Toe Bonamassa is the next generation of blues artists taking the music a step further. His influences do not come from the original masters like Robert Johnson or Muddy Waters. Instead he was intrigued by the Jeff Beck Group, Eric Clapton, John Mayall, Rory Gallagher, Cream - bands that played the European versions of blues. It's not surprising that his popularity went across the borders and his fame is as international as his music.

Bonamassa was born and raised in New Hartford, New York. His parents owned and ran a guitar shop. He is a fourth-generation musician, with a great-grandfather and grandfather who both played trumpet, and a father who plays guitar. Bonamassa credits his parents with fostering an appreciation of music in his life as early as he can remember. He received his first guitar from his father at the age of 4, and by age 7 he was playing Stevie Ray Vaughan and Jimi Hendrix tunes note for note. At the age of 11, during

a short period of being mentored by Danny Gatton, he learned such styles as country and jazz as well as polka. During this time with Gatton, Bonamassa sat in with Gatton's band whenever they played in New York. He first opened for B. B. King at 12 years of age.

He began his career playing guitar in the band Bloodline, which featured the offspring of several famous musicians: Miles Davis, Robby Krieger of The Doors, and Berry Oakley of The Allman Brothers Band. He released his first solo album *A New Day Yesterday* in 2000, and has since released nine more solo studio albums, four live albums and three live DVDs, along with two albums with the band Black Country Communion and one album in collaboration with vocalist Beth Hart.

He tours the world regularly, and has developed a large following in the U.K. especially. His most recent album, *Driving Towards The Daylight*,

reached #2 on the U.K. Top 40 Albums Chart, and he completed an arena tour there in 2012. In 2009 he was the recipient of the *Classic Rock Magazine* "Breakthrough Artist of the Year" award, and *The Guardian* said of him: "the 32-year-old from upstate New York has consolidated a reputation as the pre-eminent blues-rock guitarist of his generation".

He has collaborated with numerous artists, including B.B. King, Eric Clapton, Beth Hart, Paul Rodgers, Leslie West, Jon Lord, Vince Gill, Sandi Thom and Glenn Hughes. He also plays with Hughes in Black Country Communion, along with Jason Bonham and Derek Sherinian.

Joe Bonamassa's music contains a mix of several different genres: although it is primarily blues rock, since relocating to Santorini, Greece in 2009 to record the album *Black Rock*, his music has gained eastern influences, with the addition of instruments such as the bouzouki and clarinet.



### **Pat Travers**

Canadian rock guitarist, keyboardist and singer Pat Travers began his recording career with *Polydor Records* in the mid-1970s. Pat Thrall, Nicko McBrain, Mick Dyche, Tommy Aldridge, Peter "Mars" Cowling, Barry Dunaway, Jerry Riggs, and Carmine Appice are some of the noted musicians who have been members of the Pat Travers Band through the years. Kirk Hammett of Metallica has cited him as one of his favorite guitar players.

Soon after picking up the guitar at age 12, he saw Jimi Hendrix perform in Ottawa. Travers began playing in bands in his teens. In his early 20's Pat Travers moved to London and signed a recording contract with the *Polydor* label. His self-titled debut album was released in 1976, and featured bassist Peter "Mars" Cowling, who would become a mainstay in Travers' band for several years. An appearance on the German TV show Rockpalast in November 1976 was later released on DVD under the title *Hooked On Music*. Between 1977 and 1980 The Pat Travers Band released seven albums. "Snortin' Whiskey" was a major American radio hit from 1980's *Crash and Burn* and Travers began the 1980s as a hot item in the hard rock music scene.

During the late 80s the band had lost its popularity and Travers found himself in 1986 without a record contract and being forced to earn a living once again playing nightclubs and touring constantly. He has not been able to regain the level of commercial success he once had, but he does have a very large and loyal fan base who call themselves "Hammer Heads". He tours regularly in the U.S. and has made several trips to Europe in the last decade as well.

### **Great White**

The Southern California blues-rock band Great White first took a bite out of the rock scene with its eponymous debut album in early 1984. The band immediately toured the UK supporting Whitesnake's *Slide It In* tour and the entire US and Canada opening for Judas Priest's *Defenders of the Faith* tour. *Shot in the Dark* was their follow-up independent release which was reissued by *Capitol Records* that signed the band. After the release of *Shot in the Dark*, Great White hit the road and was on the verge of even bigger success.

The band hit the mainstream in 1987 when they released *Once Bitten...*, which featured the hits "Rock Me" and "Save Your Love". *Once Bitten...* was certified platinum in April 1988.

The band followed up with ... *Twice Shy* in 1989. The album included their biggest hit, "Once Bitten, Twice Shy", a cover of a UK hit single by Ian Hunter. They received a Grammy Award nomination for Best Hard Rock Performance. The album was certified platinum in July 1989 and then double platinum in September of that same year. They finished off the 80s touring in support of ... *Twice Shy* as headliners and with some best known bands, such as Bon Jovi.

In 2012, Great White is made up by Terry Ilous (vocals), Mark Kendall (guitars), Michael Lardie (guitars), Audie Desbrow (drums), and Scott Snyder (bass). *Elation* is the band's 12th studio album. *Elation* thrives on Great White's signature grit and blues-hued sound.

After 30 years of Rock and Roll, Great White keeps it going.

- Trash City Rockers is a rock/punk band based in Merritt Island. The combined efforts of singer/guitarist, Ronny "Ray Gunn" Vatalaro, bassist, Jimmy Ferrell, guitarist Chris Riddle, and drummer Cameron Brintle have resulted in a fast-paced, neo-punk noise that got our attention.

#### December 11th:

- Southern Fried Genocide describes themselves as "truly the BEST Southern Hard Rock Blues show your ears have ever heard & your eyes have ever seen!" Let's check it out.
- The Dull Blades formed in July of 2010 as a garage rock duo hailing from Melbourne. The band consists of Nik Talbot on vocals and guitar and Anthony Fata on drums and organ.



### Christmas With The Celts

Christmas With The Celts brings audiences to their feet with infectious energy, humor, passion, and masterful musicianship. Performing around the world for 15 years, this combination of Irish born and Irish-American musicians perform a combination of fiery Scottish/Irish traditional instrumental tunes and vocal songs as well as their own Beatles/American pop influenced original songs with Celtic instrumentation. Their recent television special, *Christmas With The Celts*, has aired on over ninety PBS stations and associated regional networks.



# Magnolia Fest

at Spirit of the Suwannee Music Park Live Oak, Florida

ike pages taken straight Ifrom a Norse folk tale, a thunder storm delivered from Odin himself unleashed its baptismal rains upon the sleeping inhabitants of Magnolia Fest 2012. Like a christening into the community, water came down with reckless abandon washing away the sins and poisons carried in from the toxic outside world. As the rain passed and day broke on the second day of Mag Fest, an invigorating energy within the festival grounds began to spread with a fervor. This brewing feeling was subsequently ignited by the ferocious Harmonica of Isaac Corbitt emanating throughout the festival grounds in Friday's opening act, The Corbitt Brothers Band.

### **Brevard Live**

The invitation to this perennial event is billed as a fusion of musicians, representing a variety of stylings, spread out over 4 days and on 4 stages. This label provides a cover for one of the great facades found in America. I imagine many people overlook this event as too much music or not enough amenities, but hidden underneath the canopy of cypress and pine along the banks of the Suwannee River exists one of the happiest place on earth. Nobody here tells you how to live, or how to feel- it's strictly people living within the moment and left to their own accord. This freedom equates to an unadulterated joy and happiness of its loyal inhabitants - a transient subculture of festival/music fans who longingly await each gathering hosted like children anticipating the material rewards of the holidays.

Unlike traditional "concerts," people come here with their families creating a collective community. Children aren't herded into sanitized areas for their amusement, they're just as much a part of the audience as anyone else, with hammocks laced throughout the wooded amphitheater grounds, kids of all ages play, watch, or sleep while bands like Grandpa's Cough Medicine or Col. Bruce Hampton play before them. In the open arena of the main-stage meadow, kites are flown and Frisbees are caught between all ages of people while listening to the music of The Mosier Brothers or Honey Island Swamp Band. These interactions within the collective family create a unique experience where the music isn't the focal point, but a piece of the overall puzzle culminating in the 'festival experience.'

Providing the soundtrack for the weekend were musicians who subscribe to the touring lifestyle and live music. Studio albums are made by all, but like the fans who travel and pay to see their favorites, the artists know the true meaning and spirit of their music can only be delivered and experienced

in a live setting. Regardless of stylings, the music is refined in a way that a studio could only wish to produce, with each song reflecting the emotional interaction between the crowd and musicians in that exact time and place.

Gates to the festival grounds open to the public Thursday morning as the volunteers and employees stumble out from their tents and begin to man their posts. It's first-come first-serve for camping as people arrive and begin to carve out their own humble dwellings from the heavily wood grounds. Thursdays truncated music schedule was highlighted this year by singersongwriter Anders Osborne and The Mickey Hart Band (Grateful Dead drummer), who quenched the immediate desire for music that brought the eager travelers to the river. Scheduled as Friday nights feature act was The Chris Robinson Brotherhood, who've successfully blended the blues of the Black Crows (Chris Robinson's other band) with California-psychedelic rock. Having performed together for just over a year, the CRB closed Friday's festivities on a pinnacle created by Chris's vocal talent and Adam Mac-Dougall's sweeping Hammond B3 organ.

Billed as the festivals headliner, Bonnie Raitt occupied the main stage Saturday night for the festival's least talked about performance. A great performer in her own right, however, her crisply formatted show is the antithesis of the seasoned festival performers refreshingly unpolished shows that are craved by the audience. Saturday afternoon events segued perfectly into the evening with the high energy performance of Donna the Buffalo, whose fans also known as "The Herd," gathered in the wooded amphitheater greeting the familiar faces from previous shows. Following Donna on simultaneous stages was the Jimmy Herring Band (guitarist from Widespread Panic) who garnered all the heads for some psychedelic-jazz jammin, and JJ

Grey & MOFRO who dominated not only the main stage but the entire festival grounds with their soulful southern blues. It was Mr. Grey himself who reminded all that were completely submersed in the moment, how powerful the community could be and how irrelevant the distractions of daily life are.

As the late night jam-sessions wrapped up and smoldering campfires filled the air with their earthy scent, the dawning of Sunday morning brought the inescapable feeling of closure and unwilling desire to return to daily life. Early risers could be seen wandering down Shakedown Street for their morning coffee and practicing yoga in the nearby meadow in preparation for one last day within the community. With perfect timing, the "Sacred-Steel" groove of The Lee Boys rang out with their rousing and uplifting sound for all to congregate around, preventing the doldrums of conclusion. Most Magnolia Fest veterans anticipate the loose and interactive feeling that Sundays provide, the remaining artist are often seen mingling with the crowd or gracing the stage for impromptu collaborations with the scheduled performers.

Continuing the closing tradition of Magnolia Festival brought fan favorite Donna The Buffalo to the stage for their second and the final show of the weekend. Having bonds forged and minds purified under the canopy of "the happiest place on earth," the celestial voice of Donna's Tara Nevins delivered the sweet benediction. sending us back to the worlds which we inhabit. Every piece is a part of the whole, no one piece more important than the rest. So stand up, take a number. Every piece here's got some place to go. It's a round ball, and there is love....





# Promotion, promotion, promotion. We can't say it enough!

In this technological day and age, self promotion is much easier than it was twenty or thirty years ago when bands and artists made their own posters and handbills, risked fines, arrest for littering, and even getting into the occasional physical confrontation while peppering every available telephone pole, storefront window, and windshield, in the quest for exposure. In larger cities such as L.A. and New York just finding a surface that isn't already layered with the competitions posters could be a daunting task indeed! Then...There were the 'rippers'. Rippers are the bands and artists that were possibly similar in content or image to your entity that would cruise the streets removing your efforts at self promotion and replacing them with their own. For a comical yet true depiction of Rippers at work, watch the Steel Dragon concert parking lot scene from the film Rock Star.

Posters, handbills, and advertising are still strong tools in the industry but with the internet it's a whole new world. If you're serious about getting venue owners, managers, and booking agents to know who you are, start with the public. These are the folks that frequent the venues and discuss the 'latest thing'.

Naturally, it's of premier importance to have a good quality product. Good songs, professional attitudes, competent players, and even Demos/videos, along with the necessary press kit. Remember...To be successful it helps to look successful.

So, you've done all that and you're ready for action. Good, the most difficult part is behind you! Now it's time to let the world know who you are. There are a number of ways to go about this. Build a web site, make it a good one. The greatest of bands can look amateur by portraying themselves improperly. If you lack the knowledge to build a nice web site, hire a web master. Another old adage rings true here, "It takes money to make money". For two or three hundred bucks you can hire someone to create a really nice

site with all the bells and whistles. They can also help you find a web host that will keep you up and running for a reasonable annual fee. Keep in mind that you will want specific features and the ability to update the site as needed. Learn as much as you can about the process as well.

People hear with their eyes too! It's true. We're not saying that have to be outlandish, but it definitely helps to enlist professional photographers and maybe even biographers in the process. Once your website is up and running, put your web address on everything you do.

Utilizing social media...Sites such as Facebook have revolutionized self promotion as has Youtube, Reverbnation, and more. Yes Virginia, there is a Santa Clause and he's been renamed social media! Some sites like Facebook only allow five thousand 'friends' so you will want to have at least one fan page. You can also develop group pages, and event pages for specific events. All excellent tools so use them as much as possible.

Photos are important, not just pictures of your band but include fan albums, too. Folks love to see and hear about themselves in print as much as you do. Video, YouTube is an excellent medium and if you do it correctly you can even generate additional income by setting up an account. The more videos that you post that people watch, the more ad revenue that can be earned. We know a guitarist that is making in excess of Eight Hundred Dollars a month on YouTube alone by telling people to check out his latest videos via Facebook. Copyrights are guarded and monitored by organizations such as ASCAP and BMI so be forewarned and use your own original music whenever possible. The same goes for Reverbnation.

Network! Let everyone know who and what you are. By constantly posting pictures, creating event pages for pending shows and events, sharing them by inviting as many folks as you possibly can you can create the proverbial buzz. If you get a Five percent turnout on your invites you are doing something right. Take into account that you are an entertainment entity so refrain from posting political and religious beliefs and ideologies on your sites and pages. We have deleted artists and bands for doing just that. The end result? We don't know where they are gigging next unless looking at other sites and periodicals. Not a good thing. Keep in mind, you want to make it as easy as possible for your fans to know where your next show or event is.

### Local Lowdown

Anyone who said the Brevard Original Music scene is a man's world has not been paying attention lately. No longer are there just bands adding the occasional Janis Joplin or Alanis Morrisette covers to raise an eyebrow. There are a roster of female fronted bands and solo artists in this area bringing it to you. Whatever the genre, jazz, folk, soul, metal, we have it.



There's the seasoned veterans of the scene. **Sybil Gage**, a native of New Orleans, opened this year's *Brevard Live Music Awards*. A renaissance woman, she sings, writes, records and even has her own weekly radio show. Gage lives jazz. Gracing the cover of this very magazine in December of last year, she's stood the test of time. Yet she's always ready to help a new-up-and-comer. 2013 is set to take her to new levels; new venues, new fans. Another Brevard Live mainstay is **Simone Star**. Many gigs and many miles on the road with her band the Su-

percats always seem to lead her back to Brevard. A two-time *Favorite Original* band winner, she too electrified at this year's BMAs.

Sheryl Paige may not be as quite the household name as some others who play around town. A high profile set at this year's Space Coast State Fair should help change that. Paige spends as much time behind the scenes as she does on stage. A champion for songwriter's rights find her comuting between Merritt Island and Nashville on a regular basis. She also finds time to chair a local songwriting workshop every month. These talented women have been living the dream for years and offer a good business plan for bands who are looking to make a dent in the scene.



There's also some great female artists who have been flying under the radar this year. Jessica Ottway amazed attendees at the Brevard Live Music Awards. You know you're doing something right when the guy sitting next me at the show starts singing along. Ottway has been racking up numerous acoustic sets at local bars and restaurants this year. One has to wonder what she'd sound like plugged in. Big things have come the way of the four ladies of Sounds of Nebula. Their biggest gig to date was last month's appearance at the Original Music Series. Habor City Music describes them as "A punkier Breeders meets the Velvet Underground." Some high praise for a relatively new band. They are also one of the those bands who can fit into almost any gig scenario. Recent pairings have seen **Sounds of Nebula** share the stage with Simone and Wolfy Lonesome. They more than hold their own in a male donminated genre.



Sygnal is a band started years ago that sounds as fresh as anything on the radio today. Founded by Chuck on guitar and backing vocals and the amazing Key on lead vocals, Sygnal has been making waves. Key comes from a musical family; her mom a classical pianist and dad a bassist. Meeting Chuck at an open jam in 2004, the band had gone through numerous lineup changes before finalizing things this past year. Sygnal are able to seamlessly flow from a classic motown favorite to one of their many original compositions. "Everything starts from somewhere," Key recently said. "I'm thankful that Chuck and I are able to share our souls. Music is therapy."

The Brevard Metal scene has really come into their own this year. One of the main reasons for the genre's success is **Another Life Spared**. **Jennifer Perez** is the co-vocalist of the band. After being "discovered" by the band singing Karoke, she was recruited to join the group. A little over two years later, ALS can credit some big time venues namely House of Blues in Orlando to their resume.

"If anyone gave me shit, I would strangle them, lol", she responds to the question if she gets picked on for being one of the few females in the scene. "I'm metal, I believe as a

"I was dating the bass player from ALS and had become friends with Jennifer," Sushii remembers. "We're best friends now." It's that friendship and the musical aspirations that have launched the band Memento Mori. "We've been a band now for a few months," she says. The band includes keyboardist Greg Bee, and they are currently using a drum machine while in search for a bass player. Citing influences as Jack Off Jill, Kittie and Tool, the band is more than just a novelty act. "This is something that we take very seriously", Sushii comments. Both Sushii and Perez have caught the attention of Java John, the acclaimed radio DJ and artist. "John wanted to expand his model photography,says Sushii. "The three of us have become good friends." While success is part who you know, this young upstart band as well as bands like Another Life Spared are here to stand on their own.

Whatever the genre is, Brevard's female musicians are making an impact. 2012 has been a banner year and 2013 looks to follow suit. # For The Love Of Birds

n animal rescue is an organization designed to rescue and rehabilitate unwanted or injured animals. A very exciting bird rescue project in Melbourne Beach is called M.A.R.S. The Melbourne Avian Rescue Sanctuary (M.A.R.S.) is a 501C3 non-profit public charity and approved facility that offers an alternative to euthanizing unwanted pet birds. They were founded in February 2008 and currently house Amazon Parrots, Cockatoos, Macaws, African Greys, and many more. They also offer boarding for other birds, which they call their "avian friends."

The Executive Director of M.A.R.S., LuAnn Apple, began the rescue because she saw a need for a safe place where neglected birds could go. Apple founded this rescue out of her "love and compassion" for exotic birds. She made it her mission to save the lives of parrots and to find homes for them. "My favorite part of the rescue is being with the happy birds and finding the right families for adoption," says Apple.

They receive "amazing" veterinarian care from the ALOHA Vet clinic in Indian Harbor Beach, thanks to the wonderful veterinarian Dr. Jose Pepen. Apple gets great joy out of seeing people's reactions when interacting with the birds. Apple says the birds are like infants, because they scream when they need something and enjoy attention. "Birds are entertaining and love to be entertained," says Apple.

One of the many goals of M.A.R.S. is to educate the community about the birds. Information is available to all

who are interested about this charity. With a main slogan of "don't shop, adopt," the Melbourne Avian Rescue Sanctuary offers a unique experience to all visitors by allowing them to interact with the birds.


M.A.R.S. offers a great opportunity for volunteering. Volunteers can take part in the daily routines at the rescue, as well as some of the events held there. Apple appreciates all help given to her rescue. One volunteer for the organization, Victoria Stacey, enjoys many of the aspects of being a part of this charity. "My favorite part of being here is seeing the rehabilitation of a bird," says Stacey. "When you make a commitment to the birds, your life will change forever," says Apple. "I really enjoy the rehabilitation process."

Out of all the challenges they face one of the biggest is coming up with funding for the rescue project. Since they do not receive funding from the government, all funding has to come from the contributions of those around them. Apple says that sometimes it feels they are at the bottom of the list to donate to. Although Apple admits that the reward for all the hard work is not monetary, she says the satisfaction in the end makes it all worthwhile. The joy of watching the reactions of people with the birds is also quite rewarding.

The Melbourne Avian Rescue Sanctuary currently has a Facebook page with 3,000 fans and pictures and videos to show the exciting life of the rescue. # Jimmie Van Zant Feels Like Freedom CYA Records LLC JimmieVanZantBand.net

Feels Like Freedom is a big, lush production full of steel guitar, keys, fiddle, harmonica, and some seriously stinging electric guitars. It's a work of epic down home, fist pumping, head bobbing arena rock that transcends the ages. With the sounds, studio work, and pop country twang of the new millennium, 90's rock references and 80's southern boogie party ethos, Jimmie Van Zant has captured all the long haired, rock & roll, blue denim dreams of three generations of guitar rock anthem fans. It's big, it's burly and you can still play it for your momma because she'll relate to it too.

For all its southern determination it's hard not to hear the great arena ghosts of Bruce Springsteen & Bon Jovi smiling from on high over most of Feels Like Freedom. Track 7 "Southern Rock" has Van Zant singing "I thank God for what I got/A Jersey girl who loves her southern rock".

"Sweet Home Alabama" references aside, this record and these tunes bring more Donnie Van Zant & .38 Special to mind than Ronnie Van Zant & Lynyrd Skynyrd. It's slick, it's singalong and it'll make you want to drive the old Chevy down a country road with your best girl beside you. Crank up that title track because yeah, it feels like freedom.

## Billy Lee Beside Myself

The banner headline across the CD insert says it all: "Whatever it is, it's got to be funky".

Billy Lee is one funky dude and the disc's title Beside Myself probably refers to his respect for all the funky friends he's gathered up to make this recording. There are Grammy winners, astronauts, local legends and friends and family making appearances from track to track, start to finish. All the branches of the Brevard County funk family tree (and beyond) are represented. Nearly thirty musicians have leant their talents to this record and they've created a well thought out and cohesive collection. All of the tracks work together to make an 'album' rather than just a collection of songs.

Lee opens with the up-tempo "Shake it Baby" showcasing a backing singer ensemble that sounds so joyously soulful they could've just come off the road with Kirk Franklin. Super-funk bass and red hot guitars bring to mind the kind of good time boogie vibe that put Earth, Wind & Fire on top of the charts and kept them there while Lee encourages us all to, well, shake it baby.

There's great blues moments in the Robert Cray vein and some of the dancing keyboard lines even bring a vintage Dr. John to mind. Track 5 "Driving Me Wild" would be right at home on a Van Morrison record with Lee's evocative vocal reaching out grabbing the listener. It has so much soul you can almost see it. Ana Kirby does a fine lead vocal on the heartfelt duet "The Rest of Our Lives". It's the kind of song that makes you want to wrap yourself around somebody and sway back and forth – kind of like a "With a Little Help From My Friends" but with more pelvis.

Alone, all the musical talent packed into this recording is worth the price of admission but Billy Lee is the man selling the tickets.







# Jessilyn Parker

It's been exactly a year since Jessilyn Park picked up a brush. That was in December 2011. She never thought that she had talent. Actually, she has never been that interested in arts. That was until she visited her grandmother Jeannette in Palm Bay and heard about her wish that one of her grandchildren would pick up painting since it was her passion before she went blind five years ago.

"We talked about life in general, about relationships and that life doesn't always go the way you want it to go," recalls Jessi her visit. "When I got back home to Orlando, I started to paint." The first picture took 6 hours. Just for fun Jessi decided to post it on Facebook - and sold it immediately for \$160 which was the first offer she got. "That was easy," Jessi thought and painted another one. She posted it again without a price, and this time someone offered her \$360. Not bad for a start.

It got a lot better. She entered a juried "Call for the Art" contest by the Florida Hospital in Altamonte Springs - and her painting "Carmela" sold for \$1,000. "I didn't really want to sell it, that's why I priced it so high," she explains. Within 30 minutes four more paintings sold. Jessi decided it was time to take her new found hobby seriously. "I wanted to learn what came to me so easily," she says.

Jessilyn googled for "palette knife painting" because this was the technique that she wanted to pursue and found world renowned impressionist artist, Leonid Afremov. The only problem was that the master lived in Mexico. She emailed him, no reply. Then she approached him in Russian, his native language. Her unique approach paid off, and Leonid's son Boris called her since his father doesn't speak English.

Against the will of friends and family she decided to visit the master in Playa del Carmen, Mexico and pay for a week of instructions. "We finished two paintings a day and it was worth it." Leonid's work has reached acclaim by producing stunningly bright colored pieces by using only the palette knife, as did Jessi's grandmother. And now Jessilyn was walking in her footsteps.

Using her communications skills she quickly reached 3,500 likes on Facebook. "In the meanwhile people all over the United States are buying my paintings. Some even send money and tell me to paint anything I want," she says.

She has been entering any contest, exhibition, showing, even did a live speed-painting at WPRK 91.5FM Studios, and the accolades keep on coming in.

I didn't meet Jessilyn by accident or at a local art show. She had sent me an email asking for an article in Brevard Live Magazine "to make her grandmother proud." Quite an unique request, so I started checking out her artwork and was impressed. It was so pretty, so positive, almost like a promise for hope. When I found out that this young lady once went to Columbia Elementary, then graduated from

Palm Bay High with 6 scholarships and graduated from UCF with a masters degree in communications, I wanted to meet her. During our visit she told me her story about working corporate jobs and raising two children. "I once attended a pottery class. That was my only prior attempt to do any artwork," she said. And now she was sitting at a crossroad of her life.

The week before we met, Jessilyn had quit her corporate job. "That took quite some guts to give up the pay-check, the health insurance, the 401 K." And the following day she would be flying to California to celebrate Artiste Wines' autumn release of her art on two wine labels. She was very exited. "This was a competition I won in July and I won first place out of over 200 other artists from around the country. Voting was done through Facebook and I won 1st place!"

As for her future, Jessilyn just follows her calling. "It is great to find out what you are supposed to do in your life," she said. Also mentor Leonid Afremor has an opinion about her: "Jessilyn has exceptional talent. She is one of my brightest students and I know she will go far. I see her changing and growing with each lesson. If she can do all of this in 11 months, I will one day be thankful I was her mentor. I am proud of her and all her accomplishments."

Well, if this isn't enough to make a grandmother proud. Congratulation to Ms Jeannette McCaslin. You have a very talented and lovely grand-daughter!
