ZZ TOP 50th Anniversary Tour

Rock and Roll Hall of Famers ZZ Top are celebrating their 50th year with a massive North American tour which includes a stop at the King Center.

ZZ Top still maintains the most consistently stable lineup in the history of rock music: Billy F Gibbons, Dusty Hill, and Frank Beard. In 1969, BFG formed ZZ Top with drummer Beard and bass-guitarist Hill, both from the Dallas area. Fifteen studio albums, 30 million record sales and 5 decades later, "That Little Ol' Band From Texas" is still going strong, playing timeless hits like "La Grange," "Legs," "Sharp Dressed Man," and "Tush" to audiences the world over.

Billy Gibbons looked back at the history of the band, while also looking forward to the 50th Anniversary tour dates. "It's been five decades, and I think we're starting to get pretty good at all this! The beards, Frank excepted, are perhaps a bit longer, yet nothing else has changed. We're keeping it that way."

Space Coast Music Festival

What if? What if there was an event that brought out dozens of local original bands playing in one place? Instead of driving all over Brevard to seek out new music, you had it all in one place? What if all this entertainment was free and helped support musical education in Brevard schools? You can stop wondering because that is exactly the intent of the resurrected Space Coast Music Festival set to take place Saturday, November 2nd, in the Eau Gallie Arts District.

You may remember the original version of the festival which took place at various locations several years ago. This version is the brain child of Steven Spencer. He is a math teacher by day, champion of local music every other waking minute available to him. He has created a non profit called Harbor City Local. "As I have taken notice of the local music scene (himself the singer for SFG) I had more understanding of how valuable, interesting and important our artists are to the community," he said. The local music scene not only allows for a range of ages and talents to showcase their vision, but also promotes local businesses."

Businesses themselves are stepping up to underwrite the festival. HCL along with non profit Fleagad are spearheading this free event. The monthly Saturday outing will expand to include food trucks, local vendors and a 'musical petting zoo' to allow anyone who has ever wanted to pick an instrument a safe haven to do so. Sponsorships pay for the costs of production, staging, etc. Money raised above

that will continue in the original tradition of the festival. Musical instruments will be purchased with the funds and donated to local schools.

Music, of course, is the main attraction for the festival. All bands performing are based in Brevard and will be playing songs that they have created. "We understand that people want to go out and have a good time and sing along to songs that they know; that's the motivation of cover bands," Spencer explains. "Original entertainment hopefully focuses on dedication to the art and growth as an artist. Brevard has always been a mecca of great musicians."

Headliner: Pat Travers Band

The Pat Travers Band will headline the Space Coast Music Festival. Travers, a rock and roll legend, is joined by Brevard residents Tommy Craig on drums and David Pastorius on bass. The band frequently plays all over the country and has shared stages with fellow legends Deep Purple and Ace Frehley in this year alone. Joining Travers at the festival will be local heavyweights The Spring, Zeddemore and Gary Lazer Eyes. The talent doesn't just stop there. Up and coming bands include Hott Mess, Slackadaisicals, The Belly Sleepers and Waterline 42 just to the name a few. Brand new bands The Devil's Due (featuring ex members of Super Swamper) and Whisper to A Riot (ex The Contenders) are also slated to perform on various stages throughout the day.

"As an educator, the charity aspect of this festival is very important to me," Spencer said. "Harbor City Local is dedicated to original music." The non profit has released two compilations of music for sale online and at local shows. Titled *Vol 1* and *Vol 2*, it brings together 41 bands based in the area and many of which will be performing at the festival.

"We only grow through a combination of providing successful strategy for our youth, building up small local business and helping corporate business to connect with the community," Spencer explains. "I have big plans toward vocational education awareness with HCL. This is done in conjunction with the community aspect of the non profit as well as the continuation of building local original music. I really believe we can attain successful goals in the music business with recording and shows in the area."

The only missing link in this worthwhile event is you. Will you go? Will you support not only the music scene but the community as a whole? Great food, great drink, great vendors and a chance to pick up a drum at the musical petting zoo and make noise! The festival has seen success in the past and this event can not only pay homage to that but grow into a yearly event itself..

Meet Gillian Carter

The Brevard original music scene is strong right now. The amount of talented bands and available venues is at, what seems to be, an all time high. One local band that has lasted through all of this is Palm Bay based band Gillian Carter. Led by guitarist/singer Logan Rivera, the band's history dates all the way back before a lot of their fans knew about heavy music at all.

"Well back in 2005, I was listening to a band called Allegory of the Cave from Orlando", Rivera explains, In their popular song I thought I heard the main vocalist scream "Jillian Carter". I thought to myself 'that's sweet, bands with people names are tight like Neil Perry, Doris Delay, etc'. We formed, and later on when we played a show with that band they asked where we got the name. I told them 'your song' to which they replied 'we don't say that in any of our songs'. (*laughs*) I was like 'oh...'. It was too late to change the *MySpace* url so almost 14 years later, here we are!"

It's true. Gillian Carter first started writing songs and playing shows before most fans these days even knew of the scene. Before Bieber and Drake, there was Rivera and musician Cameron Hade Smith. "Me and him got together on my 15th birthday after listening to some Neil Perry," he

continues. "We started jamming together as a 2 piece, then our friend Keith joined on bass one day out of boredom. We played together for a bit till they both quit the day of a show. I performed solo and met Jesse Hardy, who played bass. From there we formed a bond and would meet Steve Pristas (drums) and the rest is history. Unless you want me to keep going." (laughs)

Keep going is exactly what Gillian Carter does. "Over the years we've had 15 drummers, 7 bassists and 4 rhythm guitarists. The current line up consists of Rivera on lead guitar and vocals, bassist Robert Caruso and alternating drummers Jesse T Lieurance and Kyle Shepard. "I would describe our music as progressive yelling music," says Rivera. He and the numerous versions of the band have been traveling outside of Brevard for the better part of 12 years. "Our first tour was in the summer of 2007. It was 30 dates spread out over two months," he explains. "Out of those booked dates we played 15 shows. We got stuck in Atlanta for a week. We drove up to Vermont only to find out the show was cancelled." The tour also taught Rivera and crew what not to do for the future. "We didn't book any shows on the way back home from Massachusetts because we didn't know you were supposed to do that," he continues. "Every emotion that can happen to a person happened to all of us at least six times. I didn't play music after that for three years, but I wouldn't trade that experience for anything."

You can find videos online as well as songs from their 10 music releases to rock out to. Their music utilizes dynamics, emotion and heart all within the same song. "Visionless/This Rotting Vessel Appears" from their most recent release *Audiotree Live* is a remarkable example. The cinematography alone is worth the watch. "We've been wanting to do *Audiotree live* for 8 years now," Rivera explains about the Chicago video show. "Our record label was able to help us out and we found out two days before we did the session. It was an amazing experience and we hope to do more in the future."

Over the years the band has done their own inspiring. Michael Rosado, a local musician himself (Sea Of Surrender, Wind Words), is a big fan. "Dude, I was literally listening to their stuff on the way home today," he says when asked for a comment. "Seriously one of the hardest working bands, kindest dudes and talented artists I've had the privilege to work with and alongside. Rosado also splits his time promoting local shows where the band has played. "I'm so stoked for these guys and the art they put out. Passion and authenticity with a dash of heavy and dark atmospheric yet hopeful and celebratory energy are a few words I would use to describe a Gillian Carter live show. Seeing their consistency and determination in our music community and the influence their years together

55TH SPACE COAST ART FESTIVAL

The longest running juried fine art show in Brevard is the Space Coast Art Festival, now in its 55th year. After a few years of moving around the event has found a new location that has plenty of room for the fine art show, the student art show, a stage for some quality entertainment on both days, a kids world, a food and vendor village, and last not least plenty of parking. While the admission is free the parking will cost you a \$5 fee. This new location is the Space Coast Daily Park in Viera and easy to reach via I-95.

The SCAF has an long history. In 1963, a small group of artists and local community leaders, formed the first 'Cocoa Beach Sidewalk Art Show'. Sponsored by the City of Cocoa Beach



and supported by the Cocoa Beach Woman's Club, the art show thrived for several years.

For the first 50 years of its existence, the Space Coast Art Festival was located in downtown Cocoa Beach. In 2014 the show relocated to Port Canaveral due to construction in downtown Cocoa Beach. After two years the Port withdrew their invitation due to cruise traffic and parking issues and the City of Cape Canaveral offered to host the show at Manatee Sanctuary Park. Due to limited parking availability a new date and location was chosen.

Like a phoenix from the ashes, this traditional two-day-event seems to rise to new heights, not just with a generous layout but also with some quality entertainment during both days. On Saturday, October 19th Anja and The Band will take the stage from 11 am to 1 pm, followed by one of Brevard's most popular bands, Hot Pink, from 2 to 4 pm. The following day, Sunday, the 20th, Fes Up! will perform from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm. Then at 1 pm Brevard's most impressive songbird Sybil Gage will perform her New Orleans style jazz and blues. The stage is located right next to the kids world and the food court.

The festival is open on Saturday from 9 am to 5 pm, and Sunday from 10 am to 4 pm. For more information visit *www.spacecoastartfestival.com*. A directory will be available on premises and offers a guide for the festival ground and a program.

has afforded them, I can only feel a sense of pride to know they represent our scene here in Central Florida."

Rivera pauses to reflect when asked if this is the music career he had imagined when he started out as a teenager. "Nope," he answers. "This band started in 2005 when I saw a local band called Beneath Low Flying Planes and was instantly inspired to do what they did. I didn't even think the band (Gillian Carter) would last more than a year or two. If I knew the band would have been around almost 14 years, I definitely would have called it something different."




collection. The film stars many Florida residents including MIFF regulars: Michael Baumgarten, Eddie Craig and Jim Horning.

Lights Out Project Reverse The System

I am truly blessed to listen to and review some very talented musicians and artists. Every once in awhile a CD comes my way and raises the bar. *Reverse The System* by Lights Out Project not only raises the bar but launches it into the stratosphere! This is Lights Out Project's debut CD. It's crushing. Absolutely flawless!

Lights Out Project is Jason Noon (lead vocals, guitar, ukulele, turntables), Jorge Ramos (Sax, vocals), Corbin Nappi (drums, vocals), Jake Salter (lead guitar, vocals), John Hulland (bass guitar), and Dave Hoag (keyboards). There are a host of other contributing featured artists. The bio on their web page describes the band aptly. Psychedelic island-fusion jam band. They hail from the barrier islands of Florida's east coast. "Urban rhythms, world music and conscious lyrics in an attempt to elevate the listener to a higher vibration". A quote from their bio certainly has elevated this listener!

Reverse The System was recorded at Garden House Studios and Studio 101. Mixed by Jason Noon and mastered by Mike Couzzi Mastering.

Let's get to the tunes! This CD starts right out of the gate strong and continues with 12 great tunes. I was hooked from the very first song "Get Up and Go". Check out how the tune changes gears and downshifts at 01:57 then again back to the main vibe only slower at 02:27. At 04:11 there is a nice vocal/instrument exchange. Sweet guitar playing throughout. Track 3 "Pakalolo" may be my favorite. I'll let you guys look up the definition of pakalolo. Smooth guitar intro and ukulele playing. Love the interplay between the vocals and instruments from 02:03 to 02:42. The lyrics are well written and like all the tunes on this CD, tell a story. The fade outro has some cool stuff going on. I'm amazed at the mix and production throughout. Song four "Rock Out" is laden with guitar tone to die for. So subtle and pure. Listen to it at the 00:17 mark and at 01:02 through 01:32. "Time Fly" manages to capture many musical genres all in one tune and successfully so. Cool MoTown intro and again at 01:52 leading into a killer sax solo. Top notch lyrical content and song writing. Some nice turntable stuff in the background.

The title track "Reverse The System" personifies what a great CD this is. Awesome guitar, bongo, keyboard intro until 00:46 where horns and more guitar come into play. A great progression at 01:10. Every song on this CD is killer. There are NO bad tunes! Every time I listen I hear something new, some vocal nuance or instrumental thing going on in the background. That rarely happens for me.

In conclusion, Lights Out Project's *Reverse The System* is in itself a musical journey. A tour de force. All the musicians and contributing artists here are very talented. I must apologize for not listing them all here. There is so much going on but the songs are never crowded and nothing is over the top. This is songwriting at its best. The mix and producing is clean and clear. This is truly as good as anything out there currently folks! You need this in your collection!

When you drive along the beaches on A1A, one unique building will definitely catch your eyes. The odd shape, the intense colors - you get the feeling that this is not your usual beach restaurant, and you are correct. Goombay's Beachside is a venue featuring an expansive (not expensive) menu using only the freshest ingredients with a Caribbean-American flair. They serve local seafood, bowls, wings, tacos, burgers, salads, wraps, appetizers and big entrees. They have a lot of entertainment, a big patio, happy hour, beer, wine and tropical drinks. Goombay's is a place where locals and tourists alike feel at home - instantly. Friendly staff, casual atmosphere, and yes, you can walk in with t-shirt, shorts and flip flops, and that's just cool.

I am meeting with the new owner, Mary Casamento, who bought Goombay's about a year ago. Well, that was not recently but considering that this building has been around for decades, Mary is fairly new. It is Tuesday afternoon - and you know what that means - TACO TUESDAY!! Goombay's is known for its delicious fish tacos and I am really looking forward to having some (not my first visit, by the way). There are several choices: chicken, mahi, shrimp, steak, raw seared tuna or veggie. Would you like that with pineapple mango salso or sweet corn cheese salsa? Mild or hot - with or without sriracha? And then there are signature sauces: citrus teriyaki, creamy cucumber, tarter, honey mustard, BBQ, Kin;s wing sauce, buffalo, spicy remoulade, spicy apricot, horseradish. It's mind-blowing, well, at least for people who have a hard time making up their minds.

Mary and her husband of 17 years Albert moved from Orlando to Satellite Beach in 2017. "From the very beginning we were regulars at Goombay's," she recalls. "It was love at first sight." Mary is not new to the hospitality business, she owned a Southwestern restaurant in Maryland for almost 20 years. Then she joined the corporate world working first as customer service agent, then as regional manager for different airlines. She laughs, "I like to travel, have seen a lot, and tasted a lot of different food." When Goombay's went up for sale, it was a no brainer. They cleaned up the place, and while Mary is the creative and business part, Albert is doing all the repair and remodeling work. "We are a great team," they both agree. Last month they closed on Mondays to finish the painting, upgraded the kitchen and got new freezers. Any more plans? "Yes, the next step is to get a liquor license."

Mary is proud of the restaurant, the food and their staff. Together with about 20 employees they have achieved a great venue that has now become a favorite place for many patrons who enjoy the atmosphere, live music 5 days a week, and the fresh seafood that is served here. "We have the best shrimp," says Mary, and points out her husband's favorite meal called "Al's Cajun Angels" - three jumbo Argentine Red shrimp wrapped in bacon, dry-rubbed with Cajun seasoning and grilled.

As for myself - I'm ordering what I always order when viting Goombay's: 2 shrimp tacos, blackened, with pineapple mango salsa. So delicious! So next time you drive down A1A in Satellite Beach, stop in for a relaxing time and their Caribbean inspired food. www.goombaysbeachside.com

How STRESS is driving us back in time

Tow many times have you heard someone say "the ■ stress is killing me?" Well, we have all been in an unauthorized study over the last 5 decade, and the results are in. Stress is not only killing us but it is devolving the human condition. We all know by now that stress increases our chances of getting colds and flu. Stress lowers the immune system - that's a fact. It plays a huge roll in heart disease via the increase of our stress hormone Cortisol. Cortisol is also the hormone that helps us put on weight and adversely effects sleep and mood. And if that was all, it would be enough to scare the hell out of us. But, we now know that prolonged stress or trauma is associated with decreased volume in areas of the human brain responsible for regulating thoughts and feelings, enhancing self-control, and creating new memories. So, that's bad but what is happening in other areas of the brain due to stress is even worse. We now have seen that the "Limbic" part of the brain – let's call it the primitive part – is getting stronger! This is the EAT – FIGHT – SCREW part of the brain. The survival part of the brain. And this is a very frighting combination for modern life.

Ask yourself why we are more at odds with each other these days? Why we are so divided, unable to understand others and seem to just be able to get through the day and have little time to think about anything else? Why we bought every gallon of gas 6 days before we knew where the storm was going. We are losing the mental ability to reason. To think things through. To even attempt to understand complex issues. We know from studies that as you become better in some skills, that side of the brain that controls those skills will get bigger and the other side will get smaller. Which is a trade off for something we chose to learn or do. This is not that! As we stay under constant stress, we make the primitive part bigger cause we are using it more, and at the same time we damage and reduce the very part that has brought us to this point in history. Reasoning and understanding things drove us to band together and work towards a common goal. That is the only reason we have any civil society in the first place. Understanding that a person can only do so much but, together we can build bigger, live better and have more. Not too hard to understand right? From impulsive behavior up

to strapping on a AK47 – we are seeing the effects of this everywhere in life today.

There are many reasons why this damage and its mechanisms are changing us. For one, survival instinct is a personal one. IT turns us inward, focusing our attention on the self only. You see this all the time. The "I can't think about "THAT" -I have to get take care of me first". It drives a short term solution mindset with no long tern reasoning about the possible outcomes of the actions.

Another one is the loss of ability to remember and recall "lessons" and past results of poor decisions. A 2012 study found that chronic stress has a negative impact on what is known as spatial memory, or the ability to recall information. A 2014 study revealed that high levels of the stress hormone cortisol were connected to short-term memory declining and stress has been shown to impede memory retrieval. And it is important to note that we are not taking about just being in a hostage situation or sexual abuse, the cumulative effects of nonstop stress are having the same negative effects on our minds.

SO, why so stressed? There has never been a time in modern history that people did not need money or a place to live. These things have been here all along. Age to age, we have had to face these things. What has not been with us all along is the glut of information and impact from massive input. The 24-7-365 media. Showing you the worse of humanity, telling what to be scared of and who to blame. Recent studies are showing that the modern mind has not caught up with this. We have little historic ability to separate what is happening to others and what is happening to us. This is not new. In the 80s, when mass media coverage began on missing children, we changed the whole way we parented. Keeping our children inside more and promoting the idea that every child was in danger. After the JonBenét Ramsey murder, 35% of children beauty pageants disappeared. Terrorist activity drove us to change more and effected the way we did everything. Even though these things happened to less then 1% of the population. It's not the horrid things that is the problem – it's the way we process the information. Personalizing it, making it a priority and allowing it to effect our day to day lives. Today we can spend 24 hours a day watching horrible things online and many people do. There is nothing wrong with being well informed, there is a problem with all of it making our lives smaller and keeping us scared. These types of stress are just now yielding wildly dangerous results. And we have no historic data to understand where it will lead or how to stop it. Yet, all around us, it is changing us, our minds and the way our brains work! Only one thing is certain, admitting a problem is the first step towards changing it. We need a return to reason and understanding.



More recently, Jay began a new venture, working with a company that goes into bars every week to host themed games. "We were doing a lot of trivia nights," he says. "Then it seems everyone was doing it. I still have a long running gig in Cocoa Village. We just started to add more than trivia, a couple of different variations of Bingo."

The versions include "Dirty" Bingo and a take off of the game *Name that Tune*. "I'll host the night and play 30 second clips of songs," he explains. "We won't tell them what it is. If you know it and you have it on your Bingo card, you mark it. People seem to really like it." The concept works well for Duncan, the night owl. "I get to interact with the crowd, improv a lot," he says. "It's almost like welcomed, interactive heckling, (*laughs*)." He books comedy sets, both here and out of state. "I still enjoy performing comedy." When asked what the future of comedy in Brevard looks like to him, he replies, "it really will be determined by the interest of local audiences."

He must be doing something right. Jay has been involved with the teaching of comedy for the last couple of years. Students can sign up for an 8-week-course. Curriculum consists of comedy writing, public speaking, stage etiquette, to name a few. He admits that he didn't think he would enjoy teaching at first, but has since grown into the role. Graduates like Christopher Robinson can find themselves on stage in large part to Duncan Jay. "He was actually the first one to let me feature a show and do 45 minutes," says Robinson who started performing in late 2017. "Duncan is the godfather of the Brevard comedy scene. He built our comedy community from scratch." Taking his course wasn't all about fame and fortune. "He told me you learn more when you bomb one time than you do in a 100 good outings. He taught me to never run from a challenge, that it will make you a stronger comic."

Jay has seen his fair share of success and seen his peers succeed as well. Area comic and good friend Preacher Lawson moved on to appear and almost win TV's *America's Got Talent*. "He is great and an awesome dude as well," he said. Jay does have a love/hate relationship with the talent competitions, stating that they're "glorified popularity contests."

Duncan Jay has come a long way from hist first comedy show at the Dog N Bone in Cocoa Village. He may change it up - stage comic, host and teacher - but he always believes in this area. Helping to popularize the #BrevCo, he finds value in the marketing and the talent that resides here. "A friend came up with that," he states. "She wanted to change it but I was convinced that was the perfect name for this area. Plans are in the works to use it for apparel and future marketing purposes. When asked if he thinks that he is a renaissance man, he replies, "I'd like to think so."


