

### Andrew Marcus Is Alive, Well, And On The Air

In our September 2012 issue we bid farewell to local studio owner/songwriter/musician/AV guru Andrew Marcus. After 20 years as a central figure of the Brevard County music scene Andrew packed up the van one last time and took his act to Tennessee.

Over the past few months we've been receiving lots of cards and letters asking "What ever happened to Andrew Marcus?" - so we tracked him down at the JTV studios in Knoxville, TN, where he took the time to answer a few questions:

#### Why Tennessee?

Andrew: Y'know, I get asked that a lot. The thing about Tennessee is that there's music in the air. Think about it. Memphis is the birthplace of rock & roll, Nashville is the home of country music and Knoxville, in the Blue Ridge Mountains, is a major bluegrass city. I first visited Tennessee in 2009 and I knew I had to live here. Driving around Tennessee – the cotton fields, the hills, the mountains, the music – it's like driving around in a Lucinda Williams song! Plus – everywhere you go in this state smells like barbecue! Awesome!

#### Have you been playing any music?

Andrew: I've been here just over a year and I've written 36 songs. I feel like they're some of my best songs ever. Since I'm not involved with a band, or playing out, I can write straight from the heart and not worry about things like "Will so & so like this tune? Can so & so handle this part? Can so & so play at this tempo?" I'm finally doing it all for myself and it feels good.

Also, maybe even more importantly is, I've been able to spend a whole lot of time listening. The mountains have given me fresh ears. There's great music around every corner here and I'm taking in as much as I can. There's an impressive scene in Knoxville but I've also been spending time in Nashville and Memphis and learning

from what's going on in those cities. I've always been an Americana guy and the talent in this state is staggering.

#### Tell us about your new TV gig.

Andrew: I'm a director for Jewelry Television and it's a great place to work. JTV employs 2000 people on this campus so it's an important company to the city of Knoxville. They're good corporate citizens and they treat all their employees really well. There's disc golf baskets installed around the campus so I actually get to play golf every day – I just got my first ace! My wife Misty works in the quality control department and she was doing aerobics with Richard Simmons the other day.

JTV brought Richard Simmons in to do some aerobics and pump up the employees.

#### How cool is that?

<u>Andrew</u>: Speaking of Richard Simmons, he just started a show on our network that I'm directing.

#### You recently got a big promotion?

Andrew: Well, I don't know about big, but I started here as the overnight director, basically the new kid, low man on the totem pole position, and I was told I could expect to be there for approximately three years. I used the sort of lax overnight oversight to make some changes in the way the show

was presented and shot. I added music beds, put in some flying shots, jazzed things up a bit. People noticed and after nine months I was promoted to prime time director, the number one slot for my position. I recently directed the network's first remote show from the Titanic Museum in Gatlinburg to celebrate the 20th anniversary of JTV. It was one of the highest rated shows in JTV's history.

#### So what's next?

Andrew: Misty & I have decided it's time to put a band back together and get some of these new songs out. We hope to be recording soon...

### PETER WHITE CHRISTMAS

Over decades Peter White has maintained a reputation as one of the most versatile and prolific acoustic guitarists in the world of contemporary jazz. He combines elements of jazz, pop and classical guitar to create a sound that is singular and at the same time accessible to a broad audience. White was born in 1954 in Luton, a small town north of London. As a child, he learned to play several musical instruments, including the clarinet, trombone, violin and piano. And of course, like so many youngsters growing up during the heyday of the Beatles and the Rolling Stones, he gravitated to the guitar.

He learned his first chords on an acoustic guitar, then bought his first electric guitar in his early teens and studied the recordings of the reigning guitar gods of the day – Jimi Hendrix, Eric Clapton and Jimmy Page. Then he shifted toward the music of acoustic artists like Crosby, Stills and Nash, James Taylor, and Joni Mitchell. Plugged or unplugged, he had decided by his late teens that music was his calling, and his first professional gig was at a holiday resort in England when he was 19 years old.

Barely a year later, he was invited to join Al Stewart's band as a keyboardist for a tour of England, Scotland, and the U.S. in 1975. In addition to opening for artists like Linda Ronstadt, Billy Joel and Queen, White worked with Stewart in the studio in the making of *Year of the Cat*, which became a huge hit for Stewart in 1976. The tour and the album marked the beginning of a twenty-year association with Stewart. In that time, the two musicians co-wrote numerous songs, including Stewart's 1978 hit, "Time Passages."

By the beginning of the '80s, White and Stewart had relocated to Los Angeles, formed a band called Shot in the Dark. Around the same time, Peter White's brother Danny formed a group called Matt Bianco, which included a talented Polish singer named Basia Trzetrzelewska. Danny White and Basia splintered off to launch the singer's solo career with the 1987 debut album, *Time and Tide*, which featured Peter White on guitar.

After fifteen years as a backup musician and a session player, White launched his solo recording career with the 1990 release of *Reveillez-Vous* (French for "Wake up," a title chosen by White in honor of his French mother). The album included several unused songs that White had written for Stewart, and it became a favorite among contemporary jazz radio statio. In a career that spans nearly four decades, over a dozen solo recordings and countless performances, White insists that it's the faces in the crowd and the fans that keep his music going. *www.kingcenter.com*

Pat Travers

Thile most bluesy hard rock acts of the '70s and '80s hailed from the United States, singer/guitarist Pat Travers originated from Toronto, Travers picked up the guitar in his early teens, after witnessing a local performance by Jimi Hendrix. It wasn't long before Travers was studying other top rock guitarists of the day - Eric Clapton, Jeff Beck, Jimmy Page, etc., and paying his dues by playing in bar bands in Quebec. Travers' main love was hard rock, so after a year, he headed to London. Shortly after arrival in the U.K.. Travers recorded a demo that would land him a recording deal with Polydor and result in the release of his debut, Pat Travers, during the spring of 1976. A performance at England's annual Reading Festival sparked further interest, which resulted in two more releases in 1977, before Travers returned to North America and set his sights on the U.S. rock market. He's been touring the world ever since.

#### **Nick Moss**

If you like Chicago Blues, Nick Moss is your musician. He has released nine albums to date, all on his own Blue Bella Records label.

Moss originally learned to play the bass guitar, and joined Buddy Scott's backing band in his late teens. He played there for two years before moving on to join up with Jimmy Dawkins. By 1993, he had joined The Legendary Blues Band, and played bass on their final album, Money Talks. The band's frontman, Willie "Big Eyes" Smith, suggested Moss should switch to lead guitar and he spent over two years there before they split up. Moss moved on to play as Jimmy Rogers' band guitarist for another three years, before going solo. His debut album First Offence (re-released in 2003) was billed as by Nick Moss and the Flip Tops. Moss' 10th album, "Time Ain't Free", is in the make. Nick Moss' performance at Earl's is also his Birthday Bash. Happy Birthday, Nick!

### **Jimmie Van Zant**

Jimmie Van Zant was born in Jacksonville, Florida, a city known as "the home of southern rock royalty." Jimmie's home was filled with music whenever cousin Ronnie Van Zant used his living room as a rehearsal space for the band that eventually became Lynyrd Skynyrd.

The tragedy of Ronnie's death in 1977 inspired Jimmie to focus on his own music career to honor the life and legacy of his cousin.

He formed his own group, signed with a record label and recorded his first album. *Southern Comfort* included the single "Ronnie's Song" co-written by Jimmie as a tribute to his beloved cousin. He still plays this number at his live shows. In 2008, Jimmie released a second album, *My Name is Jimmie*.

With a microphone in hand and his family in his heart, Jimmie honors his "Freebyrd" family legacy with the music that is rooted in his soul. The Eddie Scott Going Home Jam

# Bringing Down The House

The Eddie Scott Going Home Jam was one of the most impressive shows of the year 2013 hosted by soul man Billy Lee who took the lead in an enormous team effort that produced an afternoon of incredible music. And let's be honest: Those black blues and soul legends showed us all how to bring down a house. Over a thousand people visited during the length of the afternoon to show their respect to motown-singer Eddie Scott who passed away a month earlier and to raise money for his funeral expenses.

When finding out that my good friend Eddie Scott had passed away, I was very saddened by the news. First thoughts were, he was entirely too young. Then you start thinking of how close death can come in just a moment's notice. But then you start remembering the life of that person. Eddie lived a full life. A life of giving, sharing and caring. These are just a few words that describe his character. Every time I saw him he was always in great spirits.

So I'm sitting home taking care of a few things and the phone rings, it's Heike Clarke of *Brevard Live Magazine*. We exchanged pleasantries and then she shares with me what's on her mind. She proceeds to tell me how troubling it was that Eddie had passed away. She was concerned that with all he had done for others, no one was embracing his situation. In other words, he was not receiving the send off that someone of his stature was deserving of. It just didn't seem right and it was haunting her. That's when she told me of her ideas and wanted to know what I thought. I told her it was a fantastic idea and that if there was anything I could do to help she could count me in. That was how the Eddie Scott Going Home Jam was conceived.

Many phone calls later and lots of leg work and planning brought the whole thing to fruition. And then the big day arrived. We get to Lou's Blues nice and early and there are the guys from Kenny Michaels' band - Different Worlds – already setting up. And this is just how the day went. People just jumped right in and took ownership of what their duties were and fulfilled them with a level of professionalism that just warms your heart. Kenny Michael was very instrumental in the success of the whole project. Ana Kirby was amazing with her abilities to "rally the troops." She had a team of volunteers to work on the day of the event as well as local business owners asking her what they could do. Kenny and

Ana are just the most dedicated, hard working, and sincerest people you'll ever have the opportunity to work with. I can't say enough about them.

Next up is Ana and her team who start arriving. She had with her the crew from *Hello Gorgeous* hair and nail salon and they're all decked out in their *Brevard Live* T-shirts. This team dug in and began to make their magic happen. They sold raffle tickets and 50-50 tickets and it was just an amazing day. Gretchen from *Hello Gorgeous* really knows how to inspire.

The place starts to fill up and there was real energy in the air. It was a positive surge of power that just filled the room. First to take the stage - The Usual Suspects. All the bands that played had worked with Eddie Scott to some degree. Either they had a member that worked in one of his backup bands or they shared the same stage on a show with him but there was definitely a connection there and that was the common thread that was an actual requirement to help send our dear friend home properly. As it turns out the band The Usual Suspects was actually once one of Eddie's backup bands. The entire band! When they announced this fact from the stage, the place went nuts and the band proceeded to rip the place apart. Rick Fincke broke out into one of his entrancing guitar riffs and off they went with a passion for music that would woo the hardest of hearts into submission. They were on fire and it set the stage for the rest of the day's events.

Kenny comes to me and asks, do we know how long before Joey Gilmore arrives? "They're about 20 minutes out." Kenny and I decided to switch the order of the bands and I begin to rally my crew. All the while the local celebrities are arriving in grand fashion. I look up and here's Russ Kellum and Amy Pastorius. We meet and greet and I turn to take care of my next task and I bump right into Lissa and Charles Knight. I was just so tickled to see the level of support from the music community. It really was a spectacular day.


Now it's time to take the stage. It's been over a year since the Billy Lee Soul Revue has performed at Lou's Blues and what a reunion it was. People were so ecstatic to see the guys again especially after such a long hiatus. Once Johnny Mac, Frank Tuckwiller and Tom Luikart fire up those horns the crowd went nuts. They were wailing and nailing those notes to the wall and the people loved it. The rhythm section was cranking and we had Tree Rees drumming for us on loaner from Different Worlds. My keyboardist David Hoag had not experienced the horns yet and I could tell it was a treat for him, too. But of course, the veterans of the band, Dave Clark and Freddy Derwitsch were business as usual. They knew what it took to control such a raging beast as The Soul Revue Orchestra and, baby, it was firing on all pistons and it felt great. We finished up our set and proceeded to get out of the way to let the blues master take over.

And there were some great prizes given by so many businesses in the area. With the money made we were able to pay for Eddie's entire funeral expenses and had a great time in the process.

Then the final act hit the stage. Now I don't know what happened but if you ask me I think Kenny got his guys together and huddled up. If I were a gambling man I'd put money on it that the talk went a little something like this. All right guys, there has been some real magic presented in there today, so we've really got to put on our game face and step up to the plate and knock this one out of the park. And that's exactly what they did. Different Worlds stepped onto that stage and began to light a fire. They struck out on their first couple of tunes and as if they hadn't done enough they





## Sarah Lee Guthrie and Johnny Irion

arah Lee Guthrie and Johnny Irion are a couple in music as well as in life. They were married on October 16th, 1999 and began performing together as an acoustic duo in the fall of 2000. Their music combined Irion's love of rock and blues with Guthrie's roots of folk and country.

Guthrie is the youngest daughter of folksinger Arlo Guthrie and the granddaughter of Woody Guthrie. As a third generation singer/songwriter Guthrie released her first self-titled album on the family owned and operated *Rising Son Records* in 2002. As a child she was involved in theater and dance. Her interest in music was sparked when she worked as her father's road manager on the 1997 *Further Festival* tour and saw other members of the tour group having fun at late-night hootenannies. She picked up an acoustic guitar and started playing as a way to join in on the fun. "I always wrote poems, so it wasn't that far off for me to turn that into songs."

Irion also originates from a family of artists. His uncle is author Thomas Steinbeck, his grand-uncle is author John Steinbeck, and his grandmother, Rubilee Knight is a classical violinist. His late grandfather, Fred Knight sang tenor in numerous venues. Irion and Guthrie met through a mutual friend while the two were working together in Los Angeles. Guthrie and Irion have appeared at the Newport Folk Festival, the Philadelphia Folk Festival, and Hillside Festival, as well as nationwide theatres, listening rooms, performing art centers, and schools. When not performing their own shows they tour nationally with Arlo Guthrie, opening the show, then joining him onstage in their family concert series, recently accompanying him at Carnegie Hall with Pete Seeger and The Dillards.



#### with professional drummer Fernando Medina

If you are a local musician in the area, chances are you've seen drummer Fernando Medina online. In addition to his numerous performance video postings on Facebook, he has a habit of magically appearing next to people at The Original Music Series (true story, lol)...

#### How did you start out playing drums?


FM: My older brother inadvertently brought me into the world of drumming when I was 11 or 12, while growing up in Merritt Island (I was born in Washington DC, but lived locally ages 6-18). He began playing and taking lessons before me and I used to sneak on to his drum set just to bang away while trying not to get beat up by him in the process (laughs). At age 14, I started formal lessons with the always fantastic local drummer, Randy Crouch. A year later I added all the high school music classes and ensembles I could. Then while at Boston University, I toured with the snare line of the Boston Crusaders Drum & Bugle Corps. All of these experiences made up my formative period.

#### What brought you back to Brevard?

FM: For many, many years I was based in Boston and later in Chicago. While gigging live and in the studio in those areas, I would occasionally go on long national and international tours and residencies in the US, UK, Europe, Latin America and Asia. But a few years ago, between travels and tours, I began spending more and more time locally because I have aging family still in the area. I'm not sure how long this recent pattern will continue.

#### What do you think of the music scene here?

FM: Well, it's only a few months over the past year during which I've actively started hanging, jamming and gigging a bit locally and in Orlando. All my musical activities, until recently, have occurred exclusively elsewhere. But my initial impression is that there are some very warm people (like Charles and Lissa Knight), great musicians (like jazz vocalist Kristen Warren) and scattered pockets of true uniqueness (Brevard Busking Coalition). That said, I'd love to see more original artists and bands. Also, more original and cover bands taking more musical risks in terms of style, genre, song arrangement, interpretation and selection and ensemble instrumentation. Also, I'd be ecstatic if every Brevard venue enacted a total indoor-smoking ban. Not sure how realistic



any of the above is considering Brevard's demographics. But one can dream, right? (laughs)...

#### What band/projects are you looking for?

FM: As a drummer-for-hire, drumming is a money-making profession as much as it is a passion. So it's good to get as many paid offers for live, studio and tour gigs as possible, regardless of the genre and locale. But I enjoy recording and touring the most, the more unique the music, the better. Mixed and mashed-up genres involving singer-songwriter, indie, world music, electronica, soul, reggae, authentic folk or Americana. Basically anything which is not solely the locally over-represented pure forms of rock, classic rock, metal and blues.



Julio Torres - My Twisted Summer

Julio Torres is a 35 year old 8th grade English teacher at John F. Kennedy Middle School in Rockledge. He's been teaching at JFK for 7 years and it's a long, long way from where he went to school at South Miami Senior High. His high school days were surrounded by theft, car jackings and violence and he always felt safest during baseball season because he was able to bring a bat to school. In Rockledge however, he says "These kids are focused on education" and it's his job to make it interesting.

Torres was inspired by a 14 years old student named Cody that complained the reading material in school was 'superboring'. To get through to kids like Cody he decided to write his own fiction novella. His hope was to make life long readers out of young people that presently have no desire to read. He wants to get a message to kids that "Reading is pretty cool if you have the right material". Torres decided to write about what he knows, and that's surfing.

"I remember the first day I caught waves, it changed my life. The reason I live here is to be near the ocean. I traded my family in Miami to be here with the ocean."

His fiction, My Twisted Summer is a coming of age story based on some die hard surfer dudes, and dudettes, that manage to stay behind on beachside to surf a hurricane after the Brevard County islands are evacuated. The book is a teaching tool based on Lord of the Flies and aimed at his teenage demographic. There's good guys (and girls), bad guys, lots of adventure and thrills, and even a government conspiracy thrown in for good measure.

If there's a surfing teen in your household you might want to stuff a copy of My Twisted Summer in their stocking - but – make sure you know where your kids are when the next hurricane hits...

#### **CD REVIEW**



Lone Wolf OMB - MINE US 13

Lounty a few years back. You may have seen him busking on the sidewalks of downtown Melbourne, Cocoa Beach & wherever crowds gather in Central & South Florida. He's been gigging at Florida pubs & clubs, playing festivals all over the southern states of America and recently completed a package tour of Europe with a bill of American roots music acts. MINE US 13 sets a new high water mark in his career.

The production on this disc brings out the tight edges on his delta blues slide guitar and thickens up the depth of his drum beats. Lone Wolf OMB puts out a lot of noise for one man and this record has finally brought some strong definition to that sound. Along with Lone Wolf's guitars, banjo & drums, his harmonica, cymbals, and especially the lyrics, all shine in their own space.

The American ballads on this CD follow in the tradition of blues and folk story tellers of a bygone era. They speak of family, the road, the swamp, and the blues. Always the blues.

'Swamp Hermit' opens the disc at a barrel rollin', roadhouse rippin' speed before track two, 'Life O Blues' spells out where this artist is coming from - it's tight, punchy, and could get a mosh pit going in the bayou.

'The Masked Marvel', an ode to Delta blues originator Charley Patton, slows it way down and sweetens things up with slick slide work and haunting vocals. When Lone Wolf OMB sings "Charley we still remember you" he sounds like a man reaching out to an old friend.

MINE US 13 is clean, engaging and deep.


