Bella Donna Project Live

The Bella Donna Project is more L than a Stevie Nicks Tribute band, it's an elaborate production starting with the big sound, an involved light system, the costumes, the moves, the choreography, two big screens - and let's not forget the music that requires endles hours of rehearsals. The first time the eight musicians took the stage was at the King Center when they opened for Foghat a year ago. This year they are inviting their fans and friends to a show at the Eau Gallie Civic Center between the holidays. Opening act is the original radio rock band VIBE.

"When you have an 8-piece-band with a lot of gear and special effects, it's not easy to fit all that on a local stage," says Todd Charron. "We never intended to be a bar band, rather a show band for special occasions, festivals, concerts," adds bandmate Max Delli.

Since the Bella Donna Project consists of members of two pretty popular bands, Luna Pearl and Kattyshack, they have a lot of fans in our area but not that many gigs. "We performed at Captain Hiram's back in March and had a fantastic attendance," says Max. The band performed in September at the 1904 Music Hall in Jacksonville and in October at Destination Daytona together with the Pat Travers Band. "Well, that was a long way to drive for the fan base in Brevard, and we were asked when we will perform in our county again."

Fans asked for it, and the Bella Donna Project will deliver. "We thought that the date between the holidays would be good timing. Families are in town and there's not much going on before the New Year's Eve parties," says Stevie Nicks leadsinger Jody Delli. Also, Kattyshack and Luna Pearl will be busy playing NYE parties.

This concert is produced by musicians, and the band members decided to donate a part of the proceeds to Brevard Music Aid Inc, a non-profit organization that helps musicians in need. Doors open at 7 pm, and tickets are available at ticketmaster.com for \$12 (plus fees) during the pre-sale, \$20 at the door. VANESSA COLLIER & KENNY NEAL

Renny Neal, born in New Orleans and raised in Baton Rouge, began playing music at a young age. Learning the basics from his father, singer and Blues harmonica master, Raful Neal, Kenny is known as a modern swampblues and multi-instrumentalist, that draws from the sizzling sounds of his native Louisiana.

Kenny's 2016 release, *Bloodline*, was nominated for a *Grammy* for Best Contemporary Blues Album and also won 2 BMAs (Blues Music Awards); one for Best Contemporary Blues Album and the other for Best Contemporary Male Blues Artist.

After a short hiatus Kenny Neal and his band of Brothers (Darnell Neal on Bass and Fred Neal on Keys) are back on the road and better than ever. Longtime drummer and friend, Bryan Morris has been with the band since 2005. In 2017, Kenny enhanced the band with a horn section.

Kenny Neal will take the stage at Earl's around 4 pm. Earlier master musician and multi-talented blues performer, Vanessa Collier will perform with searing saxophone solos, soulful vocals, and witty lyrics, Vanessa's songwriting takes you through an engaging blend of blues, funk, rock, and soul in an exceptionally entertaining, high-energy performance.

This is going to be a monster show for blues fans.

SEAN CHAMBERS

Plorida born Sean Chambers began his career in the Blues back in 1998 when he toured with the legendary Hubert Sumlin as his guitarist and band leader until 2003. During Sean's tenure with Mr. Sumlin, Britain's own Guitarist magazine named Chambers as "One of the top 50 blues guitarists of the last century." Since those days Sean Chambers has released 5 albums with mostly original music.

On March 17th 2017 Sean Chambers released his newest album entitled Trouble & Whiskey on the American Showplace Music label. Trouble & Whiskey hit #11 on Billboard, reached #7 on the Living Blues Charts during the first week of its release, and was nominated for a Blues Blast Music Award for "Best Blues Rock Album of the Year". The album is produced by Ben Elliott who has recorded classic artists such as Eric Clapton, Keith Richards, Billy Gibbons and Leslie West among others. Trouble & Whiskey features 10 tracks which include 7 new original Sean Chambers compositions, and 3 well chosen covers including "Bullfrog Blues" by Rory Gallagher, 'Cut Off My Right Arm" by Johnny Copeland and "Be Careful With A Fool" by Riley B. King/Joe Bihari.

Bettye LaVette is no mere singer. She is an interpreter of the highest order. Whether the song originated as country, rock, pop, or blues, when she gets through with it, it is pure R&B. She gets inside a song and shapes and twists it to convey all of the emotion that can be wrought from the lyric.

Her career began in 1962, at the age of 16, in Detroit, Michigan. Her first single "My Man - He's a Loving Man", was released on Atlantic Records. She recorded for numerous labels, including Atco, Epic, and Motown, over the course of the 1960s through the 1980s. She also worked alongside Charles "Honi" Coles, and Cab Calloway in the Toni Award winning Broadway musical, *Bubbling Brown Sugar*, in the role of Sweet Georgia Brown.

The 2000's started what she calls her "Fifth Career". Her CD, *A Woman Like Me* won the W.C. Handy Award in 2004 for "Comeback Blues Album of the Year". She was also given a prestigous Pioneer Award by The Rhythm & Blues Foundation.

She recorded 4 CDs for hipster indie label ANTI-Records over the course of 8 years, 2 of which received Grammy nominations.

She has received the Blues Music Award for Best Contemporary Female Blues Singer, and performed a critically acclaimed version of "Love Reign O'er Me" at The Kennedy Center Honors in a tribute to The Who. She then performed "A Change Is Gonna Come" as a duet with Jon Bon Jovi for President elect Barack Obama on HBO's telecast of the kick-off Inaugural Celebratory concert, *We Are One*.

2012 marked her 50th year in show business and she also released her no-holds-barred autobiography, *A Woman Like Me*, co-written with David Ritz. In 2016, her most recent CD, *Worthy*, garnered her a third Grammy nomination. She also received the Blues Music Award for Best Soul Blues Female Artist.

Although still not a household name, fans, critics and artists have nothing but high praise for her live show and her interpretive vocal skill. She is one of very few of her contemporaries who were recording during the birth of soul music in the 1960s and is still creating vital recordings to-day.

These intimate shows allow her voice to be the complete center of attention. They feature Bettye performing songs from throughout her 55 year career, including songs that she used to perform in small Detroit clubs before her 21st Century resurgence began. Many of these songs she does not perform with her full band. Bettye has always said that just a voice and one instrument is all you need to sell a song. Hearing Bettye in this intimate setting, stripped down to just her voice and a piano, is a very intense and moving experience.

When a down-on-his luck wannabe actor arrives in New York City at the end of the year, the only employment he can find is at Macy's department store working in Santaland for the holiday season, as a reluctant, but relentlessly cheerful elf. Newly christened "Crumpet", our clever anti-hero shares his observations of the mayhem in front of and behind the scenes during one chaotic December, from aggressive parents and drunken Santas, to flirtatious actors, poor hygiene, and the racially charged hazards of being a "Pointer Elf." A Rocking Christmas Carol By Heike Clarke

bout decade ago there was a buzz around Atown about a new young band that took over Brevard's stages. They were under-aged, talented, full of positive aspiration, and played classic rock as they did back in the 60s and 70s. Shortly after, they were nominated by their fans for the 5th annual Brevard Live Music Awards - and won the title "Entertainer of The Year 2008". Four years later, in 2012, the guiet and good looking guitar player had broken away from Vintage to pursue his original music with a three-piece power band called ViLiFi. The band entered Brevard Live's first Original Music Series - and WON! By that time Shain was already a featured artist with Classic Album Live performing at The King Center and Hard Rock Live on a regular bases. Brevard Live met up with Shain Allen to visit three spirits: the Ghosts of Christmas Past, Present, and Yet To Come.

It's Tuesday, actually Halloween afternoon, and the meeting place is Pub Americana in Historic Cocoa Village. Shain is punctual and the courteous young gentleman that makes you think that "his parents raised him right." Reflecting back over the past ten years, he has always been a great team player no matter if it was for a performance at the Brevard Live Music Awards or just last year when Brevard Live and Siggy's American Bar had a fundraiser to benefit Brevard Music Aid Inc. No matter how busy this young musician is, he has always made himself available to help a good cause, even if it means driving from North Brevard all the way to Palm Bay for a benefit concert.

The *Ghost of Christmas* **Past** is sitting at our table: "Vintage was a fun band. We knew each other from Edgewood High School; I went to elementary with the twins, Sean and AJ Cummings." Shain picked up the guitar at age 13 and never put it down since. "I have to play all the time," he says, "and I need to write my music too." It was actually his drive to write original music that made him leave Vintage and start his own band. First the group was called ONE "but that name was already taken," and after a few legal warnings Shain changed it to Vilify. "Then we had to change the spelling to ViLiFi, it seems that most good band names are taken."

After playing for the established and well-structured *Classic Album Live*

since he was 17 years old, Shain was now ready to take his original music to the next level with ViLiFi. In 2011 they recorded a CD called *Common Eyes* featuring 13 songs written by Shain Honkonen and recorden by Mark Brasel at *Zone Productions*. It was time to take his music on the road.

The effort lasted about five years and included four road tours that took ViLiFi along the East Coast, all the way to Canada, and back down the West Coast Texas. through Shain's memories of these times are mixed: "Lots of cool and not so cool stuff," he says. "Like the times we changed tires during horrible weather; living and sleeping with eight band members in a van. That was when we traveled together with Breathing Theory. There were freezing cold nights when we could not afford a hotel room. We went without showers for some days and ate a lot of junk food." But in hinesight he says that "this was the most fun time in my life."

At the end of all travels, Shain understood that this wasn't getting him anywhere. "We played some great stages, and a lot of bad ones, sometimes to a few hundred, and other times to a handfull of people," he says. "We needed a good agent to book better gigs. Maybe better management."

Upon the return of their last tour ViLiFi went back into the studio (with Brandon Shattuck of Orlando's Parafonic studios) to record their self-titled second release, eleven original songs

by Shain Honkonen. "Recording time cost money. We got a good deal, worked many hours, I even slept on the couch in the studio to get it done. And we were broke."

"the Along comes manager with money" who wants to take the band to the next level. The band members had discussions about signing contracts, and it was Shain who finally decided to do so. It didn't take long until "we found out that our ideas of taking the band to the next level was different from the manager's. It was a money game. ViLiFi had become about contracts, rights, and not about music." Shain feels uncomfortable with this memory but it's part of his career and a life lesson. ViLiFi disbanded - at least until the contract runs out in spring of 2018.

The *Ghost of Christ-mas Present* has appeared: "I can't complain," says Shain. "I'm a hired gun, playing my guitar, solo or with a a band, about 4 to 5 gigs a week which allows me to have a comfortable life. It lets me do what I love. I never had to go find a regular day job."

Indeed, Shain has a lot going on, for the most part he fills in with bands that want him as a featured guitar player. One of Brevard's favorite classic hard rock band, Funpipe, hires him "whenever he's available," according to Funpipe vocalist Paul Bender. Of course, there is still the Classic Album Live series, a job he's held for eleven years now.

He occasionally plays with Vintage, "we will always be great friends." Shain's agent is his smart phone. "I'll never know when I get the call or text for a gig, and if I have time I will do it."

In his private life Shain is more of a home body. He owns a dozen guitars, 2 or 3 of them he's very fond of, but he wouldn't sell any. He listens to an array of music on his phone, some hip hop, R&B, he likes blues guitarist John Mayer and the band Nothing More. The music he listens to is more agressive, more alternative than what he plays on stage.

In spite of a successful career Shain's take on today's music world is disillusioned. "It's harder to get discovered despite of so many outlets - or maybe because of that," he says. He sees the new technology as good and bad: "Anyone can sing with Auto-Tune, and the computer tracks turn musicians into karaoke players or disc-jockeys." Shain makes it clear that this is not what he wants to do. It's obvious - Shain is "Mister In-Between," content but not happy, free to play but not to be ViLiFied. It feels like meeting Shain on the platform of a train station, waiting for the next train while talking about life lessons learned and more to come. After all, this young 28 year old musician has a lot more tracks to travel.

The Ghost of Christmas Yet To Come has joined our conversation: Are there any intentions of a reunion for ViLiFi? There seems

a sparkle in his eyes and a lighter smile on his face. "We'll see," Shain says. "The bass player lives in Vero, the drummer in Orlando. I probably have to offer them something pretty cool to come together again." There is no doubt, the talk about original music is getting a rise out of Shain. "You know, I have to play guitar and write songs. It's not a choice. It's a drive." He's re-

corded an original album as Shain Allen named "Hope" which includes 7 songs and is available online on i-tunes and spotify. "I haven't promoted it yet," says Shain.

It will be a few more months until the next train will arrive, and Shain Allen will board it together with the *Ghost of Christmas Yet To Come* who is already sitting next to him, giving him "HOPE."



Jumanji: Welcome To The Jungle Released December 20th

Actor Ser'Darius Blain

Interviewed By Charles Knight

As mentioned in this publication in the past, there are many celebrated personalities that have moved to Brevard and its surrounding areas for a variety of reasons. It should also be noted that there are many (and we do mean many) celebrities that are from the Space Coast now residing in New York, Los Angeles, and beyond in order to further their careers in film, music, and other art forms. One such actor is Ser'Darius Blain. Born in North Miami Beach and raised in Melbourne Beach, the young Mr. Blain has a starring role in the new film version of Jumanji: Welcome To The Jungle (Release date is December 20, 2017) along with such notables as Kevin Hart, Jack Black, and Dwayne the Rock Johnson. He has also co-starred in The Game Stands Tall, Star Trek Into Darkness, Footloose, and several other major films and television shows.

How are you?

SB: Great, busy and you know "Busy's good!"

You were born in North Miami Beach and raised in Brevard. We knew each other when we both worked at a popular BBQ restaurant here in the early 2000s. Were you acting at that point?

SB: I was really focusing on a career as a medical doctor at that time.

So when exactly did you get the acting bug?

SB: Well, my girlfriend was into acting and dancing and I would take her to rehearsals and whatever. At one point an actor was late and the director asked me to stand opposite her so they could set the lighting and then to read a line or two, well that happened a few times and soon enough the directors and producers were saying "You're good at this. Maybe you should consider a career as a thespian." Before that I was a pretty shy person. Acting has helped come out of that shell.

Once you became aware of your acting ability did you do any theater work locally?

SB: I did, I did some work at The Melbourne Community Theater on 192 and at my church. I also began to take more of an interest in my mother's work. She taught drama at South West Middle school. I acted there a little and I helped her write a play called Cinderfella 2000. I ended up acting in the play because one of the guys got sick and I knew all the lines.

Well you know that Jerry Lewis acted in Cinderfella in the 60s right? SB: Really? I didn't know that.

Okay so you left Melbourne for New York. When was that?

SB: I moved to the Big Apple in 2007 when I received a scholarship to the New York Conservatory of Dramatic Arts.

Did you do any plays or film work while there?

SB: I was in one play while there but not until I graduated. As students we were not allowed to act while attending because of colliegiate rules.

So, when did you relocate to Los Angeles?

SB: I finished school and remained in NY for a year while working in the Birdland Ballroom and restaurants, saving money to get to L.A.

We know that many actors spend years and even decades awaiting the 'big break'. How long did it take you to get your first principle role?

SB: My manager of five years hooked me up with an agent and I got an audition for *Footloose*. I got the part and that pretty much set things in motion. I had been here for a year I guess, I've been very blessed. In this business it's almost impossible to get a gig if you haven't already had a gig you know? The old "Which came first? The chicken or the egg?"

Yep, we do know actually. One seems to always hear the story of how the major star spent a decade or two as a laborer or bartender before getting a break.

Real quick, who were your main influences? Who really lit the acting fire for you?

SB: Well, once again it was my girlfriend Selina Diaz at the time and then I also had a friend out West that was really into the whole show biz thing and, there was my mother. As far as major stars there was Will Smith, Denzel Washington, Josh Hartnett and James Earl Jones. I always dreamed that I could reach certain heights but never really imagined that I could actually make a living doing this. I've been quite fortunate to have this as a viable source of income. The rest of the list is comprised of a virtually endless list of talents that I admire. Too many to speak of in truth.

Are there any plays or roles that you would love to do?

SB: Well, of course there are plays like Westside Story and a lot of really classic roles that would be like a dream come true but right now I'm happy with the parts I have been getting. Things are definitely looking up.

We spoke a few months ago while hanging out in Orlando before you flew back to L.A. You had mentioned that you were going to interview for a part as a Samuel Jackson's younger self in a war film. How did that go?

SB: It went well, at first they turned me down and then called a day later saying I got the part. We have been shooting in Asia and in the movie Sam is a vet recalling his days in Vietnam. I play his younger character in the war. It's a true story about a medic that was the first man to ever get the Medal of Honor posthumously. It's a great script and hopefully a greater film.

Tell us a bit about Jumanji...

SB: Well, it's not the same movie that was done by Robin Williams. It's almost a sequel but not. Difficult to explain really but a fun film nonetheless. The cinematagraphy is phenominal and I got to work with a lot of real pros. The thing about acting is I get to learn from different great talents on each job. It's really very fufilling.

You play Kevin Hart's alter ego in the film and from what we have seen there aren't any scenes that you play together in. Did you get to hang out with him and the Rock and Jack Black at all?

SB: No, we are one in the same on screen so that didn't happen but we did all do several press junkets and sit downs together. We were also on set when they shot their scenes and vice versa, so as far as chilling together. Yeah, we hung out some. All nice people and total pros.

Well we are looking forward to seeing it.

SB: Glad to hear that, a lot of love went into filming it.

Is there anything you would like to say to your friends in Melbourne?

SB: Sure, thanks for your support, I love my Florida family and friends. See the movies, and support the arts!



ast month Cocoa Village's Riverfront Park was host to the second annual Rootfire Festival. After the success of last years run with only a handful of bands, Rootfire expanded into three days and brought in a wider range of artists including the folky Citizen Cope, and indie rockers Hippocampus. The festival boasted a VIP package with free drinks all weekend, yoga in the mornings, a ton of vendors, two stages, and a discount on your ticket if you rode a bicycle to the event. This year Rootfire also advertised a donation to this year's hurricane victims that included 100 percent of the ticket proceeds.

Just like last year the festival really to focus on reggae and the like, but they did add a few other bands to the line-up to even things out a bit. Big hitters like Shaggy, Michael Franti, and Stephen Marley were among the biggest draw, but others like the Ries Brothers, Jesse Royal, and the Hip Abduction made some pretty fierce appearances. One of the most impressive bands of the weekend was also one of the first...Lawrence. Lawrence is a huge band with like a million people in it, but they are so tight and clean I was amazed. With two stages going there was a nice bounce back and forth between the two. The smaller River Stage was hosted by Michelle Beebs of Beebs, Beebs and Her Money Makers, and now even Beebs Clothing. Beebs got introduce and talk a bit about everyone that played the River Stage and even jumped in for a tune with local favs the New School Dropouts. This was actually a pretty big deal. The very popular NSDropouts used to rule the live music scene before "dropping out" some years ago after the sudden death of one of their members, so to have them back on stage was really nice to see.

Another band from the River Stage that really blew me away was the Ries Brothers. To be honest I'm not quite sure how to describe this band. It's A Wild Wild Life

Trowing up in South Florida and the Everglades in the fifties through the eighties, I've been witness to hundreds if not thousands of wildlife and animals in action. I used to hunt every season. Deer season, turkey season, duck season, you get the gist. I've changed a bit and am more of a conservationist these days, I no longer hunt, at least not to kill. As a youth I was taught to only kill what you need unless you are in danger or under attack. Remember, life was very different back then, we ate more wild game than store bought food. I recall the first time that I ate wild hog meat. It was at a Boy Scout jamboree. To this day I recall it as being one of the most delicious things I had ever tasted.

That's right, I was a Boy Scout but at the time I was still a Cub Scout and the Jamboree was taking place very close to where I lived so we were invited to eat a meal with the troops. A lot of folks don't realize it but wild hogs are not indigenous to Florida. They are invasive and one of the most destructive creatures out there. They are capable of destroying acres of farmland in

short order. Imagine what they can do to a quarter acre yard. A true wild hog has the ability to maim and even kill a man or his pets. Should you encounter one in the wild I suggest you get the hell out of its way.

As luck would have it there is a large hog trap set up in our back yard here in Melbourne as I type this. About a week ago a neighbor told me that he had seen two piglets rooting in his yard and in a vacant property across the street. Where there are piglets there is a sow (mother) nearby. Now we do NOT live in the woods. We are very close to one of Melbourne's busiest thoroughfares and there are literally hundreds of homes and businesses surrounding us. Hell, the Oaks Mall is a leisurely five minute walk from us! Naturally I took his statement with a grain of salt (I thought he might have been mistaken). Well, Lissa and I went to do our show as usual last night and returned home at a little afte r2 am. After entering the house the babysitter immediately asked if we knew there were some wild pigs in the neighborhood. I asked "Why?" Evidently she had been sitting in the back screened patio smoking a cigarette. Our cat was on the porch as well when a pig must have sensed its presence and rammed the kick plate of the patio. The cat went into defensive mode when he and the sitter both made a beeline into the house. I immediately posted that I needed to get my hands on a trap. A close friend made a call and lo and behold I was awakened early this morning and helped unload the large and heavy trap into our back yard. After scouring the fence line we found where the hogs had torn through it and rooted for grubs or whatever. It's the same type of steel fencing seen in millions of yards all over America and beyond. They tore through it as though it were made of paper.

A hog trap is made of very heavy gauge steel and baited with dried corn. It's ready to go and I am hoping to catch them while we are at tonight's show. If we are fortunate enough to capture them all or at least two of them I want to dig a pit and slow cook them underground. That's the best way to do it and well...Yum! If you are not familiar with wildlife or the handling of it, I would suggest that you call a professional trapper or the FWC as there is danger involved. Sometimes a lot of danger. Remember, in Florida there are a LOT of things that will kill you if given the opportunity, and I am not just talking about murderous humans here.

On another note I want to mention a guy in the Everglades that is probably doing more to eradicate the invasive python population than anyone else. Dustin Crum has an eye for snakes. You and I may walk right beside a well hidden non indigenous python that is so well camouflaged that only the best eye can see it from a few feet away. That's not Dustin, he can be driving down one of the hundreds of gravel roads in the Big Cypress swamp and see a glint in the brush. He will stop the truck, jump out and run into the brush and wrestle the culprit into captivity as nonchalantly as you might walk into a fast food restaurant.

He presently holds the record for captures in the Glades and frequently catches snakes in excess of sixteen feet on a regular basis. With his bare hands. You can see him mentioned on the news pretty often these days and he was recently visited by Jack and Ozzy Osbourne along with their film crew. I for one certainly appreciate his efforts to curtail the spread of this seemingly uncontrollable animal. With no natural preditors these snakes can very well be the end of wildlife as we know it in Florida. That's correct, all of Florida and possibly even north of us. These snakes can and will be here soon enough. They can even kill and eat the meanest of wild hogs. That's my Flori-Duh!

Livery year when the holidays are approaching downtown Eau Gallie turns into a Christmas Wonderland with beautiful window murals decorating the individual shops. This tradition has been going back for at least a decade, even before the area became an official art district. Brevard Live Magazine met the artist behind this seasonal decoration and - lo and behold - it's Mike McCloskey who's known for his gigantic murals that cover entire buildings.

For McCloskey this is an annual routine: "I've been painting windows for over 40 years and every year I do holiday window painting in whatever city I've lived in. I owned a company called *Nationwide Window Advertising* that did promotional window painting for Wen-

dy's, McDonald's excetera. We painted most of the major Market areas in the country for Wendy's International all throughout the late 80s and 90s. Every year around the holiday season business would die off completely so I started doing holiday window painting to make up for

the loss of income." When he moved from Virginia Beach to Brevard County in 2004 to be closer to his elderly parents, he brought this idea with him. The first time Mike printed up flyers and went to the individual shops to offer his services. The merchants were interested and Mike had a busy holiday season.

Depending on the design and size a painting can take from an hour to a couple of days. "I usually confer with my client before I begin, and it really depends on what kind of budget they have available." He creates elves, santas, christmas trees, and entire holiday landscapes that have to be finished by December 1st so it can enchant the shoppers until it will be washed off when the holidays are over.

McCloskey's work speaks for itself. You'll see it every time you cross the Melbourne Causeway westbound - the giant snook with a tarpon on the wall of Harry Goode's Outdoor Shop. Mike is one of the few artists that have the experience to do work

that big and that's why he's been working with Mainstreet's mural programs in Eau Gallie as well as Downtown Melbourne.

"I am an artist for hire," says Mike who lives from his art work. To our knowledge he's the only artist who offers these artistic window decorations on a large scale. Some of his clients include Mobility Medical, Long Doggers, Ace Hardware in Eau Gallie as well as many other businesses in the arts district. And if you visited ArtWorks last month you might have seen McCloskey at work along Highland Avenue.

Besides painting Mike has another talent and hobby he offers as a service. He likes to sing and play guitar. While he enjoys occasional jam sessions, he also gets some gigs and plays with local bands.
