist who was born to make waves, right from the start.

Teamed with FGL partner Tyler Hubbard, Kelley has led a surge in Country's evolution since 2012, mixing undeniable hooks and edgy vocal harmony with beat-driven Hip-Hop, Pop, and Rock influence – plus a party-starting spirit. Together they've amassed 18 #1 singles, 13.2+ billion global streams, sold more than 40 million tracks and 4.7 million albums worldwide, and are the only Country act to achieve two DIAMOND-certified singles in the genre's history, opening new possibilities with each project. And now, Kelley's bringing that mindset to his own songs, revisiting the coastal dunes of his childhood.

"It's just something that's been put inside me, from the time I was a kid," he explains. "That's how Tyler and I started, and to honor our creativity and artistry, I think it's important to try new things."

BK's Wave Pack (released April 2021) is the first taste of this new chapter – four songs co-written as sandy singalongs with a feel of nostalgic romance. Steeped in all-good energy and beachside soul, it was co-produced with Corey Crowder as Kelley spent 2020 reconnecting to his Florida roots.

FGL turned in their fifth album (*Life Rolls On*) in May, and after that, Kelley and his wife, Brittney, retreated to their beachside home to recharge. But he soon found himself immersed in the most inspired headspace of his life. Song after song seemed to crash in, and they were filled with references to his life at home, his love for Brittney, his philosophy as a whole – and they felt different.

"I just knew that was my song, like, 'I'm supposed to sing that,'" Kelley says of the first one he wrote. "I kept going and every song after that felt like it was mine, like it was me. ... like it was time." Following his inner compass, each track became an elevated version of what Kelley brings to FGL – matching that anything-goes ethos with a sunshine-Country strut, and Kelley's loose-fitting vocal flow.

"Beach Cowboy" marks his artistic manifesto, a Latin-flavored boardwalk banger with an attitude. "Made By The Water" tributes the less-is-more lifestyle he's built with Brittney, who's featured all throughout the new work. "She's the girl in every song I write," he says with pride.

"Party On The Beach" captures a seagull's view of his carpe diem-belief. And with "Sunday Service In The Sand," Kelley highlights the connection that started the whole project – one that goes way beyond just a day at the beach.

A native of Ormond Beach, Florida, his whole childhood revolved around the water's edge. It's always been the place where his soul is most at peace. And even after his career took off, he's never forgot.

"Being on the road so long, I never lost that," Kelley explains. "From the day I moved to Nashville to chase a dream, I knew that eventually, I wanted to buy a piece of dirt in Florida. So all these songs came naturally, from my experiences as a kid and then getting away and finally to moving back, and I'm just really thankful it's happening now. It's perfect timing. And I think it's a God thing."

BK's Wave Pack is the musical side of that personal reclamation, and it's all happening with typical BK flair. It's not the end of FGL by any means, but with sandy-acoustic hooks, island-hopping beats, and message-driven positivity, it's not the last we'll hear from the Beach Cowboy, either. After all, this is what he knows best.





My Flori-duh
Youth Gone Wild

The Youth Center in Sweetwater was a hub and meeting place for almost everyone in town at one time or another. With modest beginnings as a Boy Scout building, the original ramshackle wooden structure became Gator Hook Lodge after being retired by the town and moved to the Glades by my brother Jack Jr. But not until a new more modern brick center went up beside the original.

On Easter Sunday after church service the townsfolk met at the center where great lengths of tables were set out and laden with fried chicken, roast beef, BBQ pork, smoked ham, frog legs, gator and more. One could enjoy potato salad, egg salad, baked beans, collard greens, mashed potatoes, snap peas, corn on the cob and any of a dozen other side dishes. Dessert was a big thing as well, with banana pudding, pies of every ilk, cakes and tarts. There were ice cold slices of watermelon. home canned peaches, strawberries, hand churned homemade Ice cream, and more. You were sure to exit the meal with a full stomach and a smile.

After the feast, we kids would hunt for eggs. Real eggs. Not the plastic things you see at Wally World and elsewhere. Like most families we spent hours dying a few dozen the day before and when we arrived they all went into the hands of the menfolk who hid them where we were unable to see.

Halloween was always a hoot, the costumes, many of which were homemade as the availability of store bought get ups were limited in that day and age. Everybody went Trick or Treating all over town and met up later at the center for a live band or two, dance contests, costume contests, some BBQ, and fellowship.

Christmas? Well, Santa was at the center every year. Mothers and fathers with youngsters in tow made the trip across town where we enjoyed hard candies along with red mesh Christmas stockings filled with small toys, coloring books, and more hard candy! With sweet soda pop, punch, along with eggnog our sugar rushes must have been the things of legend!. The men would be preparing to deliver gifts and necessities to the less fortunate while enjoying a cold beer or a nip of whiskey on the evening of the 24th. The mothers would sit and chat while sipping on highball cocktails or wine.

Any and almost all political gatherings were at the center with parades, bands and speeches along with the obligatory BBQ meal.

Memorial Day, and Labor day were celebrated outside the building sometimes accompanied by a small carnival and White Elephant sales. Independence day was the big one though. There were large (for the age) fireworks displays, a carnival, and food everywhere, kids running about like little dervish demons raising a ruckus and just having a grand time. Old Glory was waved by everyone throughout the day and evenings festivities and while the municipal band performed in concert

The Youth Center was where my father along with friends built a nearly regulation boxing ring in order to allow some of the more ruffian youth to blow off some steam or frustration minus the potential jail or hospital time for fight-

ing. The Center was where every Friday night the teens could go and hang out together with a live rock band. It was a place the younger kids could go on Saturday evenings to dance or stare at the opposite sex, drink punch while trying to work up the nerve to talk to the object of their affections. All the while Mrs. Talbert played the popular 45 rpm records for us. During the Dog Days of summer a kid could enter the cool building and play ping pong or checkers, maybe a board game or cards with friends, perhaps something as simple as reading a book while escaping unbearable heat.

Yet the Youth Center was more than just a place for the town's youth.

Much more.

It was the place that helped our small town developed its identity, its personality, and that of its people. It was a place where neighbors became friends and sometimes more. It was a place where relationships began and sometimes ended. It was place like no other I've seen since and woefully will probably not ever see again.

That's my Flori-Duh!

This year had a lot of surprises for Randy Bennett, owner of *The Creek* in Downtown Melbourne. Not all of them were expected, but if you have a vision, you keep going. And that's how the Hurricane Creek Saloon became "The Creek." But let's regress.

2025 started for Randy with a new radio morning show at 105.5FM "I am Country" - it's a sister station to Brevard's Number 1 station 98.5 FM The *Beach*. He's not a newcomer to radio. For several years he owned and operated the Smooth Jazz station in town. During this time he produced many live jazz shows on the ocean deck at the Crowne Plaza. When the radio station closed, Randy decided to open a country bar in downtown Melbourne. the very first one. That was eight years ago. He also organized the annual New Year's Eve Country Street Party and Concert in downtown Melbourne. It all was successful until the pandemic hit, and Randy, along with all other club owners, struggled to come back from the lock-down. Hospitality business was just not as good as it used to

be. So Randy looked for a way to refresh and rewamp his club's image. He applied for the reality TV show "Bar Rescue" - and was accepted. Then, the weekend before Easter, cameras were rolling in downtown Melbourne while the venue got its new make-over. The reveal party drew the largest crowd ever. Around 3,000 people witnessed the opening of the remodeled country bar. The new concept was well received by patrons, the new name "Neon Rodeo" not so much. But, oh well! The Country Party Bar was well on its way.

Three weeks later, an isolated incident on the side-street that involved two people from other establishments disturbed the happy vibe, and "every photo of the crime scene had our logo in it," says Randy, "even though it had absolutely nothing to do with our business and our clientele." It was time for another rename. Randy chose "The Creek," and this name has a deep and special meaning. Randy: "A little over a year ago, I lost my father..."

(Randy mentioned it during the filming of the show.)

"... Jon Taffer, through our conversations, was able to unlock the suppressed sadness I still had inside me over his loss that was affecting me, not only in my business, but in my heart as well. Although the name was 'Hurricane Creek', my dad, in his country-farm-Ohio-twang would always ask me if I was going down to "the crick". Jon and the filming did more than "rescue a business" it rescued me. Thank you, Jon!"

Now "The Creek" is open Wednesday thru Friday from 5pm to 2am, and Saturday from 11 am to 2am. The free dance lessons and line dancing are going as strong as ever, and they still root for the Cleveland Brown football team. What's new? They have a new food menu, but the most exciting feature is that they will be brewing their own beer by the end of summer. The frozen drinks are discontinued temporarily to make room for the brewing equipment.

The airing of the "Bar Rescue" is "some time in September or October," says Randy. The exact date is not known.

Randy Bennett is a busy man. He's on the air Monday thru Friday from 6 to 10 am. Randy In The Morning. Tune in at 105.5 FM or 1060 AM on the dial or via an app that you can download for free, look for "I am Country Space Coast". The new station plays a big variety of Country from the mid-70's to the mid-2000's, including lots of the good music stuff you like from the 80s and 90s. Listen to George Strait, Brooks & Dunn, Shania Twain, Alan Jackson, Reba, McEntire, Alabama, Tim McGraw, Aaron Tippin, Dixie Chicks, Tracey Lawrence...along with "classic" artists that built the Country music you grew up on like Johnny Cash, Waylon, Willie Nelson, Merle Haggard, George Jones, Ronnie Milsap, Vern Gosdin, Hank Jr., Charlie Daniels, plus icons like Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn, Tammy Wynette.

Welcome to Skynet!

She told me and proceeded to ask me if it got stuck in my head, like it did hers, and had I listened to other tracks on the album?, her favorite being blah blah blah... it was kind of crazy. Then I asked her - and this is where we should all pay attention write me a rap song about (listed random things) and she did, instantly, and it was pretty good. I then asked her to write a folk song, a heavy metal song, a polka song, a country song, a rock song. And every time it was instant and useable lyrics. There was nobody on the other end taking hours, days, weeks to wait for inspiration and pour their heart onto the page. There was no human artistry involved, but I was straining to tell the difference and to be honest I really couldn't.

This is a problem for us in the world of music.

Recently *Spotify* was called out for using AI generated music and artists to bump their catalog numbers. Timbaland, one of the most iconic producers in music, today just announced he is founding an AI music studio. This might be the beginning of the end, people. Now some of you might say AI can't put on live performances, so we will always have that.But that's not true. You can go to Japan and see an AI artist projection in a full sold-out

area. You can go to Vegas and catch projection AI shows of Sinatra, Elvis and Marilyn right now.

I realize some of this, or all of it, may sound like conspiracy theory because I used to think so, too. But then I noticed that everything I do for work; play music, write about music, and now even psychotherapy is being creeped on by AI, and it worries me a little bit. Everything I just listed is all very human at its core and if we lose the human aspect of anything artistic or altruistic then we are just that - lost. I applaud AI and the amazing efforts of the people that have helped it mature (and I hope it remembers that when it takes over) but I do worry about some of the implications from taking the easy route more and more. I guess we will see though, won't we.
