The 38th Melbourne Art Festival will once again be held among the trees and lakes at beautiful Wickham Park in Melbourne. The awardwinning festival, which draws tens of thousands of art and music lovers, is a vibrant family and pet friendly event that celebrates the arts. This event will host over 200 fine art and jewelry booths, sponsor displays, food and cold beverages. There will be free parking, free admission, kid friendly art activities, and live music.

The popular VIP Patron Program includes access to a covered VIP Patron Tent to relax and watch the live

music while enjoying free beer, wine and beverages, patron parking near the festival entrance, invitation to the exclusive Saturday night Artist Reception, access to view the winning artwork Sunday, Patron buttons and more. The VIP Patron Program costs \$75 pp or \$125 per couple.

The MAF is a juried Fine Arts Show, drawing artists from throughout Florida and the United States. The festival was selected as one of the Top 100 fine art shows in the US over the past ten years by 'Sunshine Artist Magazine'. Originally held in Indialantic and Downtown Melbourne for its first 32 years, the festival moved to Wickham Park in 2017 due to limited parking, downtown congestion, and space limitations for artists, sponsors, and food vendors. Proceeds raised during the weekend, along with those raised at benefit art auctions, are used to encourage and support the arts and art education in Central Florida. The MAF has donated over \$100,000 to the community and is a 100% volunteer run nonprofit organizations in Brevard County.

MARK HUMMEL& The Blues Survivors

ark Hummel is a Grammy-**V**Inominated and Blues Music Award-winning blues harmonica player, vocalist, songwriter, and long-time bandleader of The Blues Survivors. Since 1991, Hummel has produced the Blues Harmonica Blowout tour, of which he is also a featured performer. The shows have featured blues harmonica players such as James Cotton, Carey Bell, John Mayall and Charlie Musselwhite. Although he is typically identified as performing West Coast blues, Hummel is also proficient in Delta blues, Chicago blues, swing and jazz styles. Hummel also plays with the Golden State Lone Star Revue (a Texas/California supergroup), Mark Hummel & Deep Basement Shakers (a jug band trio), as well as the current edition of the Blues Survivors.

In 2016, Hummel and the Golden State Lone Star Revue released their debut album on Electro-Fi Records. Hummel's latest album (2020) is a tribute to Bluebird/RCA Victor blues musicians of the 1930s and 1940s. Entitled *Wayback Machine* it featured Joe Beard, Billy Flynn, Kid Andersen, Rusty Zinn, R.W. Grigsby and Deep Basement Shakers. This is Hummel's 29th release and 10th for Electro-Fi Records.



ay the name Char Good Oin different circles, and you're bound to get slightly different answers depending on who you speak with. The twenty-seven-year-old Indialantic native singer/violinist is equal parts artist as she is entertainer (a rarity anywhere). She is also much more than that. Business woman, entrepreneur, visionary. You'd have to be living under a rock not to have seen her perform in some capacity in the area over the last few years. If she has her way, the name Char Good will be a household name well beyond Brevard County in the near future.

Good, as she proclaims, 'writes her own destiny.' That statement may seem brash, but she has the talent and the resume to back it up. "I love my life and I love myself. I'm the boss," she explains. "I have no debt and the coolest car ever; the Charmobile. I have health, family, friends, and I live in a beautiful location. I still have goals to reach and to accomplish."

The story began in nearly 20 years ago, as she picked the violin in 4th grade at Indialantic elementary. "I've been singing and memorizing/performing since kindergarten," she states. The violin is an instrument of wonderment; equally important as part of an ensemble or as a lead. The same can be said of Good. Her confidence shines in a group effort or solo outing. On any given day, her concert schedule

can vary greatly. She flawlessly floats from club gigs, corporate functions and most recently as the entertainment at wedding receptions. You'd be hard pressed to find a local entertainer with the schedule, and diversity of gigs as she has. A particularly high-profile gig came at the 2021 Robot Love art installation in EGAD. Performing alongside the famous fashion show and singer Kristin Warren, Good more than held her own with her unique style and artistic community as her back drop. She performed two songs that night, both with a pre-taped musical accompaniment. Her energy and talent in the performance is still talked about years later.

Perhaps the secret weapon for Good's success is her ability to play well with others. Her collaborations with artists and events definitely set her apart from the rest. She has frequently sat in with local bands Vintage and Creek over the years. In fact, a particular highlight was when she performed Guns N Roses' 'Sweet Child O' Mine" with Creek at a concert held in EGAD in 2021. "My favorite collaboration of last year was hosting the Melbourne Independent Filmmaker Festival opening night party on the Hotel Melby Landing rooftop," she remembers. The event, as prestigious as it was, saw Good not only as an entertainer but as a participant in a film festival entry. 'Voyagers' is a short film by writer/director Ian Bertel staring Good and artist Christopher Maslow. Using Hotel Melby as a backdrop, the two perform their talents throughout the building. Both, the party and the entry, drastically increased Good's exposure to the world at large.

Good's calendar only got busier as we came further out of the pandemic. "My favorite collaborations of THIS year were being the featured presentation for both the Space Coast Economic Development Council's "Launching the Space Coast Brand" event and the Melbourne Regional Chamber's symphony of stars awards banquet."

In both events, Good was an integral part of the evening, entertaining the attendees like only she could. Also, this year she performs regularly at various restaurants and venues showcasing her vocal and violin talents.

If the performance schedule wasn't enough, Good handles day to day business affairs like her social media presence and how to strengthen her brand. "My typical day looks is getting lots of sleep, charging my high-quality speakers and sound equipment, and running Char Good LLC," she says. "I answer emails, send invoices, and use my degree in Business Organization and Marketing to run my business. As busy as I am now, I don't reach out anymore unless the collaboration will really reflect well on my brand, and my brand reflects what I like in their brand"

Her workload is staggering. "I'm used to 2-3 gigs a day. Playing a retirement community in the morning, teaching a violin or voice lesson in the afternoon and playing a private party, a restaurant, or a wedding in the evening. Sometimes I'll jump in the ocean to cool off somewhere in there before changing into a sparkly show outfit." With such a diverse lineup in front of her, one would wonder what her 'perfect gig' would be. Without hesitation she paints the picture. "My perfect gig would be playing and singing a duet with Miley Cyrus & Dolly Parton. I

love traveling and staying in beautiful hotels. I recently traveled to South Florida to play a nuptial weekend. Playing in a beautiful location for an audience with open hearts and deep appreciation is my perfect gig."

When asked about her thoughts on the status of the local music scene, she cleverly replies "What are the music scene's thoughts on Char Good?" In fact, we are fans. WFIT show Acid Test recently had Good on as a guest. The DJ, simply known as 'The Host' states "Char Good is that delightful combination of working musician, I mean a hard-working musician, and a genuine entertainer, a performer. She's 100% every time I see her. Good luck finding an hour in her schedule for an interview."

The rest of 2023 looks to be just as exciting as the year has been so far. Her annual birthday bash scheduled for late September in downtown EGAD is something she looks forward to. "It's the only time I play with full live backing band; Char & The Goods." Until then, Good will continue living the dream she had set out to accomplish from such an early age. "Definitely" is her quick response when asked if this is what she thought it would be. And in the mean time? "More weddings, more shows, more connections, more LIFE." More is Good, indeed.

Canadian Blues Rocker

COLIN JAMES

anadian blues rocker Colin cades making his way around his home country, recording monster hits and accomplishing just about everything a maple-leaf-musician can. James began his career trading licks with Stevie Ray Vaughn in '88 before going on to a hugely successful recording career. So far, James has stayed shoulder to shoulder with the blues elite, taken home and astounding 8 Juno Awards and even played a concert for Queen Elizabeth II. Now, at the fiery age of 58, James has a new album, a new tour in America and a new perspective on how to approach his audience this time around. Colin's latest release is titled "Open Road" and it's a slight departure from his normal (not that he plays by any rules at all) brand of song writing or recording. This album feels a little freer, a little more comfortable and easy going. Even though James is a household name in Canada, this will be a new introduction for a lot of his American audience. Fortunately for us, here in Brevard, he's making an East Coast swing with a stop at the Tangiers Concert Hall April 16th, produced by Brevard Music Group. I was lucky enough to get some of Colin's time and talk a little about where he's been and what's going on in his world now.

Hey Colin! Where are you right now and what's your day looking like? Are you currently on the road? CJ: Actually, I'm on break right now. I have about a month off here in Vancouver to try and be creative. I'm always thinking about the next album.

That's ambitious. Your new album "Open Road" is nominated for Best Blues Album of the year congrats! You are about to start an American tour. Not to mention that you recently picked up your 8th Juno

award. I'm just saying, you already have a couple of things going on, but on your break you thought you would get in some writing while you could... CJ: I like to stay busy (laughs).

Looking at your discography, it's easy to see that you have been a fairly prolific over the years. Do you have a preference between being on tour and in the studio? Or is it just a different animal altogether?

CJ: Any performing musician will tell you, there is nothing like being on stage and exchanging energy with a crowd. That being said, I truly love being in the studio and being creative. That's where I feel the most at home. I love having a vision of how I want something to be and then searching until I can make it happen; and of course I love the little surprises you find when you are recording as well. Things people think were expertly planned, but were really just accidents you decided to keep.

I understand you got your start very early with a very well known bluesman. Can we talk about that a little bit?

CJ: Of course! Yeah, when I was 16-year-old I was playing around my hometown of Vancouver thinking I was hot shit, but I was a kid. Anyway, I knew this promoter and I was always trying to get him to help me, and he just kind of shook me off most days. But one day the phone rings and my mom picks it up. I hear her say something like "yeah, he's here." So, she hands me the phone and I talk to the guy and he asks me "can you get band together with 4 or 5 shuffle songs you can jam on for a show tomorrow night? If you can, you will be opening for Stevie Ray Vaughn." This was in 1988 and Stevie had just played with Bowie on 'Let's Dance' so I was pretty excited; but now I needed a band. I went down to the Saskatoon Jazz Society and asked if they had a bass player and drummer that could hold a shuffle beat. The next day I met the guys at the concert hall. They showed up with the drums in the

back of a pick-up thinking we were playing a wedding or something. We had about 40 minutes to practice and come up with 5 songs. So, we set up and start playing and suddenly Stevie busts through the door.

Stevie says "Is it true y'all just got together a few minutes ago and don't know any songs?"

"Yes, sir."

"Is it true you're only 16?"

"Yes, sir."

"Well, alright. See you out there!"

And he left. I turned and looked at the guys who were staring with their jaws on the floor. I said "oh yeah, we're opening for him tonight."

During the show I broke a string and ran off stage to change it as fast as I could. Stevie handed me his guitar and sent me right back out. And that's the way our friendship went for years. He taught me everything he knew about being at his level.

I've heard you talk about how big of an Albert King fan you are, and you and Stevie shared that I'm assuming.
CJ: Absolutely! Stevie embodied that style like no one ever has or will again outside of King himself. He would

show me stuff sometimes on the bus and he would say "Ok watch! I'm only gonna show you once."

What an amazing education to start your career with! But the jealousy I was beginning to feel didn't stop there. James went on to talk about touring with Buddy Guy and opening for John Lee Hooker. Jamming with Robert Cray and Eric Clapton. Touring with ZZ Top and Steve Winwood. The list goes for miles, and the credentials are impressive and well deserved.

I know that you have played just about every kind of venue out there from stadiums to tiny bars. If you had your choice which do you prefer - big and theatrical or small and intimate? CJ: For most of my career I have had a Canadian manager who booked me all over Canada, which makes sense, man-

agers typically like to make the most money with the least amount of work. It was just easier to keep booking me there. So, it's been a lot of years since I made the transition from bars to concert halls. I think playing big venues for so long caused me to forget how to talk to an audience because you can kind of get away with just playing. But now that I'm playing smaller houses again, I've enjoyed getting back in touch with the audience and talking about where a song came from or who played on it. It was a learning experience, but it's refreshing for me right now.

Is there a big difference for you between playing in Canada and America?

CJ: Well, yeah! I finally have an American agent now, so I am venturing into the States for this tour, and to be honest, it kind of feels like I'm starting over in my career. I like it! I'm getting really excited about meeting new fans and the innate fear that comes with that. Plus, I can play what I want right now. In Canada I've got some staple hits that people expect to hear. In the States I can throw those out, if I want. We've done a few acoustic shows, too. That's a whole different thing altogether.

I'll bet. What kind of approach are you taking with those shows?

CJ: Well, I 've been working on my finger picking a lot. We strip it way down and go very simple. That's definitely a show where I get to talk to the crowd quite a bit.

Have you recently played anywhere of note that got you excited?

CJ: We recently played a show at the Troubadour in Los Angeles. That was pretty special. After all the stories and legends that have played there; to actually be on stage was amazing.

So, let's talk gear for a minute. We live in a very "musician friendly" area down here and I bet there are some gear heads out there that would love to know what you're working with these days.

CJ: I'm mostly known as a Strat man, of course. Always have been. I have a

'63 I don't take on the road anymore, but about 5 others I do that I really love. I also take some Les Pauls, a Gold Top and Gretsch Silver Sparkle. I have some boutique amps like Matchless I carry around, but last year I picked up a Fender Vibro King and I can't stop playing. So yeah, that's my main rig now.

What can your fans expect from your show when you come down our way?

CJ: They can expect a lot of energy, that's for sure. We come out swinging and don't slow up til its over. I have my best guys out there with me, and we plan on tearing it up for everyone.

Can you tell us about your band?

CJ: I would love too! First off, I have Geoff Hicks on drums, a really great drummer I've known him for a lot of years and just a really solid person and player. Next, I've got Chris Caddell on guitar with me. Chris is one of those "where did he come from?" guys that you wanna keep listening to. And last but not least we have Steve Mariner on bass and harp. Steve came up to me when he was 13 and told me he could play like Little Walter. I was like "Sure kid, want an autograph?" A few years later he was everywhere playing killing it on his harp. He is quite literally the best harp player I have every played with... but now he's bored of it. So—he's playing bass right now (laughs).

If you haven't heard of Colin James, you aren't alone. Somehow, even some of the biggest blues enthusiasts here in the states have overlooked, or just plain missed almost an entire career of greatness from a very talented neighbor to the north. But lament not at all because the man is just hitting his prime and there is a lot more to come starting with his show in our own backyard on April 16th at the Tangiers Music Hall. See ya there!

Get Better, But Don't Have Fun

Well, being a musician my whole life, I've certainly had my experiences with drugs and alcohol. Although it's been more than 20 years since I've done either, one thing I gleaned from experiences with both, is the need for moderation. There's nothing wrong with having a drink now and then, but downing a half gallon of Bourbon every day might have some negative effects. It's the same with everything, I think. In fact, there have been many studies showing the benefit of psilocybin mushrooms to treat depression and other psychological problems. This is nothing new, of course. Psychedelics have been used for thousands of years. Here's a brief history.

During pre-Victorian times, Belladonna, Henbane, Mandrake Root and other psychotropic drugs were used to treat a wide variety maladies including mental and physical disorders. Eventually, being seen as witchcraft, these were all systematically eliminated. For hundred of years, Native Americans used peyote and other natural psychedelics in rituals and medicine. Got a headache? Here, take two peyote buttons and call me in the morning. During the late 1800s, German pharmacologist Arthur Carl Wilhelm, isolated the active ingredient of the peyote cactus, which we now know as mescaline. Also, in 1886, an elixir was contrived by John Pemberton containing the extract of coca leaves and cola nuts. This was the first iteration of Coca-Cola. Yes, it indeed contained cocaine. Today, Coke still uses the coca leaf extract with the cocaine taken out. By the 1940s and 50s, LSD was being used in research for various mental ailments, and quite successfully. In 1990, the FDA approved the research into using psilocybin, the active ingredient in magic mushrooms, for major depressive order.

The major reason many of these aren't more mainstream is because of their eventual use recreationally. Once they found out how addictive cocaine was in the 1800's, it slowly became illegal, as many were using it recreationally and getting addicted. Once they found out that a mushroom that grows in the wild can cause psychedelic experiences, and people were using them recreationally, they made it illegal. Once they found out that LSD could also create psychedelic episodes, and people were using it recreationally, they made it illegal. Even a weed that grows wild was made illegal for a long time because people were using it recreationally. It's getting a little better though. See, this is why we can't have nice things. It's illegal to have fun! Can't be doing that. No, really, let's talk about psychedelics being used for medicinal purposes. That's what I'm really getting at here.

As I've hinted at earlier, studies into using psychedelics for medicinal purposes have increased in the past decade or so. According to an article in "Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics", "Clinical studies administering psychedelics with psychotherapy have shown preliminary evidence of robust efficacy in treating anxiety and depression, as well as addiction to tobacco and alcohol. Moreover, recent research has suggested that these compounds have potential efficacy against inflammatory diseases through novel mechanisms, with potential advantages over existing anti inflammatory agents. We propose that psychedelics exert therapeutic effects for psychiatric disorders by acutely destabilizing local brain network hubs and global network connectivity via amplification of neuronal avalanches, providing the occasion for brain network "resetting" after the acute effects have resolved. Anti-inflammatory effects may hold promise for efficacy in treatment of inflammation-related nonpsychiatric as well as potentially for psychiatric disorders. Serotonergic psychedelics operate through unique mechanisms that show promising effects for a variety of intractable, debilitating, and lethal disorders, and should be rigorously researched."


This was from 2016. A lot is said in this one paragraph. For example, I didn't know I could take psilocybin mushrooms for inflammation. Well, maybe it won't work but I'll give it a try. How about using a psychedelic to come off drugs or alcohol? One theory is that psychedelics work by promoting neuroplasticity in the brain, which can help to break the patterns of addictive behavior. Some researchers believe that the mystical experiences induced by psychedelics can help people to see their addiction in a new light, leading to a greater motivation to change. Although these theories need more research, it looks promising. So I say, keep it up! Let's try to get a solution to some of these problems instead of big pharma dictating your disease, whatever it may be. But whatever you do, don't have any fun while you're at it!



Since 1988 Cantina Dos Amigos has been a popular Mexican restaurant attracting many regulars along with tourists. All was fine until the business sold in summer 2022. The new owners didn't want to continue the tradition, changed the well-liked menu, and the locals stayed away because "it just wasn't the same anymore". When hurricane Nicole swept through Florida last November, the beach communities took a hit. Dos Amigos lost its sign, and the patio roof got damaged. It was time for the new owners to give it up.

To save the building and business, Jeff Day who has owned and managed Cantina Dos Amigos prior to selling it in August, joined forces with Lou, the original owner. They worked day and night to bring the restaurant back to its old glory. "There was a little nervousness," admits Jeff, and "without Lou's help we couldn't have done it." Within a short amount of time the patio roof got rebuilt and a bigger outside bar was constructed. Most importantly, the popular menu was back - the recipes that Lou brought from South California where he had worked in a San Diego restaurant. Less spicy, more cheese was the secret; it was just the taste beach people liked back then and now. Cantina Dos Amigos re-opened the doors again in November and has been successful ever since. Now it's up to Jeff to keep it going... and the saga continues.

They play to entertain and have a good time, and it shows.

Jim Frederick, nicknamed El' Professor, plays drums and sings vocals. He's been playing in bands for over 30 years! Besides the FloriDUH Party Band, he also currently plays in Rockfish. He's been in Rockfish for almost 10 year. Outside of music, he's a Logistics Manager at KSC. He told us: "I come from a family of musicians. My

mother, grandfather, and great grandfather were all skilled pianists that performed professionally. My son plays drums and has his own band called Throat Punch." He counts Danny Carey, Brad Wilk, and Travis Barker among others as influences. A fun fact: He won an online contest from the cable channel VH1 back in 2000 and was flown to LA to be on VH1 live with David Alan Grier on 'My Music Awards'. He said: "I presented an award to Carlos Santana that I created in the contest called 'Your song kicked ass but they played it too damn much', which honestly was very accurate."

On Bass is Sunni S, nicknamed the Bass Assassin. He started playing at age 12 and by the time he graduated high school was already out on the road with his first "real" band touring the US. After 2 years of that, he attended the Atlanta Institute of Music in 2000. After graduating, he moved to Orlando and played locally and continued to tour and record for bands including recording two albums with Grammy award winner/ rock and roll hall of famer and co-creator of Nine Inch Nails, Chris Vrenna. He met FloriDUH drummer Jim in 2009 and they recorded albums and toured together in a band called Sci-Fried.

Julio, nicknamed Cujo is on Lead Vocals. He's been in this game for about 2 years. He told us, "I got into this by total accident. I was already friends with Dan and he invited me over to a jam session at his place where I met Sunni and Jim. It was fun just freestyling stuff and we started to do dad parody comedy songs. Like 'pick your f-ing legos up', 'can I hit your kid', and songs about changing diapers. Then it evolved into doing cover songs. I mainly was playing video games and spending time with my kids and doing voice acting pranks on telemarketers. I really wanted to get into voice acting but have no idea where to start. Then they needed someone to sing so I kinda just fell into it. So now I'm a Dad by day and singer at night while still pranking telemarketers dreaming of voicing a cartoon. To be totally honest I just memorize and speak words, the other guys are the real talent. When we practice I like to just sit there and watch them play. It just amazes me to watch them jam out. I'm just happy they let me tag along to hang out and pound beers to get away from screaming kids."

Dan D handles guitar duties, nicknamed El Diablo. He's a father of two and married to the love of his life. Dan told us, "My family really supports my music and band and I'm very grateful for that, my son is learning drums and my daughter enjoys playing piano and wood wind instruments - it must run in the family!" His dad gave him a Stratocaster 25 years ago and it's the one he still plays today. He's been known to hoard synthesizers and music gear and he enjoys being in the studio sitting in the producer's chair. Fun Fact: He gothed out in his 20s, cosplayed a rapping pirate on TV for America's Got Talent in 2012. You can find him wearing his "dress mullet" on stage with FloriDUH Party Band. He has a flare for the sensational and loves making people smile with his music and performance.

Some great original music and ventures coming out of the Space Coast as of late. Musician **Frank Gabriel aka My Damsel** has put out a new single 'On the Road' on their own *New Heights Records*. "I'm excited and nervous to get this record label off the ground running", Gabriel tells me. He has the chops and enthusiasm to do it, with a larger roster of artists to be announced at a later time. Find My Damsel on Instagram and a new platform *Slaps.com*.

It's no secret that I love when bands collaborate. That is exactly what happened when two of the most promising heavy bands in the area, Tether and Kyle Medina from the band Bodysnatcher got together. The track 'Sacrifice' came out late last year. When you're done there, be sure to seek out a new band called **Fifty Man Mission**. I got a chance to see them last month. They drew the short straw and played in the early afternoon but they played like an arena band for sure. They were tight, heavy and full of passion. I look for great things from this band as they have a unique sound that allows them to be paired up with a lot of diverse bands.

There is a new venue in town! Kim Mcmillan opened up an eclectic blues jazz bar located beachside in her old stopping grounds of the former Purple Porpoise at the corner (better *IN* the corner) of Eau Gallie Causeway and SR A1A. Corked 1080 opened about 5 months ago!

The venue offers scratch kitchen, farm to table foods, tapas, candlelit desserts, live music and fun jazzy house music! The place features a beautiful patio complete with wine, beer and sangria which will feature some Happy Hour live music "when it gets a bit warmer in the evenings," says Kim. The inside bar has a stage with live music every weekend. Among the performers are tribute artists along with local favorites like Joe Calautti and Chief Cherry. The decoration is unique and even includes a wall where guest can write on. "I remember that from the SBI (Sebastian Beach Inn, now defunct)," says Kim. "I thought it was cool."

If I'm to be completely candid here, there have been some wonderful and exciting things going on. Just a hint of sarcasm there. As I approach my sixtysixth trip around the sun I feel the need to write down some more memories before they fade (both of my parents passed away at my age). I look at my

hands and am a bit surprised yet happy to note that they have become what I remember as my father's. They were the hands of a professional law man. A career police officer that spent more than twenty-five years as the chief of police in Sweetwater. Although I have never been in any type of law enforcement, I have his hands. I have been in more than a few altercations throughout my life.

Now, Sweetwater was not a large community back then but we were on the western edge and experiencing the effects of the constant growth of greater Miami. Everyone knew everyone and that was a wonderful thing. Dad was the only law in what could have arguably been the last real frontier in South Florida, and the townfolk pretty much all respected him and allowed him to perform his duties unhampered. Dad fought, a lot, and it was rarely with an inhabitent of town. He had to, not because he enjoyed it, but it came with the territory. Literally.

The world was an entirely different place. I can actually remember at least one household with what can best be described as a ringer type washing machine. I was told stories of the early years before electricity was the norm, when a man (I cannot recall his name) built his own power plant and supplied electric to some homes. FPL was a small company that hadn't reached every small community in Florida as of yet. People were still using the old fashioned stoves and Ice boxes. I do remember the ice man making his rounds. We had small black and white televisions and no remotes, well...We kids were the remotes, often delagated to changing the dial to one of the three available stations or re-adjusting the antennas to try and get a better reception. Not the modern day digitally enhanced smart machines that inhabit living and other rooms today. The world was different. People had firearms, they carried guns some had shotguns, some pistols, some both. There were things that wanted to kill or harm you, in addition there were some bad people although school shootings and other things akin to them were unheard of

Dad was the guy that protected a whole township from wayward trouble makers from Miami or parts west which were and still are the wilds of the Florida Everglades. The town was known as a place where one could have a good time in either, the Bilmar or Jimmy's. Two of the most notorious and infamous road houses in the state were the destination of uncountable partiers over the years. Not everyone was the perfect visitor, some were just plain trouble makers. There were fights. A lot of fights, dad was the referee and peace keeper. He never weighed over a buck sixty five, yet never lost a fight that I'm aware of. His palms weren't calloused but his knuckles were

As the only cop on duty dad often had to subdue three or more people at one time, that's when he broke out his blackjack. a black jack is a small piece of lead wrapped in a heavy leather casing with a handle. It tended to level the er...playing field when one was out numbered. He detested having to use it. He also hated using his service revolver but did on more than one occasion. He was shot on three different occasions yet continued to police the frontier town of Sweetwater. And it WAS the frontier.




