"Weird Al" Yankovic

Almost four years after his first foray into unfamiliar concert territory with his highly-acclaimed *Ridiculously Self-Indulgent, Ill-Advised Vanity Tour*, "Weird Al" Yankovic is pressing his luck again, this time with The *Unfortunate Return of the Ridiculously Self-Indulgent, Ill-Advised Vanity Tour*. The tour marks Weird Al's long-anticipated return to the concert stage after his hugely successful *Strings Attached Tour* in 2019 where he performed each night alongside a full symphony orchestra.

Once again drawing from his back catalogue of 14 studio albums, Weird Al promises to deliver a different set list every night, with no two shows the same. As before, rather than focusing on the hits from his career, the show will feature Yankovic's non-parody material – the somewhat more obscure pastiches and original songs that have largely escaped the pop culture radar but are adored by his long-time fans. And like the last Vanity Tour, he is leaving behind the high-octane theatrics that he's known for and going bare-bones – no costumes, no props, no video screens... just Al and his band of almost four decades in smaller, more intimate venues, hanging out on stage, playing music.

"Weird Al" Yankovic is the biggest-selling comedy recording artist of all time. A five-time Grammy winner, his 2014 release *Mandatory Fun* was the first comedy album in history to debut at #1 on Billboard's Top 200. He

is one of only five artists to have had Top 40 singles in each of the last four decades, the other four being Michael Jackson, Madonna, U2, and Kenny G. On August 27, 2018 the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce awarded Weird Al with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

The Melbourne Biergarten opened L its doors about a year ago offering a German menu, lots of German Beer and daily entertainment and bands. With the first batch of Oktoberfestbeer on the way, owners Chip and Chad want to celebrate an Oktoberfest in Downtown Melbourne. "We will have an outside stage and different vendors," says Chip. At press time there had to be some details worked out but the music line-up for the day was available. Besides popular local bands like Murphy's Law, My Remedy, Kome Back Kid, and others, the Oktoberfest will feature two headliners - DL Serios and Trae Pierce & T-Stones (photo). Defined by hard-edged rock mixed with hop and pop fused, TPTS has developed a high-energy live show with a modern feel. Trae is a world-class bassist and four-time Grammy Awardwinner (with the legendary Blind Boys of Alabama) who cut his bass chops as a member of The Ohio Players.

aughtry, one of the most visible and consistent Rock & Roll torchbearers of the 21st Century, has sold over 9 million albums and 16 million singles worldwide as well as selling out concerts across the globe. Their debut album, the self-titled Daughtry, was the top-selling album of 2007, producing 4 Top 20 Platinum-selling singles on the Billboard Hot 100 and became the fastest-selling rock debut album in Soundscan history. It was also nominated for 4 Grammy Awards and won 4 American Music Awards and 7 Billboard Music Awards including Album of the Year. The subsequent albums, Leave This Town (2009), Break The Spell (2011), Baptized (2013) and Cage To Rattle (2018) were all certified Gold and placed in the top 10 in the Billboard Top 200 Albums Chart. In 2020, Daughtry released their newest single, World On Fire, which marked their return to their rock roots and the top of the Rock Charts in the US. The King Center concert features music from the latest album Dearly Beloved which was released in September 2021, plus other songs you know from Daughtry's 5 previous albums.

Chris Daughtry, who finished in fourth place on the fifth season of American Idol in 2006, stated that he would form a new band after turning down Fuel's offer to make him their lead singer. On July 10, 2006, Chris Daughtry had signed with RCA Records and 19 Recordings, which held contracts with fellow American Idol contestants such as Kelly Clarkson and Clay Aiken, among others. Chris Daughtry is a singer-songwriter himself and has collaborated with several other songwriters, such as Live's Ed Kowalczyk, Seether's Shaun Morgan, Goo Goo Dolls's John Rzeznik, Fuel's Carl Bell, 3 Doors Down's Brad Arnold, Matchbox Twenty's Rob Thomas, SR-71's Mitch Allan, Shinedown's Brent Smith, Three Days Grace's Adam Gontier, and the former The Click Five singer Eric Dill, Theory of a Deadman's Tyler Connolly, Lifehouse's Jason Wade and Nickelback's Chad Kroeger.

Daughtry and members of his label held auditions. Ultimately, they chose four members for the band: Jeremy Brady, 21, guitarist (no longer in the band); Josh Steely, 36, lead guitarist; Josh Paul (no longer with the band), 29, bassist who played for Suicidal Tendencies; Joey Barnes, 30, drummer, (no longer with the band). Two of the band members hail from North Carolina – Barnes, whom Chris had known for some time, and Brady, who was introduced to him a month before the audition. Steely and Paul are both from California. The decision was made to name the band

"Daughtry" in order to keep name recognition. In an interview, Chris Daughtry said, "We could have come out with a really obscure name, but coming from a TV show and having name recognition, it was easier just to go with my last name."

The band's self-titled debut album was produced by Howard Benson and was released by *RCA Records* on November 21, 2006. Chris Daughtry wrote and co-wrote all but two songs on the album – "Feels Like Tonight" and "What About Now". Other notable songwriters Dr. Luke and Max Martin contributed to the album, and session drummer Josh Freese played on all tracks. However, at the time the album was recorded, Chris was the only official member of the band, leading some to mistakenly believe that the band Daughtry is his solo career.

Daughtry was an instant success and spawned several hits for the group, starting with its first single "It's Not Over", which debuted on the radio on December 6, 2006, after being delayed from a planned September release and reaching number four on the Billboard Hot 100 and hitting the top 3 in several other charts. Shortly thereafter, Jeremy Brady departed and was replaced with Brian Craddock, 31, from Virginia. In interviews, Chris Daughtry and Craddock have discussed having known each other when Chris Daughtry was still a member of Absent Element.

After the success of "It's Not Over," the second single from the album, "Home" was released and peaked at number five on the Billboard Hot 100, after debuting at number 83, weeks ahead of its official release to radio. The song was also the official "kick-off" song on sixth season of *American Idol*, played after a contestant was voted off the show, also the case during season five of *Australian Idol*. The album's third single, "What I Want", was released to rock radio on April 23, 2007, featuring musician Slash on lead guitars.

In September 2019, Daughtry and RCA, their record label since 2006, decided to split ways. The split was due to contract fulfillment, wanting to part ways. On the split Daughtry said, "We've always been a rock band. And when you're dealing with a major label, there's always that pressure of needing to turn in hits and needing to cater to a certain format, and I didn't want to do that anymore." On August 10, 2020, Daughtry announced that while they are working on a new album, the COVID-19 pandemic halted the band's recording process. It was also rumored Daughtry has signed with *Warner Music Group*. It was later revealed that while Daughtry is now independent, their distribution falls under Warner Music. The band's sixth studio album, *Dearly Beloved*, was released on September 17, 2021.

Laughter Is The Best Medicine

What's so funny? Admittingly, there hasn't been all that much to laugh about in the world today. However, with things looking up (cat memes, anyone?), laughter may be on the rise in Cocoa Village.

When one thinks of The Blind Lion, a small but fierce music club located upstairs from Pub Americana in the heart of the village, stand-up comedy may not be the first thing that comes to mind. "People go there for the musical entertainment," says local musician Jeff Stanton. "When the room fills up, there's a great energy because the audience is actively listening and participating. I've had some really good times there." For comic and recent Space Coast transplant Judd Jones, The Blind Lion could very be exactly what our comedy scene needs.

"In bad times, people flock to church and comedy clubs," Jones muses during a phone interview. A native of Texas, he boldly quit his job, sold his possessions and ventured to a renowned comedy hot bed, New York City, destined to follow his dreams.

He did well. "I was the comic al-

ways willing to be the host," he continues. A host will bring a comic on and off stage, often times telling their own jokes in between sets to keep the show going. Jones' willingness to host when other comics were competing for set times, paid off. Just as hosting became feature sets as such notable NYC clubs as Comic Strip Live, Gotham Comedy Club and Caroline's on Broadway. Covid hit America and the comedy scene, like live entertainment in general, ground to a halt.

Jones and his wife Lisa soon packed their bags for the Sunshine State. For one, Florida didn't have the same restrictions as New York. Our shut down was minor compared to most of the country. Jones felt that he could try to restart his comic career while also having access to the beach.

Factor in Pub Americana. The Cocoa Village eatery quickly became a favorite spot for the Jones'. One day while eating, he noticed The Blind Lion. "I had passed by the stairway and sign a dozen times before I realized what it was," he admitted. "I asked the owner; 'what would you think if we held comedy shows upstairs on Thursday nights?' He only had one question; how much will I have to pay you?'. When I told him that we'd be selling tickets and wouldn't charge him anything, it was a go."


Thus Space Coast Comedy was born. With a club capacity of 44, there doesn't have to be a huge crowd to sell it out, even though they have had to turn people away as of late. At a modest \$10 ticket price(\$15 at the door), it is an affordable way to spend an evening and to forget about life's woes even if temporarily.

Jones' array of talent includes Orlando, regional and local talent such as Duncan Jay, Christopher Robinson and Jimmy Monihan. "All the local talent we've had here have been killers," he beams. One detail that Jones insists on is that SCC have featured comics, not open mics that other comedy spots in the county have been trying to get off of the ground.

"I've always been super into stand up and when I realized anyone can just go up and try it at an open mic I was psyched," says Jake Batman (hilariously, that is his Government name). The aspiring Brevard comic has been both attending and trying to create open mic opportunities in the area as of late. "If any bars or venues of any kind have a stage and a somewhat decent sound system, having a comedy night can draw a huge crowd," he continues. For Jones, he views open mics as a way for the comedy scene to gain crucial experience so that they can, as he did, graduate to the ticketed shows. One of the ideas he has is to offer workshops for aspiring comics like Batman to hone their craft.

Anyway you slice it, Brevard Comedy is on the rise. With multiple venues and options for both the performers and the audience to select, things can only get better. It may be just a matter of time before we see the next big thing online and in movies originate from the comedy clubs like The Blind Lion.



GO BIG AND STAY HOME

Melbourne-based Comedian Christopher Robinson is rapidly rising in comedy circles, but don't expect him to abandon his local roots for the big city.



For an entertainer, the road to recognition begins with quality work - that perfect combination of talent and hustle - a fact that is bearing out for Melbourne comedian Christopher Robinson.

His comedy is welcoming to all audiences, and while there's definitely an important place for snarky, off-putting jokes and personalities, that's not Robinson's style. His foundation of deep confidence and relaxed magnetic energy allows the comedian to traverse a ridiculous range of topics without hesitation, from global travel and terrorist attacks to scandals and race to marriage and pets, completely unfettered. He's sharp and uplifting at the same time.

When Robinson was featured on the Orlando-based television show *Funny Not Famous*, he shared the footage with anyone and everyone. "I started sending that out all over the place. Like literally, I've DMed it to Kevin Hart. Also bookers and lots of podcasts," he said.

He struck gold when the folks at *Comedy Dynamics*, a comedy production and distribution company that among other things produces comedy specials for Netflix and Hulu, took a shine to his work. They offered him a deal to make an audio album, *The 60/40 Rules*

– a title that refers to his African/European DNA split – and it was released earlier this year and bolstered Robinson's portfolio and clout. Now, doors are opening everywhere.

Performers of all kinds tend to feel they've "made it" when they leave their hometown and become stars in the big city, but that's not Robinson's mindset. He'll be in Melbourne for the long haul.

"I'm going to stay because my family on my dad's side is here, and my wife's family is here. And when we have kids, it's going to be a great place to raise them."

The key to maintaining roots in Brevard is a flexible day job – working for his parents' company – that allows him to get his work done but still travel to do comedy.

Family is central to Robinson's journey. "When I was in middle school, my dad took a comedy class. It was a bucket list thing for him, and he did comedy for a year. At the end of the year he did a full hour at Stand Up NY. Even though I was in middle school, I was always a big kid and they were able to get me in. I got to watch him perform and since then I always had it in my head. I was wanting to try it. So eventually I did," said Robinson.

Robinson's father maintained his

connections to the New York comedy scene after moving to Florida, occasionally booking comedians to come down and perform. At the time he owned a restaurant, Island Spice in Palm Bay, where the Groucho's comedy brand had an outpost. The hilarious Will Sylvince is one of the comedians that Robinson Sr. brought down.

Fast forward to 2022, when the younger Robinson was ready to take on the Big Apple, his father shared Sylvince's contact with him. Sylvince included Robinson on a show at the Comedy Cellar, which is a hub for comedy royalty.

But Robinson isn't only performing beyond our borders. He has lots of love for local audiences. In the past year, he has done shows at Blind Lion Jazz and Blues' Space Coast Comedy, Pineapples, Duran Golf Club, Cocoa Beach Fish Camp, Social Distance Bar, Groucho's Comedy at Niki's Rainbow Restaurant, Biergarten, and Gregory's Comedy Club. Whiskey Myers at River Front Park

Anytime I cover a music festival my name and email are put on a list sent out to the managers, publicists, and promoters of the artists on the line-up. Then when it's getting close to concert time, I start getting press releases about artist sets and invitations to go see them and sometimes interview them. Festivals are all about exposure, and I am small cog in that machine.

This year, as Bonnaroo was coming up, I received word from the team of a fairly new, but fierce band that was set to perform called Whiskey Myers. It was an invitation for an onsite interview directly after their show at the festival. Complete disclosure, I had never heard of them, but after reading their press kit I was intrigued and after listening to their music I was hooked. I quickly sent a very professional "hell yes!" and started my research by listening to their album on repeat while I made the 12hour drive to Tennessee. By the time I got there I was a fan. After catching their set, I was an even bigger fan and by the time I sat down to talk with them I knew I was face to face with a group of guys on the rise. This was no flash in the pan band, and next time I talked to them, if there was a next time, it would most likely be backstage at an arena.

You can imagine my surprise and joy to find out that, only a month after speaking with them in Tennessee, they were playing a show right here in Brevard at the River Front Amphitheater in Cocoa Village. I have been very impressed with the caliber of acts I've seen at River Front and this show only went to spur that even further. Earlier this year Whiskey Myers played a sold-out show at Red Rocks in Colorado where they were surprised with four new RIAA Gold and Platinum certifications ahead of their latest album, Tornillo, released July 29th. In all truth and fairness these guys have been selling out 10,000 plus venues all summer. By the way, these guys have been releasing their self-produced albums on their own label, Wiggy Thump Records. Their 5th album, Whiskey Myers, debuted at number 1 on both the country and American/ Folk charts, number 2 on the Rock chart and number 6 on the all-genre Billboard 200. These guys have already sold over 1.2 million albums and amassed over 1.5 billion streams. What I'm trying to say here is, these guys struck gold right out of the gates and now their music is spreading like wildfire. They are even reaching across media lines. If you watch the show Yellow Stone on the Paramount Network you may have noticed their music all over the sound track. They even made an on-show appearance. Their stuff is also featured in Renee Zellweger's show *What/If*, the Angelina Jolie film *Those Who Wish Me Dead* and the CBS series *Seal Team*.

Let's talk about the show.

I wasn't sure what to expect crowd wise at this one. This band is obviously turning some heads, as referenced above, but I had only recently heard of them, and it was hard to gauge how known they may or may not be in these here parts. It might be slammed from river to stage, or it might be dead with a few seniors hanging out in folding chairs. Well, it was slammed. And when I say crowded, I mean you could barely walk through the park the people were clustered in so tightly. I was pleasantly surprised and felt a twinge of pride both for my town and the band.

When the openers were finished, just as the sun was setting, front man Cody Cannon, lead guitarist John Jeffers, rhythm guitarist Cody Tate, drummer Jeff Hogg, percussionist Tony Kent and bassist Jamey Gleaves took the stage and opened a can of fire on the crowd. Raspy vocals, sing along melodies, wailing guitars... it's all there with these boys. With six albums under their belt already, WM has miles of material to pull from, but the main set list seemed to revolve around their last album and their newest. It makes sense: their last (5th) release could probably be considered their breakout and carried a lot of their fanbase. Whiskey Myers is well known for their live shows. The energy they produce on stage could power a small city. Writers love to use the term "electrifying" when speaking about a great live band and artists like this are exactly why. They truly lit up the night giving it their all like it was their last night on stage... and they do that every night.

WM doesn't hold back with their material either. Tackling subjects from getting drunk to ex-girlfriends hooked on meth, Cody Cannon takes from his personal experiences and tells it like it is. Song titles like "Die Rockin'," "Bury My Bones" and "Bitch" give a clue to how to-the-point their music really is.

Make sure to put this group on your list and check them out. You won't be sorry. Whoever said rock n roll is dead needs to meet Whiskey Myers.





Downtown Melbourne has seen its share of establishments come and go. To know the future, one must respect the past. Without that, you're bound to repeat past mistakes.

Bear Deardoff has worked in Downtown in multiple roles and places and lived to talk about it. In fact, he does more than tell, he ended up buying it along with his dad. The 'it' in question is Foo Bar. The unassuming, iconic 'cocktail lounge' somewhat hidden on the main street strip, has

I'm mostly outside checking IDs and welcoming people inside." The staff consists of people who came in after the ownership change, although with some exceptions.

Shawn, a ruggedly handsome New Englander, was part of the last team of employees before Foo Bar shut down. A scheduling misunderstanding led to his dismissal by the previous owner. Deardoff was more than happy to rehire him and make him lead mixologist.

The new and improved Foo Bar is not short on ideas and events to boost its once tarnished image and to attract new customers. Their grand opening party was inspired by *The Wizard of Oz.* "It's my dad's favorite movie. We had all the characters represented. I dressed up as the Wizard," Bear says with a wide grin. There're plans for more themed events, something that invites patrons' creativity into the mix on a night out on the town.

Local artists are also represented in the decor. Paintings of different sizes and styles compliment the Bar's elegant motif. Bear plans on rotating the art around every few months and encourages the patrons to buy something they like. He also relies on his staff to suggest drink items to the menu. "I listen to what they tell me since they are the ones interacting with our customers most."

As the song title suggests, 'The Future's So Bright, I Gotta Wear Shades' for the Deardoffs and Foo Bar. You can feel the warmth and sincerity just by sitting inside. Whether it is a date night trying to impress someone, or out with your friends, Foo Bar is once again the place to be in Downtown Melbourne and Brevard County as a whole.

Dave Songer handles the bass and sings. He's an alumnus of the Naval School of Music and former member of US Army Band. 

I am now a fan. I declare it here in writing and print for all to see. I am a Yacht Rocker or whatever they call themselves. First mate? Sailor? I don't know. What I do know is that if you ever hear of this band coming anywhere near you, you need to immediately stop what you are doing, cancel any previously made plans and go to them, just go to them. You won't be sorry. To all of you YYR fans out there, I salute you. To the rest of you, it's only a matter of time.

I've mentioned before that air conditioning was a rare commodity in the early to mid 60s so we kids had to find ways to keep cool during the Dog Days of Summer. Unlike the youth of larger, more (ahem) modern cities, folks in Sweetwater and the Everglades didn't have fire hydrants that spurted cool refreshing H20 for the neighborhood kids to romp in. Until the middle of the decade we still drank, bathed in, and cooked with well water. We kids gained in popularity rapidly, and I loved it until I (as the only male child at the time) was saddled with the job of pool maintenance. The allure of that pool faded rapidly for me.

What's a bathing suit?



Rigg's Outpost FISHING REPORT SEPTEMBER FORECAST

Fall weather patterns stimulate fish to move south and southern fish to migrate north. The cooling northern water masses will push south. A whole host of fish will begin touring our coastal region. The bait migrations will get bashed on their way to Sebastian Inlet. In route tarpon, huge jack crevalle and blacktip sharks will ravage our local beach troughs. Millions of finger mullet will enter the inlet and seek safe harbor in our lagoon and northern estuary towards Melbourne putting numerous spotted sea trout, tarpon and jacks right behind Rigg's Outpost.

Rigg's is located in downtown Melbourne on a polite lagoon that leads to the northern estuary. The establishment is the heart and soul of the fishing community! Anthony Marks is here to fulfill your fishing dreams. His team is lead by charter boat Captain Matt Burr. A 30 year veteran of beach charters, offshore, inlet and estuary fishing will put you on these fish.

The estuary is a great place to start. Rigg's has 4 outstanding pontoon boats for rental to quickly engage in chasing these fish. September's best target is spotted sea trout. They love live shrimp and pinfish. Simply book a rental a few days in advance. The 20 footer will comfortably seat 6 people. The 22 footer will take care of 8.

The beach fishing will dramatically improve. If you enjoy throwing top waters and spoons at mackeral and bluefish will be passing thru in schools. Wanna just chunk bait and hold a rod bluefish, drum and blacktip sharks will keep you busy. But theres more! Want to learn everything you catch from the surf? I'm talking pompano, whiting. Drum, sharks and more. Momma B's Charters has been mastering this art for years. Owned and captained by Matt Burr.

Grouper are in season. They are delicious. They have spawned on the beginning of the August moon and more will spawn on the September moon. So they will be super hungry. They will be only one to two miles off the beach. We are talking a few miles from the inlet. So if the weather riles up, you can skee doodle quickly to the inlet. Rigg's will refer the preferred captains and party boats to get on. These fish fight hard and hug the bottom. They range from 10 to 30 pounds.
