





he 2023 Melbourne Independent Filmmakers Festival (MIFF) will celebrate its 25th vear on October 5th to 7th at the Premiere Theaters Oaks 10. Each year, the MIFF showcases fantastic independent films from around the country and the world and, as part of their mission, proudly showcase Florida-produced films. But what sets the MIFF apart is that they raise funds for charity. Over the years, they have raised over \$60,000 dollars to benefit the No Limits Academy, a non-profit private school dedicated to providing innovative education to children with complex physical disabilities.

The film festival's program chairman, Dr. Terrence Cronin, Jr. believes that the MIFF's success is based upon the good will they bring to the film community. "We get fantastic movies submitted to us and the support of celebrities and filmmakers because they know their works will be enjoyed by our enthusiastic audience and it's all for a great cause," Cronin explains.

This year, the theme is THE STARS OF THE SILVER SCREEN (Silver for the 25th anniversary!) Cosplayers rejoice! You can walk the red carpet on Saturday, October 7th as your favorite movie character/celebrity! Do you resemble someone from the movies? Do you have a favorite character you want to represent? Marilyn Monroe, John Wayne, Cary Grant, Grace Kelly? Or do you want to portray "Top Gun" Tom Cruise, Barbie, Paddington Bear, The Dark Knight, Katnisse Everdeen, Elsa from Frozen, Guardians of the Galaxy, Star Wars, John Wick, and more! Expect great photo opportunities thanks to A Cut Above Video, Inc., Turner Talent, and Kim.E. Events.

The number of films submitted to the MIFF remain at an all time high, and the selections was made just last month. The full 2023 MIFF schedule will be available online at the MIFF website and as a pull-out program in the October issue of Brevard Live Magazine. Tickets will be available at the Oaks-10 website and at the theater. Plans are in the works for an opening night party, comedy and musical performances, and, above all, cinematic excellence.

Cindy Walker, long-running and popular karaoke hostess at Lou's Blues. will orchestrate the show as she has done the past years. The contest will run for six weeks with a grand finale. The judges are prominent members of our local music scene. "We have deleted a couple of categories to make it easier for the judges and competitors," says Michael who bought Lou's Blues "five years ago in October," he says. Since then he has improved the menu and hosted events like this karaoke contest. "It certainly has been a rollercoaster ride dealing with the pandemic and the recovery," he admits, "but the show must go on."

Even though Lou's Blues has been known for lots of live bands, the venue has been a destination for karaoke singers every Friday evening with Bob Neal and on Wednesday and Saturday with Cindy Walker. The past years the contest has drawn not only amazing singers, but also an engaged audience that can vote for a "Fan Favorite."

"Lou's Blues is one of the industrie-leaders when it comes to karaoke," says Michael. "We have easily 30-40 singers on a Friday or Saturday evening." You can watch the best of them battle it out on Wednesdays.









Questions w/ singer/songwriter SYD TAYLOR

Singer/songwriter and the leader of the band that shares her name, Syd Taylor, is on a roll. The recently turned 30-year-old had built momentum in our music scene before a near fatal car accident derailed it. Now, she counts her blessings and her original song catalog, as she strives to live her best life. Brevard Live visited with her and asked 5 questions.

Let's start out with some history on starting out in music and what got you here.

ST: I was born here in Melbourne. I grew up in a family of musicians, my father was incredibly musical. He was a drummer, guitarist and pianist. I always clung to my father. My first instrument was violin, then piano. In my teens i started playing guitar. I would sit in my garage and play guitar with the door open, and people in the neighborhood called me "guitar girl". Then my dad took me to my first open mic night and I just loved it. So, I guess my dad got me mostly into music.

My first real solo show was February 6, 2016. It included a costume change, guest artists Jacie Madison and Michael Simpson and a beautiful love song to my grandfather, who was in attendance at the show. 2016 was unfortunately also the year I was in my car accident.

I had become very dependent on substance abuse, mainly alcohol, because of family things going on, and



after I turned 21, I began drinking a lot. One night after a gig, I had been drinking and decided to drive myself home. I did not make it home, however, and thanks to someone who heard the crash, I took a ride in an ambulance to the hospital. This was, of course, after they gave me the emergency tracheotomy because I had smashed my face into my steering wheel. I spent 4 months in a hospital, with a broken jaw, 12 missing teeth, a broken left wrist, a tracheotomy, a collapsed lung, a broken right hip and broken left leg. Then two weeks in a rehab facility.

Everyone in the Brevard County community completely supported me and got me through so much. So many people, too many to name, who just pushed me to want to get back at it. I did get back to it, I began playing gigs and things were going good but I had not beat my alcoholism. About a year ago is when I quit drinking, and let me just say, things are completely different now. Now that I'm not focused on my next drink, I am inspired to be inspired. It took me a long, long, long time to get it, to understand it, but now I'm just ready to make music and spread some positive messages.

Can you tell us more about the new band?

ST: The Syd Taylor Band is myself on lead vocals & keyboard, Nick Frisco on lead guitar, Mike Giordano on Bass, and Michael Simpson on drums. The first thing we did as a band was learn songs that neither myself or the band mates had ever played before. Then we worked really hard on our original songs which is something I had never done before in a band. So yes, it's a new chapter for me to explore my creativity with a group people who are open to trying new things and writing together as well.

What has the highlight been so far on this chapter of your music career?

ST: The highlight of my journey is the connections I have made between myself and the people I make music with. I always have looked up to my musical counterparts. Whether they were playing the local restaurants, bars, open jams, to the headliner stages, I always looked up to them. I knew that I wanted to be a part of that community so I started showing up, and they showed love, inclusion, acceptance. Without the support of the community here in Brevard County, I would have never made it this far. Something that I cherish and remember to push me through the hard times.


What's next?

ST: The next step for the band would be to continue working hard to complete more original songs. Currently we have four original songs. 'Underground' is my oldest song, and I've played it at quite a few gigs. 'Reign' is my second oldest and it's just about not letting anyone reign you in, being you to the fullest. It's one that has been requested for by some fans, which is really cool. The other two songs are fairly new; 'The Start', which is kind of a ballad, storytelling song about resetting your mind and soul, back to the start, before the bad things in the world get ya down. And then 'Steel Heart' is the newest, and it's about my car accident actually, and having a steel heart to overcome adversities. We plan to get more local bookings, and hopefully make it onto the music festival circuit as soon as possible. It is my dream to play local Florida music festivals and share the stage with other incredibly talented musicians.

Anything else you'd like to add?

ST: My friend Billy Chapman, a wonderful local musician, gave me the advice to write it down anytime you have an idea. I've really been trying to hold on to that. If it comes from the heart, and you work really, really hard at it, you should let nothing stop you at all in life. I think we all just need a little more acceptance and understanding these days.

Savvy Vinyl Records and Beachside Retro & Records

Two Record Stores Successfully Run By "Woman Power"

If you look at the box office this past summer, women have dominated. The masses turned out in droves to watch Barbie on the big screen, and to stadiums to enjoy the music and brilliance of Taylor Swift and Beyonce. If the future is truly female, then we can thank the women that have built the foundation. For Brevard County, we have our own business leaders that are holding it down.

The music business and specifically behind the scenes, has been predominantly a man's world. Add to it the brick and motor businesses, and the male to female ownership numbers dwindle even more. For two local record shops, Beachside Retro & Records in Satellite Beach and Savvy Vinyl Records in Melbourne, female ownership is alive and getting better. Both have flourished for the past couple of years surviving the Pandemic and continue to think outside of the box to bring joy for their customers.

Beachside Retro & Records has seen a few locations and owners over the years. Located at 202 Highway A1A, just south of SR 404/Pineda Causeway, they are right across the street from the beach in Skyview Plaza. "I bought the store in October of 2019. Before I bought the store, I was a realtor and I'd never did anything like this," explains owner Josette Tornabene (photo right). "I was out looking for a record, and they were hiring. I thought it would be a fun place to work and saw that it had some really

cool potential. I learned that the current owner was considering selling it, and now I run a record store. It wasn't planned at all. It kinda adopted me."

Savvy Vinyl Records is located at 28 Laurie Street in Melbourne. Owned by Michelle Pessaro (photo left), whose history in the music and cultural scene goes back a long way. Her legendary career in roller derby as a Molly Rogers Girl in part led her to start working for Chris Lanza at Vinyl Request Records. Lanza's passing in 2019 inspired Pessaro to open her own shop later that year initially with a lot of his inventory. The name Savvy Vinyl itself is, in part, an homage to a mentor that taught her so much.


Both shops have a lot in common. Both have shop dogs. At Beachside Retro there is Cowboy Hank, designated President and CEO. At Savvy Vinyl there is, well, Savvy. Savannah makes sure that the Vinyl is protected by taking naps on the shop couch next to the inventory. Both shops offer a wide array of accessories, which is very important to a record shop motif. Stickers, t-shirts and band merch as well as record players themselves are for sale. Pessaro's mantra 'Friends don't let

friends buy suitcase record players' may very well end up being on shop merchandise sometime in the future.

Both shops also run with a small staff. Beachside Retro has a staff of five, whereas Savvy Vinyl primarily keeps it in the family. "My mom is vital!," explains Pessaro. "She helps with the online orders and keeping the boss well fed AKA Savannah. Savvy is the real star of the show, so customers just come for the doggy! It's fun to have shenanigans with Mom in the shop! Also, Nori, our main volunteer is amazing and helps us keep up with organizing. Nori is pretty crafty with her T-shirt and accessory creations!"

Online orders for these stores and brick and mortar record stores in general can offset slower times in person. "Covid actually helped us expand a lot. We ended up building a website and getting out of our comfort zone and tried to sell different things," says Tornabene. Inside the stores both shops have opened their doors to live entertainment. "The comedy shows kinda happened organically," Josette recalls about their weekly Comedy shows hosted by Jimmy Moynihan. "It was really cool. One day my friend Jimmy and I were hanging out at the store. He does comedy in the area, and it just came up that it would be really cool to try to do a comedy show at the record shop. At first, I didn't think anyone would show up or that it wouldn't work out but right from the very first show we did it turned out to be a really fun thing. So now we do comedy shows!" Savvy Vinyl has hosted a numerous of intimate concert events. "We recently hosted a concert with Char Good blasting out some amazing tunes and everyone was dancing!," Pessaro explains. "I had to pinch myself during the show, it felt like a movie; an amazing performance with a fantastic audience. I really look forward to hosting all sorts of future events (Comedy debuts September 16th). The show must go on and we want to support local musicians with a safe and fun environment!"

Both women make a point to state that they are business owners albeit proud women business owners. "I'm big about taking chances and dreaming big," Tornabene proclaims. "Take the leap if you have a good feeling! Woman have great intuitions so trust that good feeling! It's okay to not know everything right away, ask questions and learn thru it, but don't miss out on an opportunity because you feel like you don't know! I didn't know a lot before I started but I've learned a lot on the way and the journey has been a lot of fun. Take the chance! It might all work out," Pessaro adds, "I would say women are a huge, huge part of our customer base. Sure, we are a woman owned and operated business in a field that has previously been dominated by male ownership. We are all people and we treat all with the same level of customer service even if you're a friendly alien."

Now, I am paraphrasing here but maybe it went something like this:







Eric Johnson has been traveling on a prolific odyssey over the course of more than four decades. His creations cross-pollinates genres which include rock, blues, jazz, fusion, soul, folk, new-age. "It really boils down to the music and the song at the end of the day," Johnson explains. "If it doesn't have that, it gets boring for me. The most important thing for me is to grow musically and make a more expansive and meaningful artistic statement with every new project."

During the Pandemic, the Grammy-winning guitarist, vocalist, composer, and multi-instrumentalist has been busy releasing weekly, donation-based, "Mini-Lessons" virtual benefitting Food Banks across the country and working in the studio on previously un-released tracks. The currently untitled new record is scheduled for release later this year. The 2023 Treasure Tour will feature some of the previously un-released gems, some new songs, and some older favorites. His band will include Tom Brechtlein on drums, and Roscoe Beck on bass.

revard has its fair share of Imusical talent and more, yet there are certainly some voids in what gets played by most bands. You can easily find adult contemporary, hair band, alt 90's, British Invasion, soft rock, hard rock, blues, female led dance bands, classic rock... you get the picture. Until earlier this year, you'd hardly ever get a blast of 80's music by the likes of the Cars, Bowie, Thomas Dolby, the Tubes, or Huey Lewis, especially done right. Enter The Short Circuit Band! He gave Dan Garad a call, and Dan became the newest member of The Short Circuit Band. Rehearsals started in late January 2023 and by May 2023 Short Circuit played its first show.

So what can you expect from a Short Circuit show? The short answer (no pun intended... well maybe) is a full 80's show with all the top songs from the likes of Tears for Fears, Prince, Billy Idol, Journey, Bon Jovi and many more including those already mentioned above. You can see where Tom, the keyboard extraordinaire, comes in.

Let's meet the band!

Patrick Wells is on lead vocals and sax. He served in the US Army for twenty years. While in the service, he was the front man for a classic rock band in Stuttgart, Germany, and a 70's and 80's hair metal band in Sierra Vista, Arizona. He has dabbled in composing film music as well as being a background actor. Fun facts: He can be seen on Episode 3 of Season 1 of Gangland Undercover on the History Channel as the father being confronted in a bar by the biker gang leader. He also can be seen on the Doc Holliday episode of Season 1 of Bill O'Reilly's Legends and Lies riding in on a horse to confront the Clanton's about stealing a US Army mule. He's attended classes at Berklee College of Music and Ken Tamplin's Vocal Academy. Inspired by a popular band in the Northern Virginia area called The Legwarmers, Patrick's love of 80's music led him to seek out fellow musicians here in Brevard County also interested in focusing on 80's hits.

Frank Rossi is on drums and vocals. Frank hails from from Rhode Island, but has been in Brevard for the last nine years. He is a Berklee alumnus and has been playing since the age of seven. the Short Circuit Band. Outside of music, he began working in the electrical and alarm industry under Modern Security which he has done for the last 40 years and put his music endeavors on hold for 30+ years before starting the band late last year.

Tom Beier is an accomplished keyboardist and singer originally from Duluth, Minnesota, and has been playing music his whole life. "I started at three years old singing, making up songs on a ukulele, banging on drums, moving onto piano, organ and programming synthesizers. I've always been fascinated by music, bringing a unique approach to the projects I'm called upon to perform on." In SHORT CIRCUIT, he meticulously designs keyboard sounds to be most authentic honoring the original recordings we know and love, enhancing the true live rock band experience for the fans to enjoy! My Flori-duh

This month I am going to tell you about a typical Friday evening on any winter weekend on the Loop road in the Florida Everglades.

School is out for Christmas break and the folks from Miami and other places are heading out to the Everglades to blow of some steam in the last real frontier in Florida. It's somewhere around five in the afternoon when one would begin hearing the tires on the gravel road of the rushing vehicles as they make their way towards Gator Hook or Pinecrest for a beer and maybe even Sullivan's for some BBQ, these were the three main destinations on the Loop road. When accessing the road from the east end, Gator Hook was the first place to stop.

Dad and I would be manning the bar when that old wooden framed screen door slammed shut behind the first of many weekend warriors to enter the place looking for a cold drink and maybe a steak sandwich or something as simple as a Red Smith pickled egg or sausage. If they had kids with them, we had RC colas or Mello Yellow in the coolers as well as Slim Jims and bags of salty potato chips and peanuts. Salty and spicy is good in the bar business as it increases the sale of beverages. The sign over the entrance to Gator Hook went something like this "Welcome to Chief Jack Knight's famous Gator Hook Lodge. No guns or knives allowed inside!" There was a good reason for the last part. People get drunk and do stupid things like argue over incredibly insane subjects. I've seen people fight violently over the name of a dog.

Everyone that lived and worked in the Glades carried a gun and knife, there were almost always shotguns and long rifles in the back windows of pickup trucks, knives were usually sheathed in leather and hung from a belt. It was rare to make a Gladesman remove their knife before entering the bar. Guns on the other hand were strictly forbidden. Shootings happen.

With two pool tables and ten picnic table/benches, a jukebox, small stage and a half dozen barstools, well stocked coolers of beer and wine, and a hot grill to cook on, the joint was ready for a swinging Friday night. A steady stream of city folk would make their way down that dusty road, many of the regulars that return most weekends and several newcomers as well. Oftentimes a newbie would be a bit intimidated by the folks that lived in the swamps. You had to be either pretty tough or pretty smart to survive and thrive in what's actually a difficult place to live. We had a few different species of venomous snakes that were pretty much everywhere you stepped outside. We were surrounded by billions of gallons of fresh and brackish waters that were home to both alligators and crocodiles although I never encountered a croc in Florida until just recently.

You had to be hearty to live there, and the city folk would look at the natives with a touch of curiosity and perhaps a bit of fear. Personally I didn't project an image of the typical Gladesman even though I was one. I was always a longhaired musician type. But I could scrap if I had to. We also had Panthers although they were rare as well. But I digress.

If the kids were tagging along while mom and dad drank and played pool, they often fished in the canal across the road, if it was warm (which almost always was) they might jump into the cool dark water; my cousins, myself, and most of the other swamp kids swam there daily. Yep, there were ALWAYS gators nearby but we NEV-ER fed them and were not a source of food so they stayed away. Snakes? That's another story...Moccasins were everywhere too, and they are one of many reasons to carry a sidearm in the swamps.

As the dark moved in, the band would set up and get ready to play some classic country and Bluegrass for folks to clog and dance to, most had a nice buzz by the time the music started. The kids would usually stay outside dousing themselves in mosquito repellent chugging a stolen beer while roasting hot dogs or marshmallows over and open fire. I was fifteen years old while working behind the bar inside and occassionally running outside to see my friends when I could. Sometimes stealing a beer or two for my friends! Some nights I would play the drums in the band while Irvin Rouse played his fiddle along with my sister Joyce on bass and another old fellow on guitar.

As the night wore on there would be an argument or two and maybe a fist fight that dad would break up. Eventually the crowd would thin out and dad and I would begin cleaning the place and prepping for a wild Saturday in the Big Cypress Swamp. Some folks made the sixty something mile trek to Miami or beyond, some went to hunting camps for the night where they could sit around a fire and continue drinking cold beer or warm moonshine. Note, Old Shmoookie or whatever flavored garbage being marketed as moonshine is NOT real shine! I've had both (many times)and can tell you straight up "the difference is like night and day". Some folks would bring a tent, some even slept in a vehicle. A weekend in the Glades, where there wasn't any law, was always an outrageously fun weekend and we lived it for many years until the National Park Service stole everyone's land and legacy.

That's our Flori-Duh!



Rigg's Outpost FISHING REPORT SEPTEMBER FORECAST

In September Florida fishermen are researching the Leveather patterns. Jetstream patterns are the key to the fishing science. The entire eastern seaboard surf fishing community is on it. High Pressure heat waves will give way to cooler temperatures and stimulate northern migrations. Fortunately I have some advantages with a four state overview from my tackle shop businesses. Surf guides from Delaware thru Northern Florida. Whether it's pompano, bluefish or mackerel I can locate fish. Generally the beginning of each season is decided by tropical storm tracks. These storms traversing northbound will send bodies of colder water south bound. These fish will travel in cooler sea temps. Many times we lose the schools that go to deeper water when huge ground seas are pounding the shorelines. This happens silently and the fish migration may push fish 500 miles in one week. Shoreline piers and offshore commercial fisherman will be the first to find these fish.

Huge schools of bait fish will enter the "Brevard Zone" in September. This storm of fish will attract local and northern sea gulls. When you actually see and experience these fish on their annual journey, you will be amazed.

Bring some mid size spinning rods and drop by Rigg's Outpost for the best advise. Which fish are the easiest to catch. Where to go. What are the best times to go. Which lure and what type of bait to bring. The water quality will dictate which species will be in casting range. Clearer and bluer water will attract the pomps and mackerel. The sandy suspended ocean will provide bluefish, jack crevalle and sharks. Your options change daily.

September snook season opens. A delicious game fish that is heavily regulated. Ranging from 10 to 25lbs an incredible battler. There are strict measurement guidelines that must be followed. Captain Matt is the "Snook Slayer". I'm also a guide and have sent many people his way. When you call him he will advise you if the weather and conditions are right to catch a wide range of fish. The Brevard Estuary and Sebastian Lagoon are amazing bodies of water year round. The charm of massive preserves and bays dotted with small weathered islands is worth a vacation cruise. Rigg's has 8 pontoon boats with bait wells and comfortable chairs. Rigg's owns a Marina area across the street from the shop. Best rates in Florida! Oh you got rods bring it! This area is a bounding in sea trout, snook, snapper and drum. It's a great time to be here.


