#### **Les Dudek**

es Dudek is more a rock legend than a rock star. He's a "musician's musician" who has ✓ influenced the history of rock'n'roll, lend his powerful guitar and songwriting skills to several famous bands like The Allman Brothers, Boz Scaggs and The Steve Miller Band, and contributed to their fame with his sound. During all of that Les Dudek stayed under the radar, living his own life rather than a life in the lime-light. Chances are you're a huge fan of guitarist Les Dudek but don't even know it. The famous dual guitars you hear on "Ramblin' Man" - Dickey Betts and Les Dudek. The cool rolling guitar on "Lido Shuffle" - Les Dudek. Guitar on "Fly Like an Eagle" - Les Dudek, The catchy guitar riffs you hear on ESPN and Fox Sports Net - well, that's also Les Dudek. Brevard Live Magazine caught up with him after he spent the weekend at Biketoberfest in Daytona

So how was Biketoberfest, did he perform there? "No," said Les Dudek. "I just rode down with a friend, hung out for a couple days, you know, enjoying the comraderie." He likes Harleys, has owned one since he was 16 years old, the first was a 1957 Pan Head chopper "like the one Peter Fonda rode in Easy Rider." This fits the image - Easy Rider, a little Southern Rock, a little Jazz and whole lot of Rock'n'Roll, that's the stuff legends are made of. And Les Dudek is one of them.

#### The Good Old Times

Born in Rhode Island, raised in Florida, he earned his first accolades playing with the Allman Brothers who needed someone to fill Duane's shoes after he died in a motorcycle accident in 1971. Les Dudek was the guitarist who fit and was invited into the recording studio for the Allman Brothers' 1973 Brothers and Sisters album. He also helped Dickey Betts finish the song "Jessica" for which he played the acoustic guitar intro. Les: "I stayed in Macon, Georgia for two years waiting for a permanent invitation to the band but that never happened." This is how Wikipedia describes the situation: "... the Allman Brothers Band achieved its peak commercial success in 1973 with the album Brothers and Sisters and the hit single "Ramblin' Man". Internal turmoil overtook the band soon after..."


Les Dudek didn't have time to sit around. "I was working with Boz Scaggs, commuted back and forth from Macon, Georgia to San Francisco, California, touring with Boz." He later appeared on the *Silk Degrees* album (1976). In 1974, Boz, with Les, special guested the *Joker Tour* with The Steve Miller Band. At the end of this tour, Miller invited Les up to Seattle, Washington to record some tunes that turned into classic hits on Steve Miller's *Fly Like An Eagle* and *Book Of Dreams* (Capital Records), from which Les cowrote "Sacrifice".

"Among musicians I am known as a 'muso'. That's someone who plays with lots of different bands," said Les about himself. Indeed he has collaborated with Cher (*Black Rose*, 1980), Stevie Nicks (*Rock A Little*, 1985), Dave Mason (*Old Crest On A New Wave*, 1980), Maria Muldaur (*Southern Winds*, 1978), Richard T. Bear (*Red, Hot and Blue*, 1978), Bobby Whitlock (*Rock Your Socks Off*, 1976), Dudek, Finnigan, Krueger Band (*self-titled album*, 1980), toured with Steppenwolf, and probably a few more.

Besides contributing his distinctive style to other recording artists, Les Dudek pursued his solo career. He signed with *Columbia Records* in 1975. At the same time, a manager called Les and asked him to come to a rehearsal hall in San Francisco to hear this new

band he was nurturing. He wanted "the two guitar heroes" of the Bay area to be in the same band, "..and we're going to call it Journey". Les decided to be a solo artist for *Columbia Records*.

He recorded four albums: Les Dudek (1976), Say No More (1977), Ghost Town Parade (1978) and Gypsy Ride (1981) His work was praised by critics but widespread fame eluded him. When Les realized that this was a road to nowhere he left Columbia. He later recorded two solo albums, Deeper Shades Of Blues (2001) and Freestyle (2003) and made sure that this time he kept the rights for his music.



#### Here And Now

What's Les doing these days? "I am working on my new album called *Delta Breeze*. We already put down the back tracks and now we are recording in an independent studio." What does Les think about indy labels and self-produced records? He paused for a moment. Then: "I really don't know. I'm old school. I want my music to sound good and the old gear was so much better than the new technology."

It's a difficult subject for Les Dudek. The traditional music industry has not treated him right. "Sony now owns all

the rights to my old stuff. And Columbia claims I owe them \$70,000 for my own records. When I wanted to re-issue an album I had to buy my music at wholesale price," Les told *Brevard Live*. And when Sony released his four solo albums as a compilation album - Les found out by chance.

So what's a talented guitarist and gifted songwriter to do when his work doesn't belong to him anymore? Right - he sits down and re-invents himself, and that's what Les Dudek is doing right now. And when his record is set and done? "I'm not sure," said Les. "I probably try to get a deal in Europe. I have a friend in New York who has connections."

Les Dudek is his own man today with a little help from his friends, of course. "I want to build my own brand-name and my music is my legacy." What kind of music does he play? - Les Dudek tunes, of course because "I have never played someone else's music or style."

Has Les ever considered giving up playing music? "Yes", he laughed, "when I got married in the 80s. I started to study law enforcement and wanted to become a sheriff in California. But then John Kay from Steppenwolf invited me to tour with him, it was more money than I could make as a sheriff, and off I went." Then he got serious: "Do you know Bill Graham, the great rock promoter? In the early 80s he made me promise never to give up playing guitar. I think I took that pretty seriously."

Les is a true music veteran. "All I want to do is play and stay out of trouble," he said. And while he lost the publishing right for some of his great music, he didn't lose the right to play those tunes live on stage. That's why "I want to get out there a little more." His loyal fan base that Les Dudek has accumulated over the past three decades will appreciate this. Despite of the fact that Les has been cut short of some well deserved dues, for the fans that know him, he has always been a number one guitar player. Les Dudek - there are few like him.

Molly Hatchet

Molly Hatchet was the third band to continue Florida's Southern Rock winning streak, after the Allman Brothers and Lynyrd Skynyrd. Formed in Jacksonville in 1975, they are widely known for their hit song "Flirtin' with Disaster" from the album of the same title. The band, founded by Dave Hlubek and Steve Holland, took its name from a prostitute who allegedly mutilated and decapitated her clients. They have released 13 studio albums, the last one called *Justice* in 2010, 7 live albums, 7 compilation albums with *Greatest Hits* being released in 2011. Their first three albums went platinum.

Prior to the band's signing with Epic Records, they often toured the Florida roadhouse and bar circuit. Dave Hlubek was the band's vocalist, prior to Danny Joe Brown, and wrote and co-produced many of the band's songs. Hlubek has stated that the demise of Lynyrd Skynyrd – who were at the height of their success – opened the door for Molly Hatchet. Ronnie Van Zant was slated to produce Molly Hatchet's first album, having helped in writing arrangements and directing rehearsals prior to his fatal airplane crash. Molly Hatchet actually cut their first demos in Lynyrd Skynyrd's 8-track recording studio using their equipment.


In June 2000, Bobby Ingram, guitar-player since 1985, became the sole owner of the trade and service mark "Molly Hatchet," acquired from Pat Armstrong the original manager of the band. In January 2005, Ingram invited Dave Hlubek to rejoin Molly Hatchet. Current members are Dave Hlubek - Guitars (78–86, 5-present), John Galvin - Keyboards (83–91, 95-present), Bobby Ingram - Guitars (85-present), Phil McCormack - Vocals (96-present), Shawn Beamer - Drums (01-present) and Tim Lindsey - Bass (03-present).

Toby also let Shonlock sing this single at all of TobyMac's concerts to help gain popularity. The album Neveroddoreven (Never Odd or Even) was released on June 21, 2011, on Arrow Records. "My goal is to be a blend for the pop, hip-hop and rock-loving crowd without ever wanting to get boxed into a certain category," assures Shonlock. "I'm going to do whatever I can to make sure the people that need to hear this message get a chance."



After a health issue that kept him from performing for a year, Kenny was able to return to the scene and the stage with a new vigor and outlook on life. With these, he entered the studio to record *Let Life Flow* in 2008, and the good time gumbo of *Hooked On Your Love* in 2010.





#### Health Care In Hard Times

t the recent Sam Jam 4 Alice Robbins spoke on behalf of Brevard Health Alliance which provides both primary and preventative health care for Brevard County's residents without health insurance. Offering services on a sliding fee scale, BHA has provided primary care service, diagnostic services, case management services, medication assistance and specialty referrals to Brevard County's economically disadvantaged citizens since March 2005. The objective is to provide a primary health care home for patients. Like a family physician, the goal is to provide not just urgent care, but preventive care and health care related education to patients. BHA is a private, not for profit organization with a community board. More than half of the board members are patients of BHA-clinics. They now operate a pediatric clinic and an adult clinic in Palm Bay, an adult clinic in Melbourne, two adult clinics and a pediatric clinic in Cocoa, and an adult clinic in Titusville.

How can they do this? Alice explained. "We are funded both as a Federally Qualified Healthcare Center and with in kind donations from local hospitals. Uninsured patients are offered discounted fees based on income and family size. BHA also accepts Health First Health Plans, Medicare, Medicaid, United Health Care, Blue Cross-Blue Shield, and Florida Kid Care. Your questions will be gladly answered regarding our participation with your insurance carrier."

The Brevard Health Alliance is Brevard County's only Community Health Center, providing access to affordable health care for all, with clinics dedicated specifically for children. No child should be without health care and insurance. This is what Florida Kidcare is all about. Through Florida KidCare, the State of Florida offers health insurance for children from birth through age 18, even if one or both parents are working. It includes four different parts. When you apply for the insurance, Florida KidCare will check which part your child may qualify for based on age and family income.

Often enough, Emergency Departments are used as a medical safety net for those unable to afford medical care and sadly, many are our children. Brevard Health Alliance was created in March of 2005 to address access to medical care for all citizens of Brevard County. BHA is a unique partnership between Health First, Wuesthoff, Brevard County Government and Federal Funding designed to





improve the health of all Brevard County Citizens. This has been accomplished with the creation of clinics providing affordable medical care throughout the County. Through their Board Certified Pediatricians, their clinics offer access to immunizations, preventative/well care, sick care, and medications. Each clinic is staffed with Case Management which provides assistance with applications for Florida Kid Care and Medicaid as well as other public assistance programs.

Brevard's pediatric population is particularly vulnerable in these turbulent economic times we are experiencing. Health insurance coverage has become a challenge for many families who have never expected to navigate a system of support for medical care. Every aspect of a child's development can be impacted by unavailable medical health care and lack of medical care can have serious consequences for a child and their family. Access to essential care for our pediatric population is readily available through the efforts of the BHA team in each clinic: pediatrician, nurse practitioner, clinic nurses, medical assistants and case manager. The clinics are staffed to meet the holistic needs of the child and their family through the creation of a affordable health care for all, with "Medical Home."


The hardest part of the application seems to be the financial information. If you do not get a paystub, or get paid in cash, make sure you keep good records so that the process is easier for both, you and the administrative staff.

BHA has just recently added Dental Services in Rockledge and a Social Worker for Counseling Services to their services. Since opening on 03/07/2005, Brevard Health Alliance has registered more than 43,000 patients and provided more than 179,000 medical encounters. More than 117,000 of these encounters involved patients without insurance.



# 5 Questions With Robert Deuterman of Deuterman Productions

After bringing a successful entertainment lineups to this year's Melbourne Main Street Fall Art Festival, Robert Deuterman sits down with *Brevard Live Magazine* to share his wisdom.

#### Brevard Live: How did Deuterman Productions come to be?

RD: I had owned Goombays restaurant and had increased the amount of music that we had there. I was interested in the combination of music and alcohol sales, tried to make it a party atmosphere. From there I opened The Chili Pepper Supper Club in Cocoa Beach. It became mainly a music venue even though we also had food. I took some big chances on national bands like the English Beat. Suddenly booking agents started recognizing me and calling. I launched Deuterman Productions, bringing bands of all genres into different venues across Brevard; Levelz Nightclub, Sports Page, etc. I booked the entertainment for this year's Melbourne Main Street Art Festival. I am the number one talent buyer in Brevard County right now, if I'm not mistaken.

#### Brevard Live: How is Brevard looked at by booking agents?

RD: Brevard is a secondary market. Actually, there's seven markets in Florida; Orlando, Jax, Tampa, Miami, Daytona Beach, the Panhandle and us. There's been a couple of times that the bigger places like Hard Rock Live and continued page 35

House of Blues have shut me out. I was trying to bring in The Deftones and they made it so Orlando was the only Central Florida date they were going to do. Venues know that there's a couple of hundred kids from the beaches that aren't going to travel to Orlando to see a show if I can book one here.

#### Brevard Live: Has booking a wide variety of music styles (Dead Kennedys, Diddy, etc) been very deliberate?

RD: Yes and No. Brevard has an older demographic. A lot of people here like the 80's. We brought Modern English to the Art Festival for that reason. Also old school punk. The surfers and skaters are grown up now. They're an older demographic working at places like Harris. I book shows during the week. We can't afford to book on the weekends; costs too much. I try to bring a wide range of shows to different venues across the county to cater to those demographics.

#### Brevard Live: How do local bands get on the bill?

RD: First of the all the agent has to approve that a local band gets to play. I'll try to convince them to have a local band open. Then the band has to get their name out there. They have to sell tickets on their own. It's the headliner's show; they're going to make all the money. But the exposure for a local band in opening helps them get

RD: I'm a workhorse. This is my company, my name. It's me selling me. My passion. It was so enjoyable to see everyone at the Art Festival, the bands, the crowd, the city officials, all with smiles on their faces. That is my dream situation. Seeing everybody fulfilled. It's very satisfying.

Members of the Strawbridge Art League were so enthusiastic about the little street show and its concept of education that they volunteered to host the show. Under the auspices of SAL, the show was extended to a two-day event of fine arts featuring the work of local artists.

That is ArtWorks! Two days of showing the public how artists work in their medium. Great music and food come along with the package. ArtWorks utilizes the talents of local musicians (including local high school ensembles) and local food vendors.



On Thanksgiving Weekend in Cocoa Beach: Space Coast Art Festival

The Space Coast Art Festival, now in its 48th year, is held annually Thanksgiving weekend in downtown Cocoa Beach. The festival features 250 selected artists displaying work in 10 categories of art and compete for over \$50,000 in cash prize awards.

The festival weekend kicks off with the Turkey Trot, a 5 k road race and ¼ mile youth run held Thanksgiving morning, November 24th . In addition to a sanctioned 5 k road race, the race also features costumed runners and "turkey teams" which carry a 12 pound frozen turkey.

The juried artists will display and sell their work in downtown Cocoa Beach on Saturday, November 26th from 9 am to 5 pm and again on Sunday November 27th from 10 am to 5 pm with the award winners announced on Sunday.

The art festival features a "Young at Art" children's craft and entertainment area with free hands-on crafts, and face painting. Food and drink vendors will be present throughout the show and in the food court located by the festival stage. This year for the first time the festival will feature live music on two stages on Saturday and Sunday and acoustic music in a 3rd music area on Saturday. See the calendar section for details.



# THE ART OF HEATHER EVERETT

#### Artistic Adventures

ArtLab in the Eau Gallie art district, I had no idea what to expect. I have to admit I was pretty nervous. But I was given one of the warmest welcomes I've ever received by Heather Everett, one of the ArtLab's founders. An aspiring artist myself, I have repeatedly found inspiration, connections and even friendship from those artists who call the ArtLab home. That's why this month, I am so excited to get some questions answered by Heather Everett, a local artist who is finding success doing what she loves.

#### BL: Heather, how did you get your big break?

Heather Everett: I have experienced a series of small breaks at regular intervals that have lead to some great highlights, or different kinds of breaks, and those are...

First break was in South Beach, maybe a year after I started painting- my first commission for a large piece 7' by 9'. Exquisite. I was hooked.

For international acceptance my break was when I moved to Paris. I happened to live on the same block as an Atelier, not unlike the ArtLab here. A group of artists who work in the space and have regular shows to exhibit their latest creations. They invited me to paint with them, even though I mostly painted in my apartment on the floor. My first exhibit was in Paris, and I was well received, the fire started there.



For street creds my break was my Chelsea show in NYC at Agora Gallery this past February. To sell a piece to a complete stranger in a high caliber gallery was a life affirming moment. Yep, I'm doing the right thing.

For finding my art family, I think that *Robot Love* was by big break. I met all of the artists that inspire me, and the group that I work with here at the ArtLab. It was a brilliant concept that for me, personally, I am still reaping the benefits.

I knew right away that I was going somewhere, that this was my new direction. It was my first weekend with a neighbor's art bag to play with, and the feeling of amazing myself with what I created by just playing around. My immediate thought was "I must pursue this."

BL: That's fantastic. I've seen how you all kind of feed off of each other here. It is a really positive atmosphere, that should definitely breed success. So what is your definition of success?

Heather Everett: I define success as the "progressive realization of a worthy ideal." In me, this translates as letting people know that whether you are a "schooled" artist or not, art is in you. You were born a creative being. You just need to choose your medium and play. I teach this to elementary aged kids at Indian Harbour Montessori, and I teach it to as many people as I can through classes, workshops, or just a conversation. Also, that art is important, it has always been important. Art is the original language, and sacred, and to be shared.

## BL: From your experiences, what do you think is the best way to find success as an artist?

Heather Everett: Artists can network and get exposure by simply getting out there, to shows and art events and talking to each other. Ask questions, float ideas, get inspired and most importantly, KNOW what it is that you want. THAT, is the key to success.

# BL: What kinds of projects do you have planned for the near future?

Heather Everett: Since opening the EGAD! ArtLab in the Eau

Gallie Arts District, there is AL-WAYS something upcoming, we have a new show every month featuring the 7 ArtLab residents, and a few guest artists. Our November show "Pollen8" is curated by ArtLab resident Maria Storman and will be a collaborative show that pairs floral designers with artists. In December we will feature our "Fancy" show. This fall I will start holding 2 day workshops at the Beachplace Guesthouses (1445 Hwy A1A), drawing and painting in an artists paradise. And "Fingerpainting for Grown-ups" at the ArtLab, of course.

# BL: How can an aspiring artist like myself get on board with some classes?

Heather Everett: Visit me in the ArtLab...I'm there Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays...and of course for all of the shows and Artwalks every First Friday.


