Remembering His Life & Music:

# **Eddie Scott**

Singer and entertainer Eddie Scott passed away Friday, October 4th, 2013. He was only 65 years old. The days of adoring crowds and never-ending applause had ended a while ago when Eddie suffered a heart attack and couldn't perform anymore. His last days were a grim battle with health issues. The sad end of a soulful and glamorous musician who always had a kind word for everyone, performed at countless charity events and was a staple in our music community. We remember Eddie Scott from those days. On Sunday, November 10th, his friends will perform a Memorial Jam to honor Eddie Scott from 1 to 6 pm at Lou's Blues in Indialantic.

Eddie was born in Georgia as a son of a Baptist Minister. He grew up with 15 other siblings, 11 sisters and four brothers. In 1957 Eddie's family moved to Melbourne, Fla. His parents were hard working, God-oriented people who raised their children on great principles despite of difficult times.

Born into hard labor without a chance of education, Eddie had two assets - his faithful upbringing and his family's musical inclination and raw talent for singing gospel. He recognized this as his chance for a career, and at the age of 22 he moved to South Florida.

Motown was in full swing. The Jackson Five were dominating the music charts. Eddie began entertaining in the Cotton Club singing Rhythm and Blues. That's where he met South Florida blues legend Joey Gilmore. Gilmore and his band, TCB Express invited Eddie to tour with them as opening act at their shows in Miami, Hollywood and Fort Lauderdale.

Eddie Scott has been recognized, inspired, and invited by many other big names in show business. In a 2010 interview he named Betty Padgett as a mentor, and Jimmy "Bo" Horn who began booking Eddie to open for himself, Al Green, and Tyrone Davis for over two years.

But Eddie Scott was quite able to hold his own success. For several decades he entertained the crowds in local hot spots, actually creating some of those hot spots while working there as the house band. While performing, he met up with Joe Davis, another legend in his own right, and they started sharing musical performances together under the band names of the "Sounds of the Drifters" and "The Final Touch Band" that featured Eddie as

lead vocalist. Next he started his Motown Revue performing in Jacksonville, Daytona and Daytona Beach where he met Edwin Butler of the band "The International Platters" and Eddie was invited to travel overseas to perform with them. After a year of traveling abroad, Eddie returned to do numerous lounge performances in Orlando for over two years at many of the area hotels, particularly The Hyatt Regency, Holiday Inn, Ramada etc.

Upon returning to Melbourne, Eddie met Don "Tree" Rees, the former drummer of the Mamas & The Papas, and together they formed the popular group Resouled which backed Eddie's Motown Revue Show - it worked! This act turned a lame Melbourne night club into a sizzling hot spot. For three years Eddie got the crowd dancing 4 to 5 times a week. That's when Eddie was on top of the world. Through all of his success he always kept his humble, friendly and gracious demeanor. The fans embraced him. He was loved. When Brevard Live Magazine conducted the contest for the very first Brevard Live Music Awards in 2004 asking its readers to nominate and vote for their favorite musicians and bands. Eddie Scott won and was awarded "Favorite Vocalist" and performed at the show in a golden suit. It was spectacular. The next year he won the title "Favorite Vocalist 2005."

Eddie Scott performed on the King Center stage opening for The Coasters, Ink Spots, James Brown, Aaron Neville, The Temptation, Earth Wind & Fire, even Clarence Carter.

What his fans didn't know was that Eddie also worked hard as cable layer to support his family. He wanted his music to be his legacy.

Then it got quiet about Eddie. He had health issues, he told me when he visited me in my office for the last time in 2010. He told me that he recently devoted his life to gospel music and that God will take care of him.

The news of his death was a shock. Even more troubling were the rumors about Eddie's last two years. There are reports about him being sick and disoriented. The family doesn't want to say much. It's about R-E-S-P-E-C-T! "We want to give him a decent funeral," said his sister Della Thomas. But there is no money to pay for it. Desperately for closure, some of his sisters and nieces have been calling music businesses asking for donations to the funeral home so Eddie can rest in peace.

So far Brevard Music Aid Inc has covered some basic funeral bills but more money is needed. Soul man Billy Lee has stepped forward to organize the Eddie Scott Going Home Jam with the help of Kenny Michaels and Rick Fincke, two guitar players who performed in bands with Eddie Scott. Many popular musicians are willing to join in to celebrate Eddie's life and his music. South Florida Blues legend Joey Gilmore and Joe Davis will be there along with Kenny Clarke, Kenny Cohen. Tree Rees... the list is endless. Proceeds of the event will be donated to Brevard Music Aid to pay for funeral expenses.



#### **STEPHEN MARLEY**

Bob Marley's second son, Stephen Marley, first appeared on record in 1979, when he was only six years old. With his brother Ziggy, the young Stephen recorded the single "Children Playing in the Streets," a charity single with the profits going to the United Nations to aid its efforts during the International Year of the Child. The single would also mark the beginnings of the Ziggy-fronted Melody Makers, a band that included Stephen's other siblings.

If you think you don't know the music of Stephen Marley, you just don't realize that you do. A member of the celebrated Marley sibling group, The Melody Makers, since the age of seven, the Grammy winning producer, singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist has also been the driving creative force behind the music of his brothers. Stephen's production, performance and writing credits recently earned him two Grammys - giving him a total of five; more than any other Marley family member or reggae artist in history.

Stephen has built and laid the foundations for a full-blown Marley family renaissance and with *Mind Control* and *Revelation Part 1: The Root of Life*, Stephen has achieved that. These are albums full of confidence and diversity in styles and emotion. "I don't want to be just another artist. I want to make a statement, and to continue this legacy with my family. I aspire to be a reckoning force, when you hear my name, you know quality comes with that: good music, good message, good vibe."

#### SPACE COAST ART FESTIVAL

As idewalk art show, the Space Coast Art Festival has evolved and matured into one of Florida's premier juried art festival featuring 250 artists displaying work in 10 categories of art. In order to be accepted for the show, artists must submit representative samples of their work which is then juried by a panel of art professionals and museum directors to compete for over \$50,000 in cash prize awards.

The festival weekend kicks off with the Turkey Trot, a 5 k road race and ¼ mile youth run held Thanksgiving morning, November 28th. In addition to a sanctioned 5 k road race, the race also features costumed runners and "turkey teams" - teams of four runners that compete while carrying a 12 pound frozen turkey. The Turkey Trot commences at 7:30 am from the Baliwick Mall in Cocoa Beach.

Another fun element added this year is the addition of 3D products. "It's our 50th anniversary so we want to do something special to honor our roots" says art festival board member Diane Kirschenbaum. "Our art festival poster, our festival shirts, our art festival directory and products, everything is going to be done in 3D. The Space Coast has always been known as a place for innovation. It only makes sense that the art festival would do something innovative for our 50th anniversary."

The juried artists will display and sell their work in downtown Cocoa Beach on Saturday, November 30th from 9 am to 5 pm and again on Sunday, December 1st from 10 am to 5 pm.

The art festival features a "Young at Art" children's craft and entertainment area with free hands-on crafts, and face painting. A food court is located by the festival stage. There will be lots of live music performing on two stages throughout the festival.

#### **ARTWORKS**

The 17th annual ArtWorks of Eau Gallie Fine Arts Festival will be held on Saturday and Sunday, November 23rd and 24th, from 10 am to 5 pm, along Highland Avenue in the Eau Gallie Arts District in Melbourne.

ArtWorks is unique from other art shows in that the artists not only display and sell their finished works, but also create works of art in their booths. ArtWorks was founded in 1996 by Link Johnsten, owner of the Eau Gallie Florist. Johnsten wanted to have an event designed to showcase artists doing their work and to instill a deeper appreciation of the work involved in creating art. This year, 80 juried artists will be in the show and will be competing for the award money.

Therese Payne Ferguson is the artist for the Festival poster. Her watercolor is of the Eau Gallie Farmer's Market. The poster will be sold during the festival at the information booth. Artist Andrew Spear will be completing his mural on the south facade of Maxine's Salon and Spa, 1590 Highland Avenue.

There will be a street painting (chalk art) competition on Saturday. The Foosaner Art Museum will be having hands-on art activities for children during both days. High School students and the Art Club from the Melbourne campus of Eastern Florida State College will be participating in ArtWorks. Like the professional artists, the students will be creating works of art in their booths.

ArtWorks goers will be entertained during the art show with live music featuring The Feral Kings, Jon Parrot, Ernie Southern and Pompano Pete, and Bobby Day. A food court will be available during the Festival

In the Eau Gallie Civic Center, there will be a Meet the Authors Book Fair and a show by the Brevard Porcelain Artists. The Florida Porcelain Artists show will be in the Harris Auditorium of the Foosaner Art Museum. The Eau Gallie Farmer's Market will be open and also galleries, shops, and restaurants. Free parking is plentiful.

# Nov 8-10, 10am, Wickham Park NATIVE RHYTHMS FESTIVAL

The 5th annual Native Rhythms **▲** Festival (NRF) (www.nativerhythmsfestival.com) will be held November, 8th through 10th in Wickham Park, Melbourne. It focuses on flute and percussion music and related native cultural history and practices. Nationally-recognized, award-winning musicians perform over three days. There will be flute-making and fluteplaying competitions, workshops and exhibition. Demonstrations of early Native culture as well as modern Native dance and crafting are provided. The program includes a Childrens' Day with programs tailored for students from local elementary and special-needs schools. There will be vendors selling hand-crafted instruments, relevant art and crafts, food vendors, and a silent auction.

There is no other event in the US that brings this many renowned artists to one place to play for free. Nowhere else will you find free workshops led by artists of this level. The Native Rhythms Festival is unique in the country. This event brings to Brevard the "stars" of the Native flute and percussion genre; among them artists like Robert Mirabal (twice Grammy winner), Arvel Bird, Randy Granger, Mark Holland, and Scott August (Native American Music Award winner).



November 9, 8pm, King Center, Melbourne **REO SPEEDWAGON** 

Pormed in 1967, REO Speedwagon is a rock band that has had a great impact on the music and culture of rock 'n' roll. Platinum albums and freeform FM radio staples such as "Ridin' The Storm Out" set the stage for 1980's explosive *Hi Infidelity*. REO rode the top of the charts with a 22 million albums sold in the U.S. and 40 million around the globe, with a string of gold and platinum records and international hit singles.

After an eleven-year break from recording, REO Speedwagon released Find Your Own Way Home, marking the band's 15th studio effort. These days REO are still doing what they've always done - taking good care of their legacy while keeping the focus on the future. Their career will always carry on with music that continues to define excellence in song craftsmanship and brilliant live performance for several generations of fans. Robin Zander, touring front man for Cheap Trick, constructed a killer rock group, using the best musicians from any band within the past 30 years. With guitarist, Mark Hitt, bassist Larry Hobbs and drummer Steve Luongo, they will be performing some Cheap Trick hits along with songs from his solo album as well as classic rock staples from the band's collective history.

The Space Coast has a new Rock & Blues Festival presented by Brevard Music Group that has been producing the Jazz Series for over a decade. Promoter Roland Guilarte has brought rock legend Johnny Winter a few times quite successfully to smaller venues. Now he decided to have him headline the inaugural Rock & Blues Festival in Valkaria.

Other performers are The Usual Suspects (12:30 pm), Dave Kury Band (2 pm), International Rolling Stones Tribute - Satisfaction (3:30 pm), John Condon (Solo), Albert Castiglia (5 pm), Anna Delgado (Solo), Johnny Winter (7 pm).

Best known for his late 1960s and 1970s high-energy blues-rock albums and live performances, Johnny Winter also produced three Grammy Award-winning albums for blues legend Muddy Waters. Since his time with Waters, Johnny Winter has recorded several Grammy-nominated blues albums and continues to tour extensively. In 1988, he was inducted into the Blues Foundation Hall of Fame and in 2003, he was ranked 63rd in Rolling Stone magazine's list of the "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time".


# FOREIGN STARR-DOM

t was one of the highlights at the 2013 Brevard Live Music Awards when Jack Starr was presented with an Ambassador Lifetime Achievement Award by legendary former UFO-guitarist Paul Chapman. And while Jack might not be well-known on our regular local music circuit, he's a legend in the heavy metal scene, and a celebrated performer in Europe.

Jack was born in Paris, France, to a French mother and an American father. Back in the U.S., he emerged on the rock and metal scene in 1981, forming, together with Joey Ayvazian, David DeFeis and Joe O'Rielly, the first incarnation of the heavy metal band Virgin Steele. The new band was selected in 1982 by Mike Varney of Shrapnel Records to appear on the label's compilation album U.S. Metal Volume 2. The fame in Europe followed after they signed with a new British metal label called *Music For Nations (MFN)*. "We were the first band they signed and our first release was Virgin Steele One," remembers Starr in a recent interview with Brevard Live. "The next MFN-band was Metallica. The third one was Ratt." Jack Starr was in good company.

"We played the European type of metal with classical influences," explains Starr his quick rise to fame that bonded him to the markets overseas. The second album, *Guardians of the Flame*, was even heavier, became another great success and branded Jack Starr as a metal legend, an accomplishment he was able to take along even when he left Virgin Steele to persue a solo career. His first album was *Out Of* 



The Darkness with Rhett Forrester of Riot on vocals, and the rhythmic section of The Rods, Gary Bardonero on bass and Carl Canedy on drums. He called his band "Burning Starr", named after his nickname for his ability to burn on his guitar. This band broke up in 1989. "There was no audience left for metal in the 90s," explains Starr his hiatus that lasted for a decade when suddenly the taste for music shifted and metal became popular once again, especially in Europe.

Jack Starr recognized his opportunity and decided to put the band back together. "This time it is a business venture," explains Jack his work as a touring metal band. "Our singer Todd Michael Hall lives in Flint, Michigan, and we meet at the airport when we travel oversees." The other members are Rhino who Jack Starr calls "the best metal drummer in the world" and longtime band-mate and co-writer Ned Meloni. Together they are touring Europe twice a year for several weeks performing at three or four major festivals along with some big clubs, scating rings and theatres - as long as they can hold a large crowd.

When he's in Melbourne, which he calls home since 2004, Jack is busy recording his newest album, *Stand Your Ground*. They started laying down the tracks four months ago. The sound files

are sent to a studio in Virginia, then to Poland and the final mastering takes place in Greece. "This is how my current record company, *Limb Music of Germany*, wants to do it," and Jack knows that they put out nothing but excellence. The previous album was *Land of the Dead* which was also released as vinyl version that hit the market on 11-11-11. Jack is proud of the label's production. "The artwork, the arrangement, the mastering - they do it much better. They hire top-notch experts."

Jack Starr is not afraid of selling out. "I never had a worldwide record deal, but have worked with over 20 different labels even for the same album." In 2009 he decided to buy back his entire catalog, everything but *Defiance* - "They wanted too much money."

Jack also nutures a little side project in his hometown - Blues DeVille, a 3-piece-band. Yes, the metal shredder also plays solful blues. "Brevard is not the place for the metal band but I love to play in front of an audience." Blues DeVille performs at Open Mike's, SBI, Steagles, even hosts of few jams. It's for fun. But metal is Jack Starr's business: "The other day I went to a record store in the Melbourne Square Mall to check if my album was in stock." www.jackstarr.com

Coming off of the heels of the first two Original Music Series shows; November shows no signs of slowing down. Sponsored by Brevard Live, Lou's Blues and Budweiser, last month featured GoFoot Band and up and comers Jacie & The Knick Knacks and The Friction entertaining the masses beachside. This month features music for every taste; power trios galore, to all female powerhouses. Sundays in November never looked so good...

November 3rd, 7pm: The Heart Ring. The band led by Bradley Daryl Burton have been on a roll. Following a performance at last month's Fall Festival in Downtown Melbourne, they bring their rock, blues, soul mix back to Lou's stage. The band finished second in last year's series. Constant gigging and the recording of a live release at Open Mike's followed soon after. The Heart Ring, scaled down now to a trio, are comprised of Burton on lead vocals and guitar, bassist James Dryer and drummer Travis Pelfrey.

November 3rd, 9pm: Guided by Tides. Hailing from Satellite Beach, this is a rather new entry into our music scene. Led by Graham Clifford, Guided by Tides brings a breezy, acoustic feel as their name suggests. One can hear contemporary indie influences such as Death Cab for Cutie, but even some classic rock of America as well. Making their Lou's debut, this trio could be one of the breakout bands of the series.

**November 10th, 7pm: Bear In The Woods.** Another series debut, the band cross counties with members from both Brevard and Orange. Self described as "supercalifragilindierock", the band boasts influences from Faith No More, Pink Floyd and Sunny Day Real Estate to name a few.

**November 17th, 7pm: WEEP.** The Cocoa quartet comes to Brevard by way of Ithaca, NY. Members Robyn Lynn Winkelman and Kim Paschke actually have roots further back in Minnesota years prior. This lineup; including Melanie England and Paula Voytko Taylor are influenced by Led Zeppelin, U2 and Marroon 5. The band is currently working on third CD release and have been gigging quite regularly on the scene including many charity events.

November 17th, 9pm: Jeff Stanton Band. Fans of the now defunct Rex Goliath will not be disappointed in this year's music series. Drummer Ryan Perez is part of Stanton's solo band. Both members are also part of Honey Miller; appearing in the series December 15th. Bassist/vocalist Brian Young is now with My Dearest Friend (also playing in December). Circles, Stanton's eagerly awaited solo CD, takes him center stage and onto Lou's stage with his blend of melodic, edgy guitar rock.

November 24th, 7pm: The Puzzlers. This is an eclectic band of world class musicians whose styles include calypso, Latin, r&b, blues, reggae, funk, infusing their jazz influences to it all. The band consists of Chuck Van Riper on guitar and trumpet, Paul Polanski on sax, Junny Martinez on drums, Curt Austin on bass, and Kenny Clarke on keys. Everybody sings. Since the 80's, the Puzzlers have brought their infectious rhythms and amazing improvisational skills to about every venue on the Space Coast and beyond.

November 24th, 9pm: Sounds of Nebula. After an impressive showing last year's finals, this Melbourne based foursome looks to make it back to this year's finals. Constant bookings have paired them up with bands of all different genres. This rock band, comprised of sisters Kelly and Colleen Quinn, Cayli Arico and Sonya Vagenknechtova, are celebrating three years together as a band next month.

Each OMS show starts promptly at 7 pm. Ballots are available at the bar. Each band can be rated on a scale of 1-10. Four bands will be invited back to a finale on January 5th. 

GoFoot Band TIME

If there was a Saturday morning cartoon special based on the shenanigans of a goofy 1960's Florida Fraternity, Go-Foot Band would provide a perfect soundtrack. Actually, they'd probably star as the house band. This stuff is fun and funny. After just 90 seconds of the opening anthem 'Go-Foot Time' you're already ready to party with these guys. The band members even introduce themselves like it was a garage rock speed dating service! Too much...


Shakespeare it's not, but of course, it's not meant to be. The profundity of lyrics like "Take some peanut butter/put it in a pie/bake it in the oven/you got peanut butter pie/mmm good/I want a piece of peanut butter pie" won't take too long to interpret. The song's meaning is direct and immediate – just like rock and roll was meant to be – and, with the laid back delivery of GoFoot band, every one of these ten tunes puts the R&R back in rock and roll. Like the kids on American Bandstand used to say, "It's got a great beat and I can dance to it".

Forget the current trends, the Auto-Tunes and electronic dance beats. If there's one thing modern music needs right now it's a new Happy Birthday song and GoFoot Band has written it (take THAT Miley Cyrus). It's track nine on the disc. It's called 'Happy Birthday'. You can't miss it. It's got it all: Mom, cake, Wal Mart - and all sung in tight harmonies that would make any mother proud. 'Happy Birthday' features a phased out underwater guitar melody that's classic. Precious Eyes' the first track on Up All Night opens like a reincarnation of Cab Calloway storming your stereo. No build up, no intro, straight sax blast coming at ya on the one. Although Bourke plays most of the instruments himself (that's impressive considering the sound is built into the delivery of big band music circa 1940s America), he left the bass to Ronnie Grkman and the drums to Mike Wilps. Following in the same vein, Track four, 'Two Will Nicely Do" follows a swinging jazz pattern that could find its way onto the dance floors of any of the local ballroom dance clubs.

Taken as a whole this record veers between jazz and blues (mostly blues) but the overall theme is definitely 'smooth'. Whether you're going out or staying in, this CD is a great background for date night, especially if you're having pizza. Track 8 'Pizza Bones' is a wry take on the American staple. It's rare to hear a gospel choir back up a tune about pizza crust but Bourke gets it done.

The title track "Up All Night" is a smooth blues tune ala Robert Cray and stays with the familiar theme of the touring musician. It's well constructed and could fit in anywhere. Anyone that's spent too many nights staying up way too late will know exactly where he's coming from. 'Thunder Comin" is a rootsy blues take on coal mines and muscle cars, an interesting combination.

Bourke's guitar work shines throughout, especially on the slick slide touches that wend their way around the disc. His sax harmonies are tightly controlled and well played. The lyrics are laid out in a ballad style so the tunes tell a story with a beginning, middle and end. Well crafted with strong production, it all adds up to an easy listening disc.

with Comedian Duncan Jay

#### LL: What is the history of comedy in Brevard County?

DJ: Well in recent history the most recognizable comedians to come out of Brevard are Darryl Hammond (from Melbourne) Carrot Top (from Cocoa) and Daniel Tosh (from Titusville). I have been back in the area for about five years now and the scene has grown exponentially within the last year and a half.

## LL: How has technology changed the way you get your name/material out there?

DJ: In my opinion, technology has totally changed the game. From the way you promote live shows; to the way you create a fan base and the way you get booked on shows. Can't tell you how many shows I've booked from Facebook. You-Tube is an invaluable tool for a live performer. You used to have to mail out VHS tapes, CDs or DVDs....and that postage costs money. That's not an issue anymore. Just load it up and e-mail the link. Not to mention the number of people being discovered from having a kick-ass YouTube page.

#### LL: Where do you see the comedy scene going?

DJ: I'm not 100 percent sure on this one. It kind of depends on the people reading this. If we get the support of the people the possibilities are limitless. Ultimately I would like to see the Space Coast to be like a haven for comedy. There is SO much talent here. I would like to eventually open a comedy club up here. Right now we have a couple of weekly shows in Melbourne. Also I have a dream to one day soon have a Space Coast Comedy Festival...but that is a little ways away as we need sponsors and a huge turn out by the people. But like I said over the last year or so the scene has grown so quickly. I mean 2-3 years ago we had six or seven local comics. Now on any given Tuesday or Wednesday we can have as many as 20+ males and females competing for 10 spots. So the main focus is to nurture this scene and see where it goes.

## LL: How was your experience hosting last year's Original Music Series finale?

DJ: In a word...Wow! I had so much fun. I made new friends. The winners of that contest Brevard Busking Coalition have become fans of what we've been doing and are almost always at our Wednesday show. It's pretty cool when everyone supports each other and it's not a competition. I really loved that night and would like to do more with the music community.

#### LL: Any last words?

DJ: I guess I would just ask everyone to come out and support our growing scene. Home grown talent is cool to watch especially when there is such talent that is being tapped into. Tuesday nights we do a show at Players Billiards Club. Wednesday nights we are at Open Mike's. Both shows start around 8 pm and there is no cover charge.

A friend and I recently visited for for lunch. The view is one that only a handful of restaurants in Brevard County possess. The interior of the restaurant, the bar area and the spacious outdoor deck all overlook the scenic Indian River. As you would expect, they serve seafood and prime rib but they also prepare some other tempting favorites like liver and onions and chicken marsala.

My friend chose the Salad with Grilled Sesame Tuna and a cup of the Louisiana Seafood Gumbo. The veggies and greens were bright and there was a generous portion of perfectly seared tuna. The gumbo was described as being lightly spicy and loaded with seafood. I was excited to find a lobster roll on the menu. I had never tried one. It was everything I hoped for, lots of tender chunks of lobster meat and bits of celery with mayo lightly mixed in atop a fresh toasted potato bun. So tasty that I will end up comparing all other lobster rolls to this one. I also had the clam chowder which had a warm, earthy bisque-like flavor and was abundant with clams.

We agreed that the view was tremendous but the food was the highlight. They have many different selections like Conch Fritters, Coconut Chicken Breast Salad, Fried Soft Shell Crab B.L.T, Monte Cristo, Blackened New York Strip, and several pasta dishes. The Shack has all of your deep sea favorites such as calamari, shrimp, scallops, king crab, lobster and more. I was told the Famous Fried Shrimp are plump, hand-breaded and a favorite of regulars. The fish is fresh and cooked to perfection whether you like it deep fried, baked, pan seared, blackened, francaise or sauteed with basil, tomato and mushrooms. You can enjoy a little bit of everything if you order the Cioppino - a medley of king crab, shrimp, mahi, mussels and clams in a rich tomato broth. YUM!

In short, The Shack is a dependable place that you can take the family or a nice location to have a cocktail, an appetizer and relax overlooking the water. The Zemkoski family has persevered and their dedication to the happiness and satisfaction of their customers is evident from the food to the service. One visit and you will be enticed to return.
