





# ROBBY KRIEGER


of The Doors

couldn't believe it when I saw the email.I have conducted quite a few interviews throughout my tenor as a writer for Brevard Live Magazine, but this assignment was special. The man I was going to talk to was a member of one of the most iconic, influential bands in the history of rock n roll. He wrote one of the biggest and most covered songs ever. Oliver Stone made a movie about him and his friends! I was pleasantly surprised to find out that Robby Krieger - The Doors guitarist was still out making music, even happier to find out he is coming to town, and triple the thrills to learn that I was going to take some time with him and dig into a bit about life in The Doors and what he's up to these days.

Robby called me mid-day to talk. His voice has this undeniable laid back So-Cal feel to it. Once you get that accent in your mind, picture Bruce Dern speaking with it...and that's what Robby Krieger sounds like.

It's no secret that you are a member of the most legendary rock group of all time. What I wonder about that though is how it felt at the time. Did you ever have any idea that what you were doing could ever become what

# it did? Or was it more like four guys playing gigs in the moment?

RK: There was definitely some of that feeling, but we didn't have any expectations for what happened. We knew we had something good and unique and comparatively we knew we could compete with other bands on the scene like the Stones. Led Zepplin wasn't really doing anything yet and we were probably the top band, especially in California, that was doing anything psychedelic. We still looked up to certain bands like the Beatles and such, but we knew we were on our way.

#### I don't suppose you could have ever imagined Oliver Stone would make a movie about you.

RK: Oh, absolutely not! Who would ever think something like that. It was amazing and flattering and Val Kilmer really pulled off Jim well, but no, we could never have thought of that. It did kind of recharge our music though. I hadn't been playing Doors songs for 14 or 15 years at that point, but after the movie everyone was listening to us again and we had to get out there and do something. That's when John Denzmore and myself started touring play-

ing Doors songs.

I remember seeing a Storytellers on MTV around that time when you had Scott Stapp of Creed on lead vocals.

RK: Yeah, that's right! That was a great show. It was neat having him sing our songs with us. He was a pretty good guy too...we all liked him.

(Stapp and Krieger had the same manager until Stapp's death)

# What do you think the magic ingredient was that set The Doors apart from everyone else?

RK: I'm not completely sure about one ingredient, there were probably a bunch of things that came together just right. For one, we all had a lot of unique influences we were coming from musically. There was Indian, Latin, Afro-Cuban...I mean you name it, and we were adding it to the music wherever we could. On top of that we had Jim, and he was the biggest show in town every night.

What was it like for three accomplished, professional musicians to play with a loose canon poet every night.

RK: It was never boring that's for

damn sure. Jim wasn't the best singer when he started with us, but he knew how to stay on key and if he only sang three notes all the way through, they were the best three notes to sing. He just had that gift. We also didn't know what to expect from night to night so we had to always be on our toes. Depending on what drugs or alcohol Jim was, we never knew who was going to show up onstage. But that was part of the magic too.

The Doors have always been known for wild live show...as you were just talking about, but there was a time when The Doors weren't playing much live but recording like crazy. Would you say you were more of a live band or a recording band?

RK: I think it was relevant to whatever place we were in. After Miami (*Jim was arrested on stage*) we couldn't get any gigs, so we gravitated towards the recording studio and started writing. We put out 6 albums in 4 years so at the time we were a recording band.

The first song you wrote for The Doors was "Light My Fire." That song went on to become enormously successful and continues to be covered by artists around the world. What's that like?

RK: Yeah, that's a total trip on its own. It's funny, that song didn't start out even close to how it ended up. The only reason that song sounds like it does now is because we were able to play it every night for 6 months before we recorded it, there was a natural evolution to it. It kind of formed itself over time.

You guys have historically had a love/hate relationship with Florida... RK: What do you mean?

Well Jim was arrested, and you were banned from Florida for a while. You had Scott Stapp step in for a show after Jim, and he was from Florida. And the theater you are coming to play is just down the road from Jim's childhood home...and that will be in Florida.

RK: Is that right? Jim's childhood home...

(What goes on in the conversation here is me telling Robby Krieger about how Jim Morrison grew up in Melbourne, Florida. What has happened to the house since then and how it lies vacant and run down now. He was surprised and asked me to get him some information about Jim's life here. I happily agreed and that's how I became "best friends" with a member of The Doors.)

# After everything you did with The Doors and what you all accomplished, do you have any regrets?

RK: Yeah, a couple. The first is that we didn't play Woodstock and it was all Ray Manzarek's fault... that idiot. He said, "no way anyone is going to drive that far away from New York to see a concert in the middle of a cow pasture." So, we turned down the offer and missed the whole thing. The other thing was the Monterey Pop Festival. Jim pissed off the promoter and so we never got booked for that either.

# So, what can your fans expect from your show?

RK: The Doors songs, of course! We are going to play a bunch of Doors songs. *L.A. Woman* just had its 30th anniversary last year so we will probably play some from that album.

For more information about Robby Krieger or The Doors ask anyone in the world... it's the friggin' Doors. Robby is coming to the King Center on June 15th, 8 pm. The Doors have sold over a hundred million albums worldwide, inspired a major feature film, been awarded a Lifetime Achievement Grammy, and been inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Robby, meanwhile has also become a Grammy-nominated solo artist, and was listed among the "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time" by Rolling Stone. He is also an accomplished painter and the cofounder of the annual Medlock-Krieger Rock & Roll Golf Classic & All-Star Concert.

# Mark Longenecker

Brevard County has some colorful characters. There are the loud and outrageous ones. The ones that seem to act crazy to hog all the attention for themselves. To make sure that their interests are met first. Then there are people like Mark Longenecker. His heavily tattooed body and often high coiffed hairdo and facial hair make him instantly recognizable. Spend even just a few minutes talking to him, however, and you get to see how the soft spoken artist, surfer, musician, yoga enthusiast and philanthropist truly is and how much Brevard County means to him.

"I was born and raised in NJ," he explains on a late afternoon phone call last month. "I went to college in Savannah (Georgia) at the Savannah College of Art and Design. I then moved to Key West to work for Jimmy Buffet." Longenecker is happy to expand when prompted on the 'one of my first jobs was working for Mr. Margaritaville himself' piece of info. "My friend used to wear my t-shirt designs when he was home from college," he continues. "His parents worked for Jimmy Buffet. In fact, he was my friend's Godfather." A brief gig designing merch soon changed direction as he explored his artistic options. "My first roommates were tattoo artists. They got me into it."

He soon ventured all around Florida; Miami, Fort Lauderdale, eventually finding Brevard and specifically Cocoa Beach. By 2004 he was ready to launch what would become his legacy; *Endless Summer Tattoo*. "I knew we had to be near the water," he recalls of the early days tattooing out of the famous beach house turned business. He spent many years operating in Cocoa Beach as well as traveling to various Tattoo Conventions. He kept hearing about a reality show called *Ink Masters* which was a couple of seasons deep on cable TV. "I noticed that the contestants from that show were getting more attention at the conventions." In a 'if you can't beat them, join them,' strategy, he made him-

self available to the producers of the show. Longenecker had some good meetings but felt like they weren't going to pursue him becoming a contestant on the show. Season 5 was being cast then he was contacted. "The Producers picked artist Ryan Eternal and asked him who he wanted to work against (The premise of this season was to pit artists who knew each other beforehand against each other in the competition) and he picked me. The show was already familiar with who I was so they cast me." When the dust settled, Longenecker took 4th place on the show. Brevard residents, fellow cast mates (and brothers) Robbie Rivoli and Jayvo Scott also competed on the show that season. Recently *Paramount Plus* added *Ink Masters* to its streaming lineup for a whole other generation to watch and enjoy.

"I didn't really know Mark at the time that we were on the show," reflects Scott. "But we actually had a really good, long conversation one day on set without the cameras rolling. We hit it off really well. He's a cool cat and we've been bros ever since."

Cool may be a perfect word to describe Longenecker. His passion for art may only rival his other passions in life. His love of water and surfing made way to another hobby, this time on land; yoga. "When I get into something, I dive in head first," he admits. "I began learning all I could about

yoga and the spiritual and physical effects of it." After leading classes and the outpouring of people who wanted to participate, he got certified to teach officially. "A lot of people who sign up to take the classes are tattoo artists who have messed up backs from all the years they've tattooed," he explains. "Some no longer want to do long tattoo sessions cause it hurts them, but I love the long sessions to be able to work on an epic piece."

If art, surfing and yoga weren't enough in his busy daily life, he pursues the one thing in his life he has been doing longer than tattooing; music. "I was playing music and had been in bands in high school and college," he continues. "At first I was against the djs of the 90s that were playing techno, I didn't view it as music." Much like Ink Masters, Longenecker saw an opportunity to incorporate his art into the genre and thus Selector Longenecker was on the scene. "I had reggae music playing at my booth at tattoo conventions for years," he recalls. "Everyone was playing rock and alternative. Now years later everybody is playing reggae," he laughs. He takes his dj'ing skills and performs and hosts live concert events all over the county. A frequent collaborator and friend is DJ C-Lioness. "He's an eccentric, gifted artist/yogi/DJ/surfer/ creative person with a good heart and a big personality," she says when asked to describe him. "He is imaginative and inspiring to be around. He is great at enjoying life and living in the moment, and you can't help but get caught up in that same energy when you're around him. He's fun to be friends with!"

Fun is a big part of Longenecker's life. So is charity. He has been a big supporter of *Surfers For Autism*, a non profit headquartered in Stuart which runs fundraising events all over the state. He will be live painting a surfboard that will be raffled off at Cocoa Beach event happening June 18th. "I'm able to share my gifts and spend time with some amazing people," he states, noting that he has been involved in the charity every year that they have done events in Brevard. "They take people with Autism out on the water and it legit can change their lives," he continues with added enthusiasm in his voice. "I'm honored to be a part of these events. He also donated his time and talents to Manatee preservation, a charity also near and dear to a certain Jimmy Buffet. "I guess my journey has come full circle," he thinks out loud.

When asked if there are still things on his bucket list, Longenecker fires off trips to Red Rocks in Colorado and hiking in the Himalayas. With all the long distance adventures still to be had, the matter of factly indicates that Brevard County is his home. "I'll live here until I die." This place just wouldn't be the same without him.

### **Abbreviations**

s usual, I have questions, I tell you! The English Alanguage is confusing enough even if it's your primary language. The use of "there, their, they're" has led to the ire of many grammar police. Why doesn't bough rhyme with rough? The abbreviation for teaspoon is tsp, the abbreviation for tablespoon is tbsp, so why is the abbreviation for pound lb? Why is the abbreviation for ounce oz? (For that matter, does the word "abbreviation" really require two B's? If it was spelled with one B, that wouldn't change the meaning or the pronunciation of the word. What's with the extraneous B?) Anyway, back to the conundrum at hand. The reason pound is abbreviated lb come from the old Roman term "Libra Pondo". Libra (just like the constellation) referred to balance or scales and used as a unit of measurement. So libra pondo meant pound by weight, which was shortened to libra and abbreviated lb. It came into common use in the 14th century. The English currency (the pound) also relates to this inasmuch as it was equal to a pound of silver and the symbol for the pound looks like an ornate "L" (£). By the way, the pound sign (#) comes from the way medieval scribes wrote the abbreviation lb.

Ounce is another word with a latin derivation. The word "uncia" meant a twelfth of something as a unit of weight. This is where the word "inch" comes from. Originally a pound consisted of 12 ounces instead of 16. (So wouldn't something that weighs a pound whether it was divided into 12 or 16 pieces? Or was the measure of a pound different than it is today? I got questions, I tell you!) So, still, how did uncia become oz? Well, "unce", which also came from "uncia" came from the French, however in medieval Italian, that was "onza", and that's where oz. comes from. Whew!

Why do we say 11 AM or 11 PM? Where did am and pm come from? I could just as well been LQ and WF, couldn't it? LQ being morning and WF being afternoon. Well, not exactly. The 12 hour system started back in ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia. By the time the Renaissance rolled around, all the clocks had 12 hours on them. Imagine a wristwatch with 24 hours on it. That would be a tight squeeze! So that necessitated a way to tell the difference between day 11 o'clock and night 11 o'clock. I guess looking out the window was too inconvenient. So ante-

meridiem and post-meridiem were put into play. However, there was a great debate as to what to call 12 noon, as it actually was midday. Should it be AM (ante meridiem or before midday), or post meridiem (after midday)? Afterall, one second past noon is after midday. Also, midnight is 12 hours after 12noon and 12 hours before 12 noon. I'm sure there were battles over this forever, but it was finally settled that pm started at noon and am started at midnight. Of course, this whole thing could be avoided using military time.

Now we've already seen where the word "inch" comes from "uncia". The abbreviation for inch is in. You have to put the period after it otherwise it would just be the word "in". So you have in. to mean an inch. That's not really an abbreviation, it's JUST LEAVING OFF THE LAST TWO LETTERS! And since you need the period, it's just one character difference! Really! You couldn't get your lazy-ass fingers to type one more character? And the C and the H are closer on the keyboard than going all the way down to the period. O.k., end of rant. Speaking of which .....

O.K. was first used in the 1800's. Back then, they had fun playing with language and abbreviations. For example, KG stood for "know go," the incorrect spelling of "no go." Back in 1823 this was considered hilarious, lol. Now we know what they did before technology. In 1839, in an article in the Boston Morning Post used the abbreviation o.k. It meant "oll korrect" which was the incorrect spelling of "all correct." As incredibly hilarious as this was at the time, by the end of 1839 it had become commonplace in the vernacular of the time and lasted all this time. Now we even have a spelling for it, okay, which actually started out as an abbreviation.

So I hope you enjoyed this look at abreviations (see what I did there?) and remember, give them an in. and they'll take a mi.

It's been a long day at work when a text comes over: 'hey, what are we doing this weekend?'. Instantly you perk up as your thoughts envision cold drinks and music, and classic rock is definitely your music of choice. Chances are you will catch the band Galaxy as they are one of the busiest bands in Brevard.

You can always expect a great night of memorable classic rock from them whether they are performing as an acoustic duo or the full band. Together for over 9 years, the band consists

of Kyle Amos on guitar and vocals, James Beumer on drums, guitar, and vocals, and Joe Gaudy on bass guitar and vocals. Let's meet them!

Joe was born in New York City and moved to Florida in 1987 when he was twenty-three. He's played with numerous musicians over the years including several that work in national touring acts. A fun fact is that he was sort of forced into singing as the band couldn't find an acceptable singer.

Many of you may be familiar with the Galaxy Skateway on Aurora Road and are wondering if there is a link between the band and the rink or if it's just a coincidence because of us living on the Space Coast. Well, the band IS directly connected! The band came together prompted by Kyle's wife's suggestion for Kyle to jam with Joe. Kyle's wife knew Joe (who owns Galaxy Skateway) from playing Roller Derby at the skate rink and hooked Joe and Kyle together for some jamming. It all worked out as they connected on playing and their personalities clicked. As for the band name, it was an instant and obvious choice with it being the common thread that linked them together. James wasn't the original drummer for the band but had known Kyle through working at Rock Bottom Music. James was a regular at their gigs and became friends with the band and after being asked to fill in one night, he turned into a full-time member soon after.

All three members of the band are huge 3 Stooges and Seinfeld fans so it's only natural for them to add in some comedy while they interact with the audience between songs. Galaxy played their first show May 13th, 2013, at Boondocks Bar in Melbourne and within a month they were booked at Lou's Blues, Squid Lips and Sebastian Beach Inn. The band now plays more than 100 shows every year in central Brevard. James jokes he nicknames the band the All-Weather Galaxy as 90 percent of their shows are outside which can be a challenge. Tarps are always on hand. They've played in all types of weather; heat, rain, wind, cold and even a tropical storm.

With juggling day jobs and gigs, another challenge Kyle told me jokingly was mowing the lawn! You can expect a wide variety of music from Galaxy. If you remember AM Gold Classic Top 40, the old syndicated show, you can expect to hear a lot of those types' songs. The type of songs you remember fondly and can sing along to or ones that you heard from your parent's radio and one hit wonders. Kyle describes it as an old juke box from 1976 with all the 45s still in it. A perfect example of this would be Brandy (you're a fine girl) but also expect covers Pink Floyd, Tom Petty, Steve Miller, the Police, Joe Jackson, Counting Crows and many others, pretty much every era of rock music so there is always something for everyone. When I asked Kyle about the acoustic duo that he and James do, he stated that they change up the format a little and play mostly folk acts and singer songwriters, so expect Jackson Browne, Jim Croce and more casual songs. # One Night of Queen at the King Center

On March 17th, 1975 the band Queen played their first ever concert in Miami Florida at The Miami Marine Stadium on a floating stage in the midst of The Sheer Heart Attack tour. I was there along with a couple thousand others to see this new act out of the United Kingdom that sounded like a whole orchestra and then some. There was no such thing as MTV so most of us had little to no idea what to expect.

It was mesmerizing! The lights! The fog! The sound! It was a grand spectacle indeed! And that front man! Whew, still one of the greatest rock and roll showmen ever in my book! I had recently purchased the album at the local record store and knew that the group was good, but how good? Undoubtedly one of the best concerts I've ever experienced. As a result I was hooked, I bought every album ever recorded by them over the years, yet never had the opportunity to see them live again before Freddie's passing in 1991. Of course I watched the Live Aid televised concert along with millions of others, Queen's performance at Wembly was definitely the highlight of the show as far as I was concerned but admittedly I was (and still am) biased.

Years passed, no, decades passed. We all thought Queen was gone I mean "Who could possibly replace Mr. Mercury"? And then I read that Paul Rogers formerly of FREE and Bad Company was touring with the band as a replacement vocalist. Now, I have always admired Paul as a singer but doing Freddie's songs? I was just not convinced it would work to say the least. It's evident that I wasn't alone in my scepticism and his tenure was short lived. Once again I thought "Queen is dead".

Then came American Idol and a singer named Adam Lambert. Again, I doubted someone else could pull it off. I was wrong. Although Freddie was the greater showman, the young Mr. Lambert has an incredible instrument at his disposal and Lissa and I took our youngest Dallas and along with friends we saw him perform in South Florida with Queen on August of 2019. None of us were disappointed. It was a tremendous show.

Over the last few years we had heard of a tribute act from England called One Night of Oueen. The front man\ vocalist, Gary Mullin, had received rave reviews by critics and music journalists the world over, so when it was announced that they were coming to Florida our friend reserved six seats so that we could all attend. And then... The 'C' word happened! That's Covid. Fast forward two years and the show was rescheduled and everyone was excited. The King Center was almost sold out and the crowd was obviously happy to get out and see a live show and a Queen tribute at that! The house lights dimmed and the familiar sound of a Brian May riff filled the air! Oh boy! This is going to be great! But alas, it was pretty good at best, and although the singer is alleged to have aided in the vocal tracks for the film Bohemian Rhapsody his voice this evening was adequate at best. Now, as a professional singer with more than 50 years experience I understand that even the best have the occasional off night so... This must have been one of his. While his professionalism and stage presence were unquestionably terrific, it was painfully obvious that he was a bit hoarse and the band had tuned down in order to accommodate him. Don't get me wrong, the production as a whole was quite impressive with tremendous musicianship, sound and lighting that rivals many larger touring acts and it was worth the ticket price. All in all I would certainly attend another of their shows in the hopes that Mr. Mullin (Freddie) were in top shape vocally.



Sweetwater's Diversity & Harmony

Memoirs By Charles Knight

small town with a population of Afive hundred or so in the fifties through the seventies, Sweetwater was considered by some as a haven for a more rough crowd with a penchant for something a little different than what they might do in their own homes. A place to go on a weekend night and get in some fighting time, or a chance to get away with some shady activity that may not go over so well with the authorities in the larger neighboring city of Miami. A common error on the part of the misinformed. While the town itself mirrored many southern burgs of the era, it was commonly referred to as South Florida's version of Mayberry, the fictional home of Andy, Opie, Barney, and Aunt Bea. There were many physical similarities indeed. We had towering Australian pine trees and fishing holes as well as tomato strawberry and bean farms, and a cast of interesting and eclectic characters.

The long hot summer days saw any number of the town's children swimming in one of the canals or rock pits that dotted the land, or riding bicycles on the hot asphalt or gravel roads. Perhaps some would stay busy building a fort or a tree house in one of dozens of empty lots and fields while some rode horses through town and in the woods adjacent. Almost every business had a hitching post in front where one could tie their horse while shopping or getting a cold drink. Dad was the chief of police and although he had a police car he often rode his horse while on patrol. Some of the adults would be working a field or at their respective jobs in town or Miami while others had any of a number of small businesses within the town limits. Some of the adults were college graduates and worked in various professional areas, some were tradespeople that fixed or repaired things, some were grocers or barbers or whatever. It didn't matter because I came from a small town that had deep roots in local culture where almost everyone got along despite their differences whether they be academic or anything else.

I was a child in Sweetwater. Born in nineteen fifty seven I was witness to many things that the youngsters of today couldn't possibly relate to, World war two ended a mere twelve years prior to my birth, we were made aware of the men and women that sacrificed their lives for the freedoms and the good of all, many of which had called Sweetwater home. We had a diverse if not unusual population for a small southern town. We lived amongst, went to school with, attended church with, had picnics with, and celebrated holidays with our Japanese friends whom mere years before were imprisoned in internment camps right here in Florida and other states within our country because we were at war with their homeland. Grandma Rose (most of the neighborhood kids called her Grandma although we weren't actually related) and her husband Eddie were a lovely Jewish couple that had tattoos on their arms given to them by Nazis in

a death camp. I believe that was where they met and fell in love. We picked strawberries with our friends of color who years before were not allowed to vote, eat in a restaurant, or even ride in the front of a city bus, we ate ice cold watermelon and home churned ice cream with our friends and neighbors that were quite different in stature because they were little people. In fact, the town itself was founded by a group of Russian circus little people. To us, these folks weren't different, they were our people, the heart of our town, the soul of a place that can't be replicated in today's society. We went to school with Native Americans, both Seminole and Miccosukee. Some of my best friends had different color skin, some had differing diets or beliefs, some were democrats and some were republicans. My parents had friends and people that they cared deeply for that they had absolutely nothing in common with. They taught us to relish the difference in our lives, I grew up eating the foods of several different cultures, listening to stories of folks and their ancestors from different societies and places. I learned to curse in Spanish, Haitian, and American Indian as a youngster. I learned that the only real difference between us was the ways in which we thought and our upbringing. Fortunately there were a lot of open minded folks in our town but not all of them. There were racists in Sweetwater, there were bigots and some truly evil people as well. I'm afraid that we will never truly be rid of evil, but maybe, just maybe if we relearn that we are all just the heart, the soul, and the people that make up a bigger town, things will improve. In the meantime we could work towards ending the divisiveness that is permeating our country and accept that the only true constant is change.

The Sweetwater that I spent a good deal of my youth in is gone. Gone are the empty lots and fields, gone are the gravel roads. There are no longer continued page 28

The town has become a city, one that isn't anything like the one I lived in, I get lost whenever we visit it. Yet, it does still exist in our hearts and souls because we were the people that made it our home.






