





November 7-9, Wickham Park Native Rhythms Festival



GWAR

"AT THE EVENT YOU WILL BE KILLED AND HUNG UNDERNEATH THE BODIES OF YOUR DEAD FRIENDS... HAIL ODERUS!"

This is how GWAR drummer Jizmak Da Gusha (Brad Roberts) signed off on our telephone interview two weeks before this year's 5th Annual GWAR BQ. While hoping to avoid an actual disembowelment, I was flattered by the personal threat from a living master in the art of intimidation. GWAR doesn't act this way, they live this way.

For the uninitiated, GWAR is a heavy rock band like no other. Their gruesome full body costumes, blood canons and nightly decapitations take shock rock far beyond anything attempted by any other act in the history of the genre. Alice Cooper plays golf - GWAR does not. Their music is aggressive and mean. Their lyrics are so lewd, foul, and cruel, that in their 30 years as a recording and touring act they've never had a hit single or album and their rabid and ravenous fan base worships them for it. This is the soundtrack of a modern day tribal bacchanalian blood fest and on this day the faithful gathered from all corners of heavy metal America not to mourn, but to celebrate the life of their fallen leader, Oderus Urungus.

On The Joan Rivers Show in 1990 Oderus explained GWAR to Joan's TV audience:

"We view the human race as scum... Everywhere you look on television these days you see people being run over by tanks, people starving, new sexual diseases. Obviously the human race is in love with self destruction. We are only satisfying a consumer need."

Dave Brockie (as he was known in the human realm) left the land of the living on March 23, 2014, but the family of the GWAR tribe gathered in Richmond Virginia on Au-

gust 16, 2014, to help deliver his alter ego, Oderus Urungus, to his place among the immortals in Valhalla. Like no other Rock God in history, an effigy of Oderus was floated in a Viking war ship on the lake of a Richmond water park and set alight by flaming arrows while 800 or so participated in hushed and humble respect and admiration. To be among so many hardened thrash metal fans, red eyed not from partying, but from a funeral pyre, is a moving and motivating experience. HAIL ODERUS...

The memorial speeches prior to the launch were led by Master of Ceremonies Jello Biafra, political activist and former frontman of seminal California punk rock band, The Dead Kennedys. Biafra spoke of longtime association with GWAR, Brockie, and Oderus Urungus. He spoke of his participation in Gwar shows over the years and mentioned on three separate occasions how much "that GWAR blood stings when it gets in your eyes!" (more on that later...)

In a more somber part of his address Biafra articulated to the rapt gathering about how some felt personally angry and abandoned by this high profile death in the 'heavy metal family' (Brockie's death was ruled an accidental heroin overdose). "This could have been avoided," he intoned. He implored the crowd to take a hard look at their own lives and to "Take care of yourselves... we need no more of this..."

Event promoter Jon Freeman spoke about his seven years working with the group and what it meant to be a part of something so meaningful to so many. He spoke briefly about the career path that led him to this event and how relevant it was that so many had gathered for such a heavy metal watershed moment. A broad smile on his face, an otherworldly gleam in his eye, he shook his fist at the sky and yelled "This is why I went to college!! To be with you people!! Now yell!! Oderus did it, thousands of times!! Yell!!"

The crowd screamed, roared and yelled again with a ground shaking, bone searing sound that could be heard from Richmond Virginia's Hadad's Lake to Valhalla. Then, Slymenstra Hymen, waving a flaming sword, led the crowd to the lake.

The effigy of Oderus Urungus, supine on the funeral vessel with a can of Gwar Killsner Beer in his fists and the Cuttlefish of C'thulu rising defiantly from his loins, had his ashes mixed into the sky.

The 5th Annual Gwar BQ party began the next day at 10:30 AM with Philadelphia's hardcore wrestling act **Eat The Turnbuckle** and the blood began to flow. The full day event was a benefit to raise funds for *Richmond's Ring Dog Rescue*, a pitbull rescue group. As Jizmack Da Gusha stated in our phone interview, "Although we hate humans we do like furry little animals." The beers and burgers went down, the two stages cranked up, and the water park got weird.

Stand out acts were **The Meatmen** on the main stage performing their classic punk hits like "Pope On A Rope" and their sardonic ode to The Beatles, "Two Down Two To Go". **Iron Reagan** on the second stage, a beat heavy staccato grindcore Richmond rock act with a rabid high energy following. The rafters over the pavilion were filled with IR fans pumping their fists upside down like heavy metal bats in a death metal zoo. The families hung in the back so daddies in GWAR paint makeup could safely rock their babes in arms to the metal nu-punk noise. **Ice-T & Body Count** incited the crowd to near riot in the way that only true Hollywood cop killers can do. Low down beats, dirty raps, charisma and crowd control are the trademark of this groundbreaking rap-rock act and they did not disappoint.

But it was GWAR that the tribe came to see and by the time they hit the stage the mood was hitting just the right manic bloodthirsty buzz. The stage exploded as Slymenstra Hymen, Blothar, and Beefcake The Mighty began a Battle Maximus onstage for control of the band, the tribe, and the upcoming *GWAR Eternal Tour 2014*.

Pressed against the stage I was close enough to hear a menacing warning sneered at me and me alone: "I've had about enough of you..." just before taking a point blank shot from the blood canon directly in my left eye socket. Oh yeah - it hurt - it felt like my eyeball slammed three inches closer to the back of my skull. It fouled my camera, sent me stumbling for the press exit and, as Jello Biafra warned the day before, "THAT STUFF STINGS WHEN IT GETS BEHIND YOUR EYE!"



Interview with Rep. Bill Posey

Afew years ago, I was playing at the Space Coast Music Festival and a gentleman approached me to convey how much he enjoyed my playing. I thanked him and introduced myself, as did he. "I'm Bill Posey", he informed me. I told him I had been following him since he was in the Senate, that I write for this magazine, and if I could ask him a few questions. We talked for a couple of hours that day. Since then, we had become friends over the years. This month, he graciously accepted my invitation to answer a few questions for an article.

There are thousands (like me) who still can't get health care because of the governor's position to not accept the Medicaid Expansion. What are your views on how to accomplish this and would you vote to accept the expansion?

Posey: I would allow the otherwise uninsurable, such as people with pre-existing conditions, to access Medicaid for a premium NOT based on their pre-existing conditions. That premium would have a sliding scale based upon income.

People are tired of the bipartisanship in congress. What can be done to alleviate that situation?

Posey: Generally when people think about acrimony and partisan antics in congress, they have a vision of the House chamber. Fact is that the House has passed over 350 pieces of legislation, most of it bipartisan, which Harry Reid has refused to take up for consideration in the Senate. People are under the impression that we never work together and all the bitterness is personal. That makes good news, empowers political parties, and gives people a lot to talk about. However, it is not true...

Every member has a different constituency, agenda, etc. Some want to be fiscally responsible - some don't. Some want to put the next generation first - some want to focus more on the next election... Some like space - some don't and so on... It is unrealistic to think such a diverse group will always see eye to eye. However many mem-

bers try to reach across the aisle as much as possible.

Most of the bills I have filed have bipartisan support. The record will reflect a list of co-sponsors that include some of the most liberal members from across the aisle such as Debbie Wasserman-Schultz (D-FL), Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX), Maxine Waters (D-CA), Gregory Meeks(D-NY), Susan Bonamici, (D-Oregon) Derek Kilmer (D-Washington) to name a few.

It seems like repealing Citizen's United is picking up steam. Where do you stand on campaign finance reform? Do you think publicly funded campaigns are the way to go?

Posey: I have mixed emotions about citizens united. I served on the Ethics & Elections Committee in the state House and Chaired the Committee in the State Senate. My elections reform bill, passed on the heels of the Bush-Gore fiasco, passed with unanimous support of Democrats and Republicans in both chambers. What I learned, among many other things during those years, it that you must respect the First Amendment and you can't stop money from coming into the political process one way or another. The most important thing you can do in that regard is make all the money spent in the process absolutely transparent.

One reason so many good people will offer themselves for public office or otherwise get involved in the political process is because they afraid to have their good names ruined or have their families suffer such wrath due to lies, distortions, or other character assignations common to the process. The observance of such miserables are also some of the reasons much of the younger generation does not want to get involved.

There are ways to clean up the process, such as making purveyors of slander or libel accountable for the "willful and wanton disregard for the truth" or more simply "knowingly and willfully telling gross lies about someone" is the easiest way. That standard applies to the general public right now, but not people seeking or holding public office. There is a lot of constitutional history on the issue people chose to ignore. Over the years I filed such legislation to fix this. However, I could never get it passed in both chambers. I would pass it in one chamber or the other, but not both. Too many people profit by not telling the truth.

I don't think publicly funded campaigns are the answer. For example, if we were both given \$50,000 to spend running for the same office, it would appear to be a fair fight. But suppose my father was able to buy the local newspaper, have it endorse me, say something good about me every day and vilify you with lies every day? That is the most obvious problem with publicly funded campaigns. The way things are now, at least supporters can (and do) contribute if they feel you are getting screwed.

The first political campaign I ever won found me out spent 10-1

Legalization of at least medical marijuana seems imminent (I hope). Gov. Scott says he'll veto any bill that comes to his desk.

Posey: Like it or not, Scott can NOT veto the passage of a constitutional amendment.

I was surprised by recent internal polling that showed senior citizens overwhelmingly approved of it while many more voters in younger age groups opposed it. I would have thought just the opposite. I asked my pollster for more of an explanation and the short one sentence version was that seniors never saw the abundant use and damage the younger generation has observed.

Unless I am further persuaded of some evidence to the contrary I will vote no.

Why haven't any of the immigration reform bills been bought to the floor for a vote? Same question with the infrastructure bills.

Posey: The immigration issue has been addressed twice in the past with promises to secure our borders. The border is still not secure which is a serious problem for our national security and safety. Many of us are willing to take up immigration reform only after the border is secured. Otherwise we really don't solve any problems; we only create larger ones for our children and grandchildren. No more broken promises. You know, the first time shame on you, the second time shame on me, I should not hold office if I fall for it the third time.

Everyone would like to improve infrastructure. The question is how to pay for it? Proponents simply want to add it to the national debt. I am against putting more on my children' and grandchildren' credit cards. The president's former Chief of the Joint Chiefs of Staff said the national debt is the biggest threat to our national security! And, there are a lot of threats out there as you are aware. Just imagine a family making 30K a year, but spending 35K a year, by putting the difference on their credit cards. Visa at 178K (national debt) and Master card potentially 800K (future unfunded liabilities for SS, Medicare, Medicaid, veterans benefits that have already been earned, and interest on the debt (at today's artificially low rate) Because of the debt, we may be the first generation in American history to pass on less opportunity to the next generation than we inherited. I will all I can to see that does not happen.



ORIGINAL MUSIC SERIES IY

Tt's a lovely time of year. The changling of the leaves. The almost chill in the sea air at night. The conspicuous absence of classic rock staples on a Sunday night beachside. No "Mustang Sally", not even a "Tumbling Dice." This month begins the start of the 4th annual Original Music Series presented by Brevard Live Magazine and Lou's Blues. Starting October 19th and running for nine Sundays from 7 to 11 pm. some of Brevard's most original bands will take the same stage as some of the most world renowned artists like Dick Dale or Johnny Winter. An expanded line up as well as an expanded personality hosting the series this year promises to make it the best one yet.

The OMS 4 will be hosted by "Stompbox" Steve Hodak. A mainstay on the local cover circuit (including many regular gigs at Lou's), Hodak focuses on his first love - writing original songs. He most recently developed and launched Brevard Original Music Makers (BOMM), an open discussion page on Facebook. "What if we supported each other so much that we changed the perception of Brevard County and people actually came here for original music?" he posted on the group's page. "A 14 year old kid (like you and I) that's in their room right now writing songs could have a place to play when they were 18? We can make things better here for future musicians"

Hodak will emcee the weekly music showcases featuring three bands a night - instead of past year's two - through December 14th. The series follows in tradition of featuring a wide array of musical genres. Each act will play for 60 minutes. A limited number of ballots are available at the bar. Patrons

and fans are asked to rate the band on a scale of 1 to 10. Ballots will be tallied and taken into consideration. Four acts will then be invited back to perform at the Series finale held on January 11th. The acts will again perform, this time in front a panel of judges to determine a winner. Past winners include Vilifi, Brevard Busking Coalition and last year's winner WEEP. The winner will then receive a prize valued at \$2000 made up of cash and gift certificates for top notch music related businesses to further the band's career - Mark Brasel's Zone Production (for recording session), Florida Discount Music (for instruments) and ArtLab (for band merchandise) are all part of this package.

This month showcases a great mix of Series' veterans and new bands to the scene.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 19TH:



JACIE & THE KNICK KNACKS:

The Brevard quartet will perform at the OMS for the second time. "We're beyond thrilled to be a part of the OMS again this year," remarks the indie rock band's lead guitarist John Robert Bridges III. "This will also be our first hometown show with our new drummer Casey Dodd." Dodd also plays drums for Jazz singer Kristen Warren who will performing in the series later on. The Knick Knacks'

bassist is Christopher Walker and the group is led by singer/guitarist/name-sake Jacie Madison Craft. The band is currently writing the follow up to their debut CD *Rubia*, released late summer of last year.



HONEY MILLER: Another veteran of multiple OMS appearances, Dave "Honey" Miller brings a revamped formation to the OMS stage. The line up includes long time collaborator Anna Lusk as well as multi-instrumentalist David Bitner and drummer Tom Van Dyke, both of Brevard Busking Coalition. "Since Honey Miller is done playing the drunk bar circuit to nowhere and only doing special events, our schedule doesn't conflict with the Buskers' schedule," Miller said via email. He describes his group as "an accidental and unintentional blend of diversified musicians creating a unique sound experience for the listener."



GUIDED BY TIDEs: One of last year's stand out debuts returns for OMS 4. This Satellite Beach based band explores the boundaries of multiple genres for the two years of their existence. Made up of members Graham Clifford and Zhenya Potepnyov, the

band hasn't played out much this last year except for a gig at Open Mike's.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26TH:



THE DULL BLADES: The indie blues rock duo from Melbourne closed out OMS 3 last year and will perform this year playing new songs from their eagerly awaited follow up to "Less Production, More Seduction." If the photo on their Facebook page is any indication, the new record may be called "Indulgence". What we do know is the team of guitarist/vocalist Nik Talbot and drummer Anthony Fata have been playing out a lot and their days as a

duo may be numbered. Talbot recently posted that an additional member may be revealed in the near future.





5 Questions with Studio 101's Brendon Paredes

Studio 101 owner/record producer Brendon Paredes is one of those people who hide in plain sight. Fresh off of accepting the Ambassador Lifetime Achievement award on behalf of *Lydia Can't Breathe* (who were on tour) at the BMAs, he reflects on what is important to him after more than a decade serving the Brevard music scene.

LL: How did you come to open Studio 101 in 2000?

BP: I went to recording school, graduated, and moved to Florida. With wedding money and savings plus a loan from the bank, I was able to start construction on a local warehouse in Suntree. When I first moved down, I was working on sea ray boats. I started *Studio 101* July 2000 first as a rehearsal space, then moved onto recording clients.

LL: Do you have any idea how many local bands you have

recorded and produced over the years?

BP: Not sure...a lot. There's been so many different styles, too. I'm very fortunate to love working with the people and musicians that I do. I love it. We work six days a week, only taking off on Wednesdays. They're very long days but I'm very lucky to love what I do.

LL: How do you balance your life between work and a personal life?

BP: Good wife, amazing life (*laughs*). We've been married 15 years and have a wonderful son named Noah. I don't drink or do drugs. I never hang out with the guys for the sake of just hanging. Time is so valuable. I'm really boring actually! Don't get me wrong, I love my friends. But I am really complete with my friends when I'm pushing them into challenging, learning situations and I'm there to witness and document it. It's always about the art.

LL: Not just about sound recording?

BP: Sound recording, video, photography. Any aspect or step in artist development. It's all amazing and challenging to me. I love the learning of aspects of multimedia and different mediums.

LL: Where do you see the music scene going?

BP: I know this - it's smaller than you think. And each person can really play a role. It's been a crazy ride and I have learned so much. I think touring will come back and the scene will restart itself on a indie level which is how it originally started back in the day. This will force artists to develop and tend to their immediate fan base which is so vital for survival. Having talent is not enough these days, it's expected. With that being said, we all have to do out part and work as a team. No finger pointing, just fill the spots and streamline. We, the artists, are now pioneering the industry that has crashed. We are at ground zero and the dust has settled. Let's work together.

Last month I told you a little about the town of Sweetwater, the story goes much further but that is for another time. For now, let's talk about the swamp. There were four ways to get to Gator Hook: you could drive the pothole filled gravel byway called the Loop road, make your way through the back woods in a swamp buggy, skip across the water on an airboat, or walk. Closed during the week it soon became the hangout of choice for weekend warriors and that's no exaggeration. Eventually my brother sold it to my oldest sister and then my father took it over. During dad's ownership we had many people drink, dance, eat, and fight and not necessarily in that order. There have been judges Ellen (maximum) Morphonios tried Jim Morrison for lewd and lascivious behavior. She was a friend of dad's and came out many times as well as many others. Ervin Rouse was the house band. Maybe you have heard of him? He wrote a little bluegrass song called "The Orange Blossom Special." My first gig ever as a semi pro musician was as his drummer. Charlie Daniels visited whenever his

band was to play in South Florida and jammed on the tiny stage many times.

There were college professors and derelicts, politicians and gangsters. All walks of life visited us. Then there was Christopher Wilder...In and out of jail for various sex offenses, (later in the 80's Wilder killed several beauty queens before being killed by police). We didn't know about Mr. Wilder's propensities, of course, and many of us that had met him were shocked when we found out. "He seemed like such a normal guy..." There were hundreds of other strange and not so strange folks that visited Gator Hook on a regular basis, and it kept it interesting, on the weekends at least. During the week things were different. School was sixty-two miles away and that made for a long bus ride featuring a couple of refreshment stops at tourist destinations along the Tamiami trail. That big yellow Blue Bird bus built in the sixties didn't have a lot of get up and go (speed) so we got on the bus during the dark mornings and returned home just prior to dusk afterwards. With no telephones or television it was up to each kid that lived in the Glades to make their own form of entertainment. One could fish and, boy did we ever! We fished for bream and bass in the daylight hours and catfish at night. We did a lot of hunting, too. Now before you get all up in arms about the killing of deer, wild hogs, etc. You should know that the majority of folks that lived in the Glades at that time hunted and fished for food and not purely sport. We always ate what we killed (including gator, of course!) and never killed for pleasure or trophies.

My idea of a great time was getting up on a weekend morning in winter, grabbing my shotgun and Bowie knife and heading deep into the swamp while the weather was crisp and cool thus reducing activity of mosquitoes and Deer flies. Often times a group of us kids would go out for a couple of days at a time and sleep under the stars on a dry hammock (not the kind you might have hanging in your yard) with the deer and other wildlife. Sound idyllic, doesn't it? Well, we didn't realize it at the time but it was. We were kids and didn't realize just how wonderful our lives were. Like the songs say, "I can run a trot line, and I can survive in the woods." To me, this is one of the benefits of growing up swamp. These days the place I lived is in The Everglades National Park and you're not allowed to take a grain of sand away. There are huge non indigenous snakes invading the places where we used to sleep on the ground. You aren't allowed to drive an air boat there any longer, or an ATV or swamp buggy. The park rangers will harass anyone that drives the Loop and things are just not the same. In some ways that's a good thing. In some ways, not so much. But at least we have the memories, and that my friends, is Flori-Duh.



You don't lose your days clean when you lapse/relapse

So often I see and hear people new in recovery and even some that had put together a pretty impressive consecutive stream of days clean, get frustrated with a lapse/relapse. Ok....be frustrated. Why? Because it is frustrating and embarrassing. It's hard to step back in to the rooms or let anyone know that you used. But when you work a program of recovery you learn how to process through that frustration and not let it define you as a failure. So really it's the amount of time you spend feeling sorry for yourself that matters more.

Relapses and lapses are unfortunately more common than we would like to admit in our profession. But contrary to popular belief, they are not a part of recovery. They are a part of the disease. It's evidence that being clean and sober will take more evidence driven practices. To some this may include adding a physician and/or counselor that understands addiction, participating in a 12-step program, or any other options available to you. What a relapse does NOT mean, is that you are a failure. Feeling like a failure results in depression, increased fear, anxiety, and isolation. It can also paralyze a person to not immediately get back into the routine that was initially working.

Recovery is a lifestyle that can take some time to understand and get used to. It often involves changing almost everything if not everything, depending on the person. Many people still hold on to some friends, thinking, behavior, or even substance they may consider harmless like marijuana, medication, or alcohol. I get it....some want to do the least amount of change but want the most amount of reward. Sounds like a normal thought process for a person who suffers from this disease of self hustle. And if it works...who cares. That's fantastic. But when it proves to not be working, by way of lapse or relapse, then it's time to take another look at your sobriety plan. What is it that I still struggle with changing? What is it that I can do more of? What is it that I have been recommended to do but I have refused?

The reason I say that you don't lose your clean days is because they are in the past. Done. And, you did them clean. So from THAT you learned what was working, even if it was temporary. For more permanent changes you simply tweak the plan knowing that you've mastered the hardest part of this disease. The desire to get clean. The willingness to change. The ability to do this for at least one 24 hour period. You have proven this to yourself and the only thing you lost was the consecutive stream. But you hopefully gained more insight into how this disease works, how it sneaks up on you, and what you need to improve on.

So after you're done beating yourself up.....get back to business. Remember you are not defined by this disease or the relapse....You are defined by the qualities you possess. It takes courage and strength to even accept this lifestyle of change and balance. Enjoy the day you are in and embrace it like it's the only day that counts. Day 1 or day 365 or multiples thereof. So don't get caught up in the numbers. This is a lifestyle practiced daily.

Victory and freedom will be yours.....then share it.




